Minutes of the meeting of the Postgraduate Education Committee meeting held on Thursday, 4th Nov., 1999 at 11 a.m. in the office of the Medical Council of India.

Apology for absence was received from Dr. J. Rajappa.

In the absence of the Chairman of the P.G. Committee, members decided that Dr. Ketan Desai would act as Chairman for this meeting of the P.G. Committee.

1. <u>Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Committee – Confirmation</u> <u>of.</u>

Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Committee held on 14th September 1999 were confirmed.

2. <u>Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Committee – Action taken</u> thereon.

The Postgraduate Committee noted the action taken on the minutes of the P.G. Committee meeting held on 14th Sept., 1999 with modifications in items 52, 55, & 85 as under:-

Item No. 52. <u>University of Bombay- approval of L.T.M. Medical College</u> <u>Mumbai for the award of M.S. (Anatomy) qualification.</u>

Read: Council Inspector's report (Aug. 1999) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at L.T.M. medical college,

Mumbai for purpose of approval of the institution for the award of M.S. (Anatomy) qualification granted by University of Bombay.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Aug. 99) and decided to recommend that L.T.M. Medical College, Mumbai be approved for the award of M.S. (Anatomy) qualification granted by University of Bombay restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year.

The decision should be read corrected as under:-

"The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 1999) and decided not to recommend approval of L.T.M. Medical College for the award of M.S. (Anatomy) qualification granted by University of Bombay in view of the present faculty position not sufficient enough even for undergraduate training."

Item No. 55. <u>Ranchi University- Recognition of D.O. qualification in respect of</u> students being trained at Rajendra Medical College, Ranchi.

Read : Council Inspector's report (July, 1999) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Rajendra Medical College, Ranch for recognition of D.O. qualification granted by Ranchi University.

"The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (June, 1999) and decided to recommend that D.O. qualification granted by Ranchi University in respect of students being trained at Rajendra Medical College, Ranchi be recognized and included in the first Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956. However, the authorities of the institution are directed to restrict the number of admissions from the ensuing academic session to 8 (eight) students per year in view of the present available teaching faculty."

Item No. 85 <u>University of Bombay – Approval of L.T.M. Medical College</u>, <u>Mumbai for the award of M.S. (Gen. Surgery) qualification</u>.

Read; Council Inspector's report (August, 1999) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at L.T.M. Medical College, Mumbai for approval of the Institution for the award of M.S. (General Surgery) qualification granted by the University of Bombay.

"The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 1999) and decided to recommend that L.T.M. Medical College, Mumbai be approved for the award of M.S. (General Surgery) qualification granted by University of Bombay. However, the authorities of the Institution are directed to restrict the number of admissions from the ensuing academic session to 9 (nine) students per year in viewofthe present available teaching faculty."

The decision should be read corrected as under:-

"The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 1999) and decided to recommend that L.T.M. Medical College, Mumbai be approved for the award of M.S. (General Surgery) qualification granted by University of Bombay. However, the authorities of the Institution are directed to restrict the number of admissions from the ensuing academic session to 8 (eight) students per year in view of the present available teaching faculty."

3. <u>Starting of M.S. (Orthopaedics) course at Stanley Medical College, Chennai affiliated to the Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.</u>

Read:- Council Inspector's report (August, 99) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Stanley Medical College, Chennai affiliated to the Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai for starting of M.S. (Ortho.) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 1999) and noting that students for award of D.N.B. qualifications are also being admitted in the department of Orthopaedics ; decided to obtain the confirmation in this regard from the authorities of the Institution. The Chairman was authorized to decide in the matter on receipt of the required information/confirmation.

