1. <u>Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Committee – confirmation of.</u>

Minutes of the meeting of the Postgraduate Committee held on 23.12.2004 were confirmed.

2. <u>Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Committee – action taken</u> <u>thereon</u>.

The Postgraduate Committee noted the action taken on the various items included in the minutes of the meeting of the Postgraduate Committee held on 23.12.2004.

3. <u>Work output report of the requests received u/s 10A for the year 2003 and 2004.</u>

The Postgraduate Committee noted the work out put report of the requests received u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the year 2003 & 2004.

4. <u>Starting of M.D.(Obst. & Gynae.) course at Govt. Medical College, Rajkot</u> under Saurashtra University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Rajkot under Saurashtra University for consideration of starting of M.D.(Obst. & Gynae.) course.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) and noted that there is no Assoc. Prof. in Unit I; decided to advise the institution authorities to re-organise the units in terms of teaching faculty as per MCI norms.

The Committee further decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the information is received.

5. <u>Starting of M.D.(Microbiology) & Diploma in Microbiology courses at</u> <u>Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad, Gujarat affiliated to Sardar</u> <u>Patel University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956-consideration of compliance</u> <u>regarding.</u>

Read: The compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad, Gujarat affiliated to Sardar Patel University for consideration of starting of M.D.(Microbiology) & Diploma in Microbiology courses.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) and decided to verify the compliance by way of an inspection.

6. <u>Starting of M.D.(Pathology) & DCP courses at Padmashree Dr. D.Y. Patil</u> <u>Medical College, Navi Mumbai (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act,</u> <u>1956-consideration of compliance regarding.</u>

Read: The compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Padmashree Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College, Navi Mumbai (Deemed University) for consideration of starting of M.D.(Pathology) & DCP courses.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D.(Pathology) & DCP courses at Padmashree Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College, Navi Mumbai (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2005-2006 restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year in each course till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said courses. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualifications at the time of first available examinations as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the Act, 1956.

7. <u>Starting of M.D. (Pharmacology) course at M.G.M. Medical College, Navi</u> <u>Mumbai affiliated to Mumbai University u/s 10A of IMC Act, 1956-</u> <u>consideration of compliance verification reg.</u>

Read: The compliance verification inspection report (November, 2004) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (April, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at M.G.M. Medical College, Navi Mumbai, for consideration of starting of M.D. (Pharmacology) course.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (November, 2004) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (April, 2002) and decided to recommend to the Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D. (Pharmacology) course at M.G.M. Medical College, Navi Mumbai under Mumbai University u/s 10 A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2005-2006 restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11 (2) of the Act, 1956.

8. <u>Starting of M.Ch.(Cardio Vascular & Thoracic Surgery) course at Bangalore</u> <u>Medical College, Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health</u> <u>Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956-consideration of</u> <u>compliance regarding.</u>

Read: The compliance together with the Council's inspector report(June,2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Bangalore Medical College, Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for consideration of starting of M.Ch.(Cardio Vascular & Thoracic Surgery) course.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the Council's inspector report (June,2004) and decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 29.10.2004 recommending to the Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.Ch. (Cardio Vascular & Thoracic Surgery) course at Bangalore Medical College, Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following –

- (i) There is no Associate Professor in the department.
- (ii) One of the Lecturer is deputed for M.Ch.; the second Lecturer does not possess requisite super-speciality qualification; therefore teaching complement is incomplete.
- (iii) Bed strength is not as per MCI norms.
- (iv) There is no facility for Cardiac Surgery & Cardiology.
- (v) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

The Committee further decided to recommend that in view of the above, the Govt. may consider disapproving the proposal for starting of M.Ch.(Cardio Vascular & Thoracic Surgery) course. However, the institution is free to apply afresh after rectification of the deficiencies, in accordance with the Council's Regulations on Postgraduate Medical Education, 2000.

9. <u>Starting of D.M.(Neonatology) course at Maulana Azad Medical College,</u> <u>New Delhi granted by Delhi University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956-</u> <u>consideration of compliance regarding.</u>

Read: The compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (Oct., 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Maulana Azad Medical College, New Delhi granted by Delhi University for consideration of starting of D.M.(Neonatology) course.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (Oct., 2004) and decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 29.10.2004 recommending to the Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of DM (Neonatology) course at Maulana Azad Medical College, New Delhi affiliated to Delhi University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following -

- (i) Prof. & HOD and the IInd Asstt. Prof. do not possess requisite recognised superspeciality qualification.
- (ii) Teaching complement is incomplete.
- (iii) There is no Associate Professor.
- (iv) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

The Committee further decided to recommend that in view of the above, the Govt. may consider disapproving the proposal for starting of DM (Neonatology) course. However, the institution is free to apply afresh after rectification of the deficiencies, in accordance with the Council's Regulations on Postgraduate Medical Education, 2000.

