The Executive Committee of the Council confirmed the minutes of the Executive Committee Meeting held on 03.06.2014.

2. **Minutes of the last meeting of the Executive Committee – Action taken thereon.**

To Executive Committee of the Council noted the action taken on the minutes of the Executive Committee meeting held on 03.06.2014.

3. **Pending Items arising out of the decisions taken by the Executive Committee.**

The Executive Committee of the Council noted the pending items arising out of the decisions taken by the Executive Committee and observed the following:

(i) **Item No. 37 of 14.03.2014**

Approval of minutes of the Regn. & Equivalence Committee held on 07th January, 2014 – report of review committee – consideration of.

The Executive Committee noted that the explanation from In charge Eligibility Section has not been received and directed to submit the same within 24 hrs. to the President.

(ii) **Item No. 54 of 14.03.2014**

WP (C) No.8438/2011-Dr. Mohinder Kumar vs. Board of Governors in supersession of the MCI

The Executive Committee noted that the report of the Committee constituted to study the earlier RFID had not been submitted and directed that the same be submitted within two weeks.

4. **Assessment of the physical and the other teaching facilities available for establishment of a new medical college at Kanaka Mamidi, R.R. District, Andhra Pradesh by Ayaan Education Society, Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh under Dr. N.T.R University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-15.**

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and the other teaching facilities available for establishment of a new medical college at Kanaka Mamidi, R.R. District, Andhra Pradesh by Ayaan Education Society, Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh under Dr. N.T.R University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-15.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (30th and 31st May, 2014) and noted the following:

1. Website: Citizens' charter is not provided.
2. Quarters: Construction work is still not complete for quarters for teaching faculty & non-teaching staff.
3. OPD: Teaching area is inadequate. There is no equipment in plaster cutting room. Ophthalmology OPD does not have dark room & dressing room.
4. Audiometry is not available.

5. Wards: Some wards do not have ancillary facilities like Treatment Room, Pantry, Utilities Room, etc. Teaching area is available only in wards of Gen. Medicine, Paediatrics & Orthopaedics. They are not arranged properly.
6. Clinical Material: Major Surgical operations are not performed. Normal deliveries are not conducted. On day of assessment, there was no major operation or normal delivery or Caesarean Section.
7. Radiological Investigations: They are inadequate. Daily average plain X-rays is 47 – 53. On day of assessment, total 13 plain X-rays were taken.
8. Laboratory Investigations: They are inadequate. Histopathology & Cytopathology work is inadequate. On day of assessment, there was no workload of Histopathology & Cytopathology.
9. Casualty: There is no separate casualty for O.G.
10. O.T.s: There are only 3 major O.T.s against requirement of 5 as per Regulations. There are 5 tables in these 3 O.T.s implying thereby more than 1 table in O.T.s which is not as per norms.
11. ICUs: SICU is not available. NICU / PICU does not have Central Oxygen, Suction or major equipment.
12. Labour Room: Eclampsia room has no roof & has improper ventilation. No equipment is seen.
13. Anatomy Department: There are no cadavers.
14. Biochemistry Department: Reagents are inadequate.
15. Para clinical departments of Pathology, Microbiology, Pharmacology & Forensic Medicine are not operational.
16. Central Library: It is not ready. Catalogues were not available even on second day of assessment.
17. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to return the application for establishment of a new medical college at Kanaka Mamidi, R.R. District, Andhra Pradesh by Ayaan Education Society, Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh under Dr. N.T.R University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-15 since there is no provision for keeping the application pending.