4. <u>Starting of M.D. (Forensic Medicine) course at M.S. (Ramaiah Medical</u> <u>College, Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences</u> <u>u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956</u>

Read:- Council Inspector's report (September, 1999) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences for starting of M.D. (Forensic Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Sept., 1999) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D. (Forensic Medicine) course at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences under section 10a of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

5. <u>Starting of M.S. (ENT) & DLO courses at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College,</u> <u>Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of</u> <u>the IMC Act, 1956.</u>

Read:- Council Inspector's report (September, 1999) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at M.s. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences for starting of MS (ENT) & DLO courses u/s 10a of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (September, 1999) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue letter of Intent for starting of M.S. (ENT) & DLO courses at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 since Prof. & HOD does not possess required recognized postgraduate qualification.

6. <u>Starting of MD (Pathology) course at Govt. Medical College, Nanded under</u> <u>Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University u/s 10A of the IMC act,</u> <u>1956 – Compliance verification for issuance of Letter of Permission.</u>

Read:- Council Inspector's report (February, 1998) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, nanded affiliated to Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University together with the compliance and compliance verification report (August, 1999) for starting of M.d. (Pathology) course u/s 10a of the IMC act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council inspector's report (Feb. 1998) alongwith the compliance and compliance verification report (Aug. 1999) and decided to recommend to the Central govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.d. (Pathology) course at Govt. Medical College, Nanded affiliated to Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada university u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year keeping in view the present available teaching faculty till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

7. <u>Starting of M.D. (Dermatology) course at St. John's medical College,</u> <u>Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of</u> <u>the IMC Act, 1956.</u>

Read:- Council Inspector's report (September, 1999) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at St. John's Medical College, Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences for starting of M.D. (Dermatology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Sept. 1999) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D. (Dermatology) course at St. John's Medical College, Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 since none of the Professors possesses requisite recognized postgraduate qualification.

8. <u>Starting of M.Ch. (Paed. Surgery) course at St. John's Medical College,</u> <u>bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of</u> <u>the IMC Act, 1956.</u>

Read: Council Inspector's report (September, 1999) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at St. John's Medical College, Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences for starting of M.Ch. (Paed. Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Sept., 1999) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.Ch. (Paed. Surgery) course at St. John'e Medical College, Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of health Sciences, u/s 10a of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admission to 1 (one) student per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of section 11(2) of the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

<u>Office Note</u>:- The above decision may be communicated to the Central Govt. only after receipt of the undertaking from the authorities of the St. John's Medical College, to the effect that they will not admit any candidates to the DNB qualification in the department.

9. <u>Starting of M.D. (General Medicine) course at NDMVP Samaj's medical</u> <u>college, nasik affiliated to Maharashtra University of Health Sciences u/s 10A</u> <u>of the IMC Act, 1956.</u>

Read: Council Inspector's report (September, 1999) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at NDVMP Samaj's medical College, nasik affiliated to Maharashtra University of Health Sciences for starting of M.D. (General Medicine) course u/s 10a of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Sept., 1999) and noted that NDMVP Samaj's Medical College, Nasik, is not owning and mananging a hospital of the required bed strength as per the requirements laid down in the regulations for the number of admissions being made at the medical college for the MBBS course and further that it is utilizing the facilities of Civil Hospital and Bytco Hospital, owned by the State Govt. and the Municipal Corporation respectively and both these hospitals are situated at a distance of 8-9 km. Away from the Medical College.

Considering the fact that as per the regulations framed u/s 10 A of the IMC Act, 1956 and Minimum Standard Requirement for the Medical College Regulations, and institution is required to possess its own hospital of the required bed strength, decided to refer the matter to the /General Body of the Council for taking a policy decision for the recognized medical institutions applying u/s 10a of the IMC Act,

1956 for starting of courses which do not own and manage a hospital of the required bed strength as per regulations prescribed for the establishment of the medical college. However, the Postgraduate committee was of the opinion that recognized medical institutions not owning and managing a hospital in totality with required number of beds for the number of admissions being made at the undergraduate level in conformity with the regulations for establishment of medical college should not be permitted to start postgraduate courses u/s10A of the IMC Act, 1956 till such time the additional beds are provided to the existing hospitals owned and managed by such institutions in conformity with the regulations.