10. <u>Starting of M.D.(Paediatrics) course at Rajiv Gandhi Medical College,</u> <u>Thane affliated to University of Mumbai-consideration of compliance</u> <u>regarding.</u>

Read: The compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (May, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Rajiv Gandhi Medical College, Thane for consideration of starting M.D.(Paediatrics) course.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (May, 2004) and decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 23.9.2004 recommending to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D. (Paediatrics) course at Rajiv Gandhi Medical College, Thane u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following-

- (i) Clinical material is inadequate.
- (ii) There is no Assoc. Professor in Unit-I.
- (iii) Unit II is being headed by Honorary Professor
- (iv) Prof. & HOD does not possess requisite recognised postgraduate qualification.
- (v) Teaching complement is incomplete in both the units.
- (vi) Full time Dean is not appointed.
- (vii) Ancillary staff as per MCI norms not available including Speech Therapist and the Child Psychologist.
- (viii) Blood component facility is not available in blood bank.
- (ix) Facility for Endocrinology investigation is not available in Biochemistry Lab.
- (x) Radiotherapy & MRI is not available.
- (xi) Dialysis facility is not available.
- (xii) Central Research lab. is not available.
- (xiii) Specialized diagnostic facility for Holter, EMG, EEG & Evoke potentials are not available.
- (xiv) Speciality clinics not available in Nephrology, Neurology, Haematology & Endocrinology.
- (xv) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

The Committee further decided to recommend that in view of the above, the Govt. may consider disapproving the proposal for starting of M.D. (Paediatrics) course. However, the institution is free to apply afresh after rectification of the deficiencies, in accordance with the Council's Regulations on Postgraduate Medical Education, 2000.

11. <u>Increase of seats in M.S.(E.N.T.) course at Andhra Medical College,</u> <u>Visakhapatnam affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences,</u> <u>Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – compliance verification</u> <u>regarding.</u>

Read: The compliance verification inspection report (Sept., 2004) together with compliance and inspection report (February, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam for consideration of increase of seats in M.S.(E.N.T.) course.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification inspection report (Sept., 2004) together with compliance and inspection report (February, 2003) and decided to recommend to the Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in MS (ENT) course at Andhra Medical College, Visakhapatnam affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because -

- (i) The promotion of Incharge Unit II is not as per MCI norms; hence Unit II is incomplete.
- (ii) Other deficiencies/remarks in the report.

12 <u>Sri Venkateswara University, Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences,</u> <u>Vijayawada and N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada -</u> <u>Approval of Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool for the award of M.S.</u> <u>(E.N.T.) qualification - consideration of compliance verification reg.</u>

Read: The compliance verification inspection report (January, 2005) together with compliance and inspection report (March, 2002) on the standard of examination and other

teaching facilities available at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool for i) recognition of M.S.(E.N.T.) qualification granted by Sri Venkateswara University and also ii) approval of the college for the award of M.S.(E.N.T.) qualification earlier granted by Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada & now by the NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification inspection report (January, 2005) together with compliance and inspection report (March, 2002) and decided not to recommend approval/recognition of MS (ENT) qualification earlier granted by Sri Venkateswara University / Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada & now by the NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada in respect of students being trained at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool because :

- (i) There is no departmental library in the library.
- (ii) There is no departmental museum.
- (iii) There is no temporal bone dissection lab.
- (iv) There is no side lab. in the ward.
- (v) Although number of beds are 60 in the department with 2 teaching units. However, 20% of these beds are located in a makeshift verandah where the space available for the ward and the space between the beds is grossly inadequate.
- (vi) Other deficiencies/remarks in the report.

13. <u>Approval of Medical College, Rohtak for the award of M.S.(Ophthalmology)</u> <u>qualification – affiliation with Punjab University regarding.</u>

Read: The letter dated 20.12.2004 from Dr.R.C. Nagpal, Dehradun regarding recognition of M.S.(Ophthalmology) qualification under Punjab University as already recognised under M.D. University, Rohtak.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 20.12.2004 from Dr. R.C. Nagpal, Dehradun and noted that M.S.(Ophthalmology) qualification is already reognised under M.D. University, Rohtak and the matter for recognition of M.S. (Ophthalmology) under Panjab University is under consideration; decided to recommend that Medical College, Rohtak be approved for the award of M.S. (Ophthalmology) qualification granted by Panjab University.