5. **Assessment of the physical and the other teaching facilities available for establishment of a new medical college at Jaipur, Rajasthan by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur, Rajasthan under Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-15.**

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and the other teaching facilities available for establishment of a new medical college at Jaipur, Rajasthan by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur, Rajasthan under Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-15.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (28th and 29th May, 2014) and noted the following:

1. College is located in a single piece of land of 10.2 Acres and attached hospital (Govt. RDBP Jaipuria Hospital) on 7.5 Acre land at a distance of 9 kms. from college campus. This is contrary to Section 3 (2) (2) of Qualifying Criteria under Establishment of Medical college Regulations, 1999 which reads as under:

*“3 (2) (2) Provided that in urban agglomerations/cities having population of 25 (twenty five) lakhs or more, namely, Delhi, Jaipur, Kanpur, Lucknow, Kolkata, Ahmedabad, Surat, Greater Mumbai, Pune, Hyderabad, Bangalore and Chennai, according to the Census of India, 2011 conducted by Government of India, the permissible FAR/FSI shall be the criterion for allowing the medical colleges provide that the total built up area required for adequate infrastructure **including medical college, hospital**, hostels, residential quarters, and other infrastructure required as per Minimum Standard Requirement Regulations is made available in an area of not less than 10 acres based upon the permissible FAR/FSI allowed by the competent authority.*

Provided further that in hilly areas, notified tribal areas, North Eastern States and Union Territories of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Daman and Diu, Dadra and Nagar Haveli and Lakshadweep establishment of medical college shall be allowed on two pieces of land comprising minimum of 20 (twenty) acres of land. However, one plot of land shall not be less than 10 (Ten) acres and the second plot of land shall not be less than 5 (five) acres. The distance between two pieces of land shall not be more than 10 (ten) kilometer with well-connected road and the medical college shall provide free transportation facility for students and staff. The hospital shall be on one piece of land and the building of the college including library and hostels for the students, interns, PGs/Residents, nurses may be housed on any of the two pieces of land.

Provided further for a period of five years in the States of Bihar, Chhatisgarh, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Orissa, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal, establishment of medical college shall be allowed on two pieces of land comprising minimum of 20 (twenty) acres of land. However, one plot of land shall not be less than 10 (ten) acres and the second plot of land shall also be not less than 5 (five) acres. The distance between two pieces of land shall not be more than 10 (ten) kilometres with well connected road and free transportation facility for students and staff. The hospital should be on one piece of land and building of the college including library and hostels for the students, intern, PGs/Residents, nurses may be housed on any of the two pieces of land. The said hospital should be functional for at least 3 years.

The above relaxation shall not be available to a person seeking permission to establish a medical college in a district in above states where two or more medical colleges are already in existence.”

2. Wards: Distance between 2 beds is < 1.5 m as required by Regulations in some wards.
3. Casualty: There is no separate casualty for O.G.
4. Radiodiagnosis Department: AERB approval is not available.
5. Anatomy Department: MRI / CT films are inadequate in museum.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above and as the applicant has failed to meet the qualifying criteria u/s 3 (2) (2) of Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to return the application for establishment of a new medical college at Jaipur, Rajasthan by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur, Rajasthan under Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme u/s 10A of the

IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-15 since there is no provision for keeping the application pending.

6. **Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for renewal of permission for MBBS course for 3rd batch (150 seats) of Malla Reddy Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh under Dr. N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-2015.**

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for renewal of permission for MBBS course for 3rd batch (150 seats) of Malla Reddy Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh under Dr. N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-2015.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (27th and 28th May, 2014) and the letter from the Council Assessors addressed to the President and noted the following:

1. Most of the Residents of all clinical departments appear to be present for namesake as they did not know the names of their superiors / juniors in the Unit / department.
2. Operations entry in the O.T. register is not done in proper way i.e. without continuous numbering and leaving blank spaces in pages leaving scope for future entry and manipulation.
3. There are serious irregularities in the Declaration form of the faculty & residents as under:
 - (a) Dr. D. Aruna, presenting as SR in Medicine on 27th May, 2014 could not produce the original experience certificate. A photocopy of the experience certificate issued by MNR Medical College & Hospital, Sangareddy Dean on 1st Aug. 2008 without any reference no. from the institute was attached in her declaration form. On 28th May, 2014, she produced the original "Service Certificate cum Relieving Order" dated 31st July, 2008 without any reference no. signed by Dean of MNR Medical College, Sangareddy. This suspect the forgery as the certificate appeared new and bore the signature of the Dean, which matched with the signature of the present Dean of Malla Reddy Medical College and photocopy and original bore different dates. From the Declaration Form of the Dean, as per entries in clause 3(a), it is noted that he was working as Dean at MNR Medical College from 10.3.2008 to 30.11.2011. When Dr. D. Aruna was asked about the original certificate, she said that she had obtained it only a few days back. She also said that times the Dean was Dr. Narsa Reddy. This appears the forgery of the experience certificate.
 - (b) It was also noted the appointment orders of SR & JR/Promotion orders of the Faculty/Residents issued by this institute shows same/similar outward number in most of the cases.
 - (c) Experience certificate issued by many private medical institutes did not bear any outward number, which raises the doubt about its authenticity.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 3rd batch (150 seats) of Malla Reddy Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh under Dr. N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-2015.