The committee further decided to defer the consideration of the matter and authorized the Chairman to take a decision after a policy in this matter is decided by the General Body of the Council.

10. <u>Increase of Seats in M.S. (Ortho.) & D.Ortho, courses at JSS Medical</u> <u>College, Mysore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences u/s</u> <u>10A of the IMC Act, 1956.</u>

Read:- Council Inspector's report (August, 1999) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at JSS Medical College, Mysore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of health Sciences for increase of seats in M.S. (Ortho.) & D. Ortho. Courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 1999) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in M.S. (Orthopaedics) & D. Ortho. Courses at JSS Medical College, Mysore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of health Sciences, from 3 (three) to 4 (four) students in M.S. (Orthopaedics) and from 6 (six) to 8 (eight) students in D. Ortho. Courses per year prospectively u/s 10a of the IMC Act, 1956 till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examination of the said courses.

11. <u>Increase of seats in M.D. (Paediatrics) course at M.S. Ramaiah Medical</u> <u>College, Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences</u> <u>u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956</u>

Read: Council Inspector's report (Sept., 1999) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences for increase of seats in M.D. (Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Sept., 1999) and decided to recommend to the Central govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in M.D. (Paed.) course at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences from 2 (two) to 3(three) per year prospectively u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 till the

first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examination of the said course.

12. <u>Increase of seats in D.G.O. course at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore affiliated</u> to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read:- Council Inspector's report (Sept., 1999) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences for increase of seats in M.D. (Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Sept. 1999) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in M.D. (Paed.) course at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences from 2(two) to 3(three) per year prospectively u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examination of the said course.

13. <u>Increase of seats in DGO course at JSS Medical college, Mysore affiliated to</u> <u>Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.</u>

Read:- Council Inspector's report (August, 1999) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at JSS Medical College, Mysore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences for increase of seats in DGO Course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Sept., 1999) and noting that the institution is having only 126 beds in the Deptt. of Obst. & Gynae. as against the required 150 beds for the number of admissions being made at the undergraduate level; decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in DGO course at JSS Medical College, Mysore.

14. <u>Starting of D.M. (Medical Oncology) course at Chennai Medical College,</u> <u>Chennai Affiliated to the Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University u/s 10A</u> <u>of the IMC Act, 1956.</u>

Read:- Council Inspector's report (September 1999) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Chennai Medical College, Chennai affiliated to the Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University for starting of D.M. (Medical Oncology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (September, 1999) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of D.M. (Medical Oncology) course at Chennai Medical College, Chennai affiliated to the Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admissions to 2

(two) students per year till the first batch of admissions to 2 (two) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as pr the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

15. <u>Rajasthan University – Recognition of M.D. (Biochemistry) qualification in</u> respect of students being trained at S.M.S. Medical College, Jaipur.

Read:- Council Inspector's report (July, 1999) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Rajendra Medical College, Ranchi for recognition of D.T.M. & h. qualification granted by Ranchi University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 1999) and decided to obtain the comments of institution and the affiliated University regarding syllabus and course curriculum of the subject and further decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the receipt of comments/clarification.

16. <u>Bangalore University & Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences –</u> <u>Recognition of MD (Biochemistry) qualification in respect of students being</u> <u>trained at St. John's Medical College, Bangalore.</u>

Item may be read corrected as under:-

Bangalore University & Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences – Approval of St. John's Medical College, Bangalore for the award of M.D. (Biochemistry) qualification granted by Bangalore University; & recognition of MD (Biochemistry) qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of health Sciences in respect of students being trained at St. John's medical College, Bangalore.

Read: Council Inspector's report (Oct. 1999) on the standard of examination & other teaching facilities available at St. John's Medical College, Bangalore for purpose of approval of Institution for the award of M.D. (Biochemistry) qualification granted by Bangalore University and also for recognition of MD (Biochemistry) qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences in respect of this institution.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (October, 1999) and decided to recommend that St. John's Medical College, Bangalore be approved for the award of M.D. (Biochemistry) qualification granted by Bangalore Univ. restricting the number of admission to 1 (one) student per year.