14. <u>Rajasthan University – Approval of J.L.N. Medical College, Ajmer for the award of M.S.(Orthopaedics) qualification.</u>

Read: The compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at J.L.N. Medical College, Ajmer for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.S.(Orthopaedics) qualification granted by Rajasthan University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) and decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 23.9.2004 not approving JLN Medical College, Ajmer for the award of MS (Orthopaedics) qualification because-

- i) Teaching complement is incomplete in Unit II
- ii) Present teaching faculty is insufficient even for Undergraduate course.
- iii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

The Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admissions prospectively in M.S (Orthopaedics) qualification from the ensuing academic session 2005-2006.

15. <u>Shivaji University – Approval of V.M. Medical College, Solapur for the</u> <u>award of MD (Paediatrics) & DCH qualification.</u> &

<u>Maharashtra</u> University of Health Sciences, Nashik – Approval of V.M. <u>Medical College, Solapur for the award of DCH qualification.</u>

Read: The Council Inspector report (December, 2004) of standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at V.M. Medical Solapur for purpose of i)approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Paediatrics) & DCH qualification granted by Shivaji University and ii) approval of V.M. Medical College, Solapur for the award of DCH qualification granted by Maharashtra University of Health sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (December, 2004) and decided not to approve V.M. Medical College, Solapur for the award of MD (Paediatrics) & DCH qualifications granted by Shivaji University / Maharashtra University of Health sciences, Nashik because:-

- (i) The Deptt. is being headed by Emeritus Prof. who is more than 65 years of age.
- (ii) There is no Associate Professor in Unit I.
- (iii) Unit-II has only one full time faculty member.
- (iv) Teaching complement is incomplete in both the units.
- (v) Other deficiencies/remarks in the report.

The Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admissions prospectively in MD (Paediatrics) & DCH qualifications from the ensuing academic session 2005-2006.

16. <u>Shivaji University – Approval of Dr. V.M. Medical College, Solapur for the</u> <u>award of MD(SPM) qualification & recognition of DPH qualification.</u>

<u>Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik – Approval of V.M.</u> <u>Medical College, Solapur for the award of DPH qualification.</u>

Read: The Council Inspector report (January, 2005) of standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Dr. V.M. Medical Collee, Solapur for purpose of i) recognition of DPH qualification and approval of the college for the award of MD(SPM) qualification granted by Shivaji University and (ii) approval of the college for the award of DPH qualification under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (January, 2005) and decided not to approve V.M. Medical College, Solapur for the award of MD (SPM) & recognition of DPH qualifications granted Shivaji University / Maharashtra University of Health sciences, Nashik because:-

- (i) Professor & HOD does not possess requisite recognised postgraduate qualification.
- (ii) Ist Associate Professor does not possess recognised postgraduate qualification.
- (iii) Other deficiencies/remarks in the report.

The Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admissions prospectively in MD (SPM) & DPH qualifications from the ensuing academic session 2005-2006.

17. <u>Kashmir University – Recognition of M.S.(Orthopaedics) qualification in</u> respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Srinagar – <u>Consideration of compliance regarding.</u>

Read: The compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (March, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Srinagar for purpose of recognition of M.S.(Orthopaedics) qualification granted by Kashmir University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (March, 2004) and decided to reiterate its earlier decisions taken at its meetings held on 15.4.2004 recommending not to recognise MS (Orthopaedics) qualification granted by Kashmir University in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Srinagar as the compliance received is unsatisfactory.

18. <u>Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Approval of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification in respect of students being trained at Sree Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur.</u>

Read: The Council Inspector report (November, 2004) of standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Sree Sidhartha Medical College, Tumkur for purpose of approval of the college for the award of MS (Orthopaedics) qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (November, 2004) and noted that the Principal/Dean is over age; decided to defer the consideration of the matter.

19. <u>Sardar Patel University – Approval of Pramukhswami Medical College,</u> <u>Karamsad, Gujarat for the award of D.G.O. qualification.</u>

Read: The Council Inspector report (August, 2004) of standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad, Gujarat for purpose of approval of the college for the award of D.G.O. qualification granted by Sardar Patel University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (August, 2004) and decided to recommend that Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad, Gujarat be approved for the award of DGO qualification granted by Sardar Patel University restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year.

20. <u>The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai – Approval of</u> <u>P.S.G. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore for the award</u> <u>of MD (Obst. & Gynae.) qualification.</u>

Read: The Council Inspector report (September, 2004) of standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at P.S.G. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore for purpose of approval of the college for the award of MD (Obst. & Gynae.) qualification granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (September, 2004) and decided to recommend that P.S.G. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore be approved for the award of MD (Obst. & Gynae.) qualification granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year.