7. Assessment of the physical and the other teaching facilities available for establishment of a new medical college at Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu by Employees’ State Insurance Corporation, New Delhi under The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-15.

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and the other teaching facilities available for establishment of a new medical college at Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu by Employees’ State Insurance Corporation, New Delhi under The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-15.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (27th & 28th May, 2014) and noted the following:

- 1. Nursing Staff: Total 85 Nursing staff is available against requirement of 175 as per Regulations.
- 2. Website: Not available.
- 3. Dean is not available.
- 4. College building is under construction.
- 5. Lecture Theaters: They are under construction.
- 6. Central Library: It is under construction. Staff is not available.
- 7. Common rooms for boys & girls are not available.
- 8. Central Photography Unit is not available.
- 9. Students’ Hostels: Under construction.
- 10. Residents’ Hostel: They are not furnished. Interiors are being done.
- 11. Quarters: Under construction.
- 12. OPD: Registration counters are not computerized. There is only 1 examination room available for major departments against requirement of 4 examination rooms for major departments. Teaching area is not available.
- 13. Audiometry & Speech Therapy are not available.
- 14. Teaching beds are deficient as under:

Thus the qualifying criteria u/s3(2)(5) of Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 pertaining to the person owning and managing a hospital of not less than 300 beds is not met with.

- 15. Wards: Ancillary facilities like Pantry, etc. are not available. Doctors’ duty room is not available in some wards. Teaching area is not available.

16. Radiological Investigations are inadequate. (Daily average plain X-rays: 67).
17. Laboratory Investigations: Microbiology, Serology & Histopathology are not available.
18. MRD: Not available.
19. Casualty: No beds are available. Resuscitation equipment is not available. Emergency major & minor O.T.s are not available.
20. Central Clinical laboratory: Separate sections of Pathology, Microbiology & Biochemistry are not available.
21. O.T.s: There are only 2 O.T.s available against requirement of 4 as per Regulations. These 2 O.T.s have 6 tables indicating more than 1 table in each O.T. which is not as per norms. Minor O.T.s are not available. Infusion Pumps & Syringe Pumps are not available. Central Oxygen & suction are not available. Resuscitation equipment is inadequate.
22. ICUs: SICU is not available.
23. Labour Room: Separate room for septic cases is not available.
24. Radiodiagnosis Department: AERB approval is not available. No mobile X-ray machine is available. Only 1 USG is available against requirement of 2 as per Regulations.
25. CSSD: Not available.
26. Preclinical departments of Anatomy, Physiology & Biochemistry are under construction.
27. Faculty: None available. Deficiency of teaching faculty is 100 %.
28. Residents: None available. Shortage is 100 %.
29. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of above and as the applicant has failed to meet the qualifying criteria u/s 3 (2) (5) of Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 pertaining to the person owning and managing a hospital of not less than 300 beds, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to return the application for establishment of a new medical college at Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu by Employees' State Insurance Corporation, New Delhi under The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-15 since there is no provision for keeping the application pending.

8. **Assessment of the physical and the other teaching facilities available for establishment of a new medical college at Bareilly, Uttar Pradesh by Rajshree Educational Trust, Bareilly, Uttar Pradesh under MJP Rohilkhand University, Bareilly, Uttar Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-15.**

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and the other teaching facilities available for establishment of a new medical college at Bareilly, Uttar Pradesh by Rajshree Educational Trust, Bareilly, Uttar Pradesh under MJP Rohilkhand University, Bareilly, Uttar Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-15.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (23rd and 24th May, 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to grant Letter of Permission for establishment of new medical college with annual intake of 150 seats at Bareilly, Uttar Pradesh by Rajshree Educational Trust, Bareilly, Uttar

Pradesh under MJP Rohilkhand University, Bareilly, Uttar Pradesh u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-15.