The committee further decided to recommend that MD (Biochemistry) qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences in respect of students being trained at St. John's Medical College, Bangalore be recognized and

included in the Ist Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 restricting the number of admission to 1 (One) student per year.

17. <u>Bombay University – Continuance of recognition of MS (Ophthalmology)</u> <u>qualification in respect of students being trained at (i) Seth G.S. Medical</u> <u>College (ii) Grant Medical College and (iii) T.N. Medical College, Mumbai.</u>

Read:- Council Inspector's report (February, 1999) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at (i) Seth G.S. Medical College (ii) Grant medical College and (iii) T.N. Medical College, Mumbai for continuance of recognition of M.S. (Ophthalmology) qualification granted by Bombay University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the matter of continuance of recogniton of MS (Ophthalmology) qualification and decided as under:-

i) Grant Medical College, Mumbai:

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Feb., 1999) and decided that M.S. (Ophthalmology) qualification granted by Bombay University in respect of students being trained at Grant Medical College, Bombay be continued. However, the authorities of the institution are directed to restrict the number of admissions from the ensuing academic session to 2 (Two) students per year in view of the present available teaching faculty.

The Committee further decided to advise the institution authorities to rectify the deficiencies as regards the equipments/ instruments in the department pointed out in the inspection report. Copy of the letter be marked to the Secretary, Health, Medical Education & Drugs, Vice-Chancellor & Registrar, Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik; Vice-Chancellor/ Registrar, Bombay University; Director, Medical Education and Member, MCI representing State Govt.

ii) <u>Seth G.S. Medical College, Mumbai:</u>

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Feb., 1999) and decided to obtain details of clinical material from the authorities of the institution and the Chairman is authorized to decide in the matter on receipt of the required information.

iii) <u>T.N. Medical College, Mumbai:</u>

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Feb., 1999) and decided not to recommend continuance of recognition of M.S. (Ophthalmology) qualification granted by University of Mumbai in respect of students being trained at T.N. Medical College, Mumbai since the required teaching complement

of minimum of 3 teachers in each unit as per MCI norms, is not complete and there were other defects and deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report. The authorities of the institution are directed to stop the admissions in M.S. (Ophthalmology) course from the next academic session. Copy of the letter be marked to the Secretary, Health, Medical Education & Drugs, Vice-Chancellor & Registrar, Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik' Vice-Chancellor/Registrar, Bombay University; Director, Medical Education and Member, MCI representing State Govt.

18. Whether an institution requires to furnish bank guarantee separately for diploma course where it has already provided bank guarantee for the permitted degree course in the same subject – consideration thereof as a general policy.

Read:- The matter with regard to whether an institution requires to furnish bank guarantee separately for diploma course where it has already provided bank guarantee for the permitted degree course in the same subject.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 15.07.99 from the Central Govt. regarding furnishing of bank guarantee separately for P.G. diploma course by Raja Muthiah Medical College, Annamalainagar where bank guarantee in respect of the P.G. degree course in the same subjects already stand furnished, and decided to recommend that in all such cases where bank guarantee for P.G. degree course has been furnished by an Institution; the rquirement of bank guarantee in the diploma course in the same subject should be waived off as the consideration for starting the diploma course is against the same requirements vide which permission for starting the degree course is considered/granted.

It further decided that for the specialities where postgraduate degree is already recognized by the Council and the institutions now wish to start diploma courses in the same the bank guarantee for the diploma courses in these specialities should also be waived off.

19. <u>Non-Teaching Hospital- Recognition /Continuance of recognition/increase of seats for housemanship at Dr. B.A.M. Hospital, Central Railway, Byculla, Mumbai.</u>