9. **Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for increase of MBBS seats from 150 to 200 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 and also Compliance Verification for continuance of recognition of college for the award of MBBS degree for 150 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 at NRI Medical College & General Hospital, Guntur, AP under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for the academic year 2014-2015.**

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for increase of MBBS seats from 150 to 200 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 and also Compliance Verification for continuance of recognition of college for the award of MBBS degree for 150 seats u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 at NRI Medical College & General Hospital, Guntur, AP under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for the academic year 2014-2015.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (27th & 28th May, 2014) and noted the following:

1. Examination hall cum Auditorium: Two examination halls of capacity of 260 + 100 = 360 are available against requirement of examination hall cum auditorium with capacity of 500 – 700.
2. Lecture Theaters: Four lecture theaters of 200 capacity & 1 of 450 capacity are available against requirement of 5 lecture theaters of 240 & 1 of 500 capacity. Lecture hall in hospital is of capacity 179 only.
3. Central Library: Number of books are only 10,354 against requirement of 15,000 as per Regulations. Seating capacity available is 100 for students + 50 for PG + 25 for faculty against requirement of 400 as per Regulations.
4. Common Room for Boys & Girls: There are no separate common rooms for Boys & Girls with attached toilets. It is one common room for both. Capacity of the room is 100 only.
5. Teaching Beds: 10 beds are deficient in Ophthalmology as 30 beds are available against requirement of 40 as per Regulations.
6. Casualty: Separate casualty for O.G. not available.
7. Radiodiagnosis Department: AERB approval is available only for 3 machines of 30 mA, 1 of 60 mA & 1 for 300 mA. It is not available for the rest of machines.
8. Anatomy Department: Size of museum is less. Mounted specimens are 120 only which is less. Cooling chambers has capacity of only 8 which is less.
9. Physiology Department: Rooms for accommodation of faculty is less.
10. RHTC: Cold chain equipment is not available. Accommodation for males & females is less. Registers for field surveys / immunization / MCH & FP work are not available.
11. UHC: It is under MOU of NRI Academy of Sciences (an NGO) with District Authority. The medical college is not a party to this agreement. The agreement is valid for 1 year which has expired on 31/03/2014 and is without official seal. Survey registers are not properly maintained. No documents of Specialists' visits were given to assessors for verification.
12. Deficiency of teaching faculty is 7.48 % (i.e. 16 out of 214) as under:
 - (a) Asso. Prof.: 3 (Orthopaedics: 2, Dentistry: 1)
 - (b) Asst. Prof.: 12 (Physiology: 1, Pathology: 1, Forensic Medicine: 1, Paediatrics: 1, Gen. Surgery: 5, Ophthalmology: 2, O.G.: 1)
 - (c) Tutor: 1 (Biochemistry: 1)
13. Shortage of Residents is 12.57 % (i.e. 22 out of 175) as under:
 - (a) Senior Resident: 10 (Gen. Surgery: 6, Ophthalmology: 2, Radiodiagnosis: 2)
 - (b) Junior Resident: 12 (Paediatrics: 2, Gen. Surgery: 3, Orthopaedics: 4, Ophthalmology: 1, O.G.: 2)

13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to return the application to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of scheme for increase of MBBS seats from 150 to 200 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 at NRI Medical College & General Hospital, Guntur, AP under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for the academic year 2014-2015.

With respect to the matter of continuance of recognition for the award of MBBS degree with intake of 150 seats, the Committee further decided to direct the institute to submit the compliance report towards rectification of deficiencies within a period of 3 months.

10. **Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for Renewal of Permission of 2nd batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 150 to 200 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 in respect of Krishna Instt. of Medical Sciences, Karad, Maharashtra under Krishna Instt. of Medical Sciences University, Karad for the academic year 2014-15.**

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for Renewal of Permission of 2nd batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 150 to 200 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 in respect of Krishna Instt. of Medical Sciences, Karad, Maharashtra under Krishna Instt. of Medical Sciences University, Karad for the academic year 2014-15.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (23rd and 24th May, 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to renew the permission for admission of 2nd batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 150 to 200 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 in respect of Krishna Instt. of Medical Sciences, Karad, Maharashtra under Krishna Instt. of Medical Sciences University, Karad for the academic year 2014-15.

11. **Assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for renewal of permission for admission of 2nd batch of MBBS student against the increased intake i.e. from 50 to 100 seats u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 at Govt. Medical College & Hospital, Chandigarh under Punjab University for the academic year 2014-2015.**

Read: the matter with regard to assessment of the physical and other teaching facilities available for renewal of permission for admission of 2nd batch of MBBS student against the increased intake i.e. from 50 to 100 seats u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 at Govt. Medical College & Hospital, Chandigarh under Punjab University for the academic year 2014-2015.

The Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Assessor report (29th & 30th April, 2014) and noted the following:

1. Lecture Theaters: Capacity of both lecture theaters is only 80 against requirement of 120 as per regulations. Facility for E class is not available. Lecture theater in hospital is not of gallery type.
2. Common Rooms for Boys & Girls: Separate common rooms for Boys & Girls are not available. It is common for both. There is no attached toilet.
3. Students' Hostel: Accommodation is available for only 97 students against requirement of 263 as per Regulations.
4. Gymnasium is not available.
5. OPD: Teaching areas are not available.
6. Anatomy department: Demonstration room is shared with Biochemistry department. MRI CT films are not available in museum. Dissection hall is insufficient for 100 students. Students' lockers are not available.
7. Physiology department: There is no demonstration room. Mammalian laboratory is not available. Research laboratory & Departmental library are not available.
8. Pathology department: Demonstration room is shared with Microbiology department.

9. Microbiology department: Service laboratories are short by two as only 5 laboratories are available against requirement of 7 as per regulations. Departmental library is not available.

4. Radiodiagnosis Department: No special investigations were performed on day of assessment.
5. Laboratory Investigations: Histopathology workload (Average 22 / day) and Cytopathological workload (Average 10 / day) are inadequate and not commensurate with the number of patients and number of major and minor operations performed daily.
6. Microbiology Department: Catalogues in museum are inadequate.
7. Shortage of Senior Residents is 12.06 % (i.e. 17 out of 141) as under:
 - (a) Senior Resident: 17 (Gen. Medicine: 2, Paediatrics: 1, Gen. Surgery: 6, Orthopaedics: 2, Ophthalmology: 2, Anaesthesiology: 1, Radiodiagnosis: 3)
8. Central Library: Area is 1,642 sq.m. against requirement of 3,200 sq.m.
9. Nursing staff is inadequate in ICUs and wards as detailed in report.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 2nd batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 150 to 200 of JSS Medical College, Mysore, Karnataka under JSS University, Mysore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-2015.

9. Speech therapy is not available.
10. Wards: Demonstration rooms are nonfunctional and do not have any furniture or teaching aid.
11. OPD attendance: Daily average is 773 which is inadequate.
12. On day of assessment, there were no major operations because of university examination.
13. Radiological Investigations: C.T. scan is nonfunctional. Special investigations are not performed.
14. MRD: It is manual.
15. Casualty: Separate casualty for O.G. is not available. Disaster Trolley is not available. Defibrillator & Ventilator are not available.
16. ICUs: RICU & SICU are not available.
17. Radiodiagnosis department: AERB approval is available for 1 machine only. Only 2 mobile X-ray machines are available against requirement of 6. Only 2 static X-ray machines are available against requirement of 5. CT scan is nonfunctional.
18. CSSD: Receiving & Distribution points are not separate.
19. Deficiency of faculty is 40.26 % (i.e. 60 out of 149) as detailed in report as under:
 - (a) Professor: 10
 - (b) Asso. Prof.: 18

(c) Asst. Prof.: 7

(d) Tutor: 25

20. Shortage of residents is 40.36 % (i.e. 44 out of 109) as detailed in report as under:

(a) Senior Resident: 31

(b) Junior Resident: 13

21. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report

In view of the above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 2nd batch against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 MBBS student at Govt. 3. Although 21 quarters are claimed to have been allotted to faculty, on random checking it was found that in majority of quarters, M.B;B.S. students and Nursing students were staying which is not as per norms. Only in 5-6 quarters actual faculty was residing. (P. 26)
4. OPD: Capacity of teaching areas in various departments is 20 which is inadequate. (P. 29)
5. Anatomy department: There is only 1 demonstration room against requirement of 2 as per Regulations. Faculty rooms are small and less in number than faculty. Museum area is small – 80 sq.m. against requirement of 150 sq.m. (P. 43)
6. Physiology department: Area of laboratories is smaller than required: (i) Amphibian laboratory – Available 60 sq.m. against requirement of 150 sq.m.; (ii) Mammalian laboratory – Available 150 Sq.ft. against requirement of 60 sq.m.; & (iii) Clinical Physiology – Available 150 sq.ft. against requirement of 60 sq.m. There is no preparation room. There are no audiovisual aids in demonstration room. Faculty rooms are small. (P. 43)
7. Biochemistry department: There is only one practical laboratory which is small – 50 sq.m. against requirement of 150 sq.m. There is no anteroom. Faculty rooms are small and less in number than faculty. There is no library / seminar room. (P. 44)
8. Pathology department: There are no practical laboratories. There is no museum. Faculty rooms are small and less in number than faculty. There is no library / seminar room. (P. 44)
9. Microbiology department: Practical laboratory is small – 50 sq.m. against requirement of 150 sq.m. There are no service laboratories. There is no museum. There are no audio visual aids in demonstration room. Faculty rooms are small and less in number than faculty. (P. 44)
10. Pharmacology department: Faculty rooms are small and less in number than faculty. (P. 45)
11. Forensic Medicine department: There is no autopsy room. There is no cold storage. There is no museum. There are no audio visual aids in demonstration room. Faculty rooms are small and less in number than faculty. (P. 46)
12. Community Medicine department: There is no catalogue in museum. Faculty rooms are small and less in number than faculty. (P. 46)

In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to return the application recommending disapproval of the scheme for increase of MBBS seats from 70-100 u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 at Dayanand Medical College & Hospital under Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2014-15 since there is no provision for keeping the application pending.

Further this claim made by the college would be required to be physically verified. In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to renew the permission for admission of 5th batch of MBBS students against the increased intake i.e. from 100 to 150 for the academic year 2014-15 at Subharati Medical College, Meerut, UP under Swami Vivekanand Subharti University, Meerut and returned the compliance to the Central Govt.

Further this claim made by the college would be required to be physically verified. In view of above, the Executive Committee of the Council decided to reiterate its earlier decision to return the application to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of scheme for establishment of a new medical college at Jodhpur, Rajasthan by Kushal Education Trust, Jaipur, Rajasthan under Jodhpur National University, Jodhpur u/s 10A of the IMC Act,1956 for the academic year 2014-15 and returned the compliance to the Central Govt.

It is mentioned in the covering letter that it is “Compliance Report-Recognition of Mahatma Gandhi Medical College & Hospital, Jaipur for increased intake from 100 to 150 MBBS seats”. This has been referred for my opinion.

2. *I have perused the representation that has been quoted on pre-page notes 1-4. Briefly stated the contention of the College is that the decision dated 03.07.2013 of the Board of Governors not to approve for 150 seats and show cause u/s 8.3 (1) (c) was stayed vide Order dated 15.07.13 in SBCWP 12234 of 2013. This decision was communicated to the College vide Council letter dated 13.07.13 which the College states in its aforesaid representation was received by it on 15.07.13. Further, the College contends that this decision was taken in complete violation of the principles of natural justice and provisions of IMC Act. It has also been contended by the College that subsequently it has been granted recognition/increase in seats in respect of PG courses by the BOG, and in the light of this it has called upon the Central Government that the recommendation of the BOG dated 29.05.13 for grant of recognition against increased intake capacity from 100 to 150 and continuance of recognition be issued by the Government of India.*

3. *It is to be noted that Hon’ble High Court in its Order dated 15.07.13 in SBCWP 12234 of 2013 has inter alia passed the following order:-*

“Taking note of the submissions made, but without expressing nay opinion, this Court considers appropriate to keep the decision of the respondent no. 1 dt. .3.7.2013 as regards the petitioner in abeyance however, that will not preclude the respondent from proceeding with the matter with due compliance of the principles of natural justice, but, at the same time, considers appropriate to grant liberty to the petitioner to proceed in accordance with the approval of minutes of meeting held on 29.5.2013. However, it is further made clear that the petitioner must indicate regarding such of the admissions that it will remain subject to outcome of the matter pending before the Court.”

4. *The case has thereafter been heard on several dates and Council has also filed its reply affidavit in the matter. It is important to note that in hearing on 14.12.13 the Hon’ble Court was pleased to pass the following Order:-*

“The matter is adjourned with the clear understanding that parties may come prepared on the next day and no further adjournment shall be granted considering that fifty students have been provisionally admitted by virtue of the interim-order passed by this Court and if eventually, the petition is dismissed, grave inconvenience would be caused to such students. The parties may file their written statement in advance.”

5. *The College in its representation to the Central Government contended that the Court had not precluded the MCI from proceeding with the matter with due compliance to principles of natural justice. Further, it contends that the MCI “ought to have withdrawn the decision /communication dated 03.07.2013 – on its own and ought to have taken the necessary steps for making formal recommendation to the Govt. of India for the formal recognition of the medical college for MBBS course with 150 admissions annually”.*

6. *It may be noted that instead of replying to the Show-Cause dated 13.07.2013, the College vide its letter dated 09.09.13 had communicated to the Council inter alia as under:-*

“....With response to above, it is informed that the issue raised in your aforesaid letter is already sub judice before the Hon’ble High Court judicature of Rajasthan, Jaipur Bench in SB Civil Writ Petition No. 12234/2013.

The MCI is already a party and notices have been served and reply has also been received by us. The Hon’ble Court has granted a stay on further proceeding and therefore no action can be taken under your letter under reference in view of lispence and therefore no action can be taken on your letter under reference in view of lispence...”

7. *The aforesaid letter is not part of the Enclosures annexed with the representation of the College dated 10.06.14 addressed to the Central Government. Thus, the College instead of replying to the Show-Cause dated 13.07.13 chose to take the ground that because of the pendency of Court case MCI cannot take any action.*

8. *Now, in its representation dated 10.07.14 to the Central Government the College is alleging that MCI has not proceeded against it in accordance with the principles of natural justice. Suffice it to state that the stand taken by the College is self-contradictory. The College on the one hand contends that because of Court case in Rajasthan High Court the Council cannot proceed against it, while on the other hand, it alleges that the MCI has not complied with the Court Order by proceeding against it in accordance with natural justice.*

9. *Further, the Order of the Hon'ble High Court dated 15.07.13 was in respect of academic year 2013-14, and this is clearly noted by the Hon'ble High Court in its Order dated 14.12.13. Thus, based upon the Order dated 15.07.13 of the Hon'ble High Court the College cannot proceed to admit students for admission in MBBS for academic year 2014-15, as without there being issuance of notification u/s11 (2) of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 it is not permissible for the College to admit students in MBBS against the increased intake from 100 to 150. Moreover, as per the scheme of Regulations, a College has to apply six-months in advance for renewal of permission to admit students. The College has not made any such application within the prescribed six-months. Hence, the claim of the College to admit students based upon interim order dated 15.07.13 of the Hon'ble High Court cannot be considered. The Order dated 14.12.13 of the Hon'ble High Court is loud and clear that it is limited to fifty students who were provisionally admitted.*

10. *The representation of the College made to the Central Government may be disposed of stating the afore-said reasons if deemed appropriate."*

The Executive Committee of the Council accepted the above legal opinion and decided to return the compliance report/representation of the college to the Central Govt., Ministry of Health & F.W.