21. <u>Madras University and The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University,</u> <u>Chennai- Approval of Stanley Medical College, Chennai for the award of</u> <u>MD(Paediatrics) qualification - consideration of compliance reg.</u>

Read: The compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (April, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Stanley Medical College, Chennai for purpose of approval of the college for the award of MD(Paediatrics) qualification earlier granted by Madras University and now by The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai. The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) and decided to verify the compliance by way of an inspection.

22. <u>Approval of M.R. Medical College, Gulbarga for the award of DCP</u> <u>qualification affiliation with Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences,</u> <u>Bangalore.</u>

Read: The letter dated 15.12.2004 from the Dean, M.R.Medical College, Gulbarga regarding recognition of DCP qualification under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 15.12.2004 of the Dean, M.R. Medical College, Gulbarga and decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the inspection report of Pathology of this college is received and is taken up for consideration.

23 <u>Change of nomenclature of MS(Anatomy) and MD(Obst. & Gynae.)</u> <u>qualification to MD(Anatomy) & MS(Obst. & Gynae.) qualification -</u> <u>Recognition of MD(Anatomy) & MS(Obst. & Gynae.) qualification granted</u> <u>by Manipal Academy of Higher Education(Deemed University), Manipal.</u>

Read: The letter dated 23.12.2004 from the Registrar, Manipal Academy of Higher Education(Deemed University), Manipal regarding recognition of MS(Anatomy) & MD(Obst. & Gynae.) qualification has been changed to MD (Anatomy) & MS(Obst. & Gynae.) qualification w.e.f. academic session 2001.

The Postgraduate Committee noted the letter dated 23.12.2004 from the Registrar, Manipal Academy of Higher Education (Deemed University), Manipal and decided that the qualification by the changed nomenclature of MS (Anatomy) & MD(Obst. & Gynae.) to MD (Anatomy) & MS(Obst. & Gynae.) qualifications granted by MAHE University be recognised and included in the 1st Schedule to the IMC Act,1956.

26. <u>Inclusion of Master degree in Applied Epidemiology and Master degree in</u> <u>Public Health qualifications granted by Sree Chitra Tirunal Institute of</u> <u>Medical Sciences & Technology, Thiruvananthapuram in the 1st Schedule to</u> <u>the IMC Act, 1956 – consideration of legal opinion regarding.</u>

Read: The legal opinion together with letter dated 19.12.2001 & 12.7.2002 from the Registrar, Sree Chitra Tirunal Institute of Medical Sciences & Technology, Thiruvananthapuram regarding inclusion of the "Master Degree in Applied Epidemiology" & "Master degree in Public Health" offered by the institutions in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the legal opinion together with letter dated 19.12.2001 & 12.7.2002 from the Registrar, Sree Chitra Tirunal Institute of Medical Sciences & Technology, Thiruvananthapuram and decided that the following qualifications awarded by Sree Chitra Tirunal Institute of Medical Sciences & Technology, Thiruvananthapuram be included in the 1st schedule to the IMC Act, 1956:-

- 1. Master degree in Applied Epidemiology
- 2. Master degree in Public Health

The Committee further decided to advise the institution authorities to adhere the nomenclatures of the qualifications prescribed by the IMC in the regulations of the Council on Postgraduate Medical Education, 2000.

The Committee further decided to write to the Central Govt. pointing out the grant of approval by the Govt. of India to the statutory PG Regulations of the Council requiring a uniformity of nomenclature and duration of PG Medical Courses in all the medical institutions in the country being in the larger public interest and requesting that this institution created under the 1980 Act, is requested to consider and adopt the same. Such a request should be considered by this institution objectively and it should not in any manner be seen as an attempt to dilute the autonomy of this institution.

27. <u>Variation in nomenclatures of Postgraduate Degree/Diploma qualification</u> <u>awarded by respective universities – consideration of recognition regarding.</u>

Read: The matter regarding variation in nomenclatures of Postgraduate Degree/Diploma qualification awarded by respective university.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the matter and decided that postgraduate qualifications recognised and included in the 1st Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 in a subject and the nomenclature thereof if has been subsequently altered by the Council and adopted

by the authorities concerned, then the qualifications by both the nomenclatures shall be deemed to be recognised by the Council, so that individuals/candidates may not suffer.

28. <u>Recognition of each of the PG/Superspeciality courses of each of the medical</u> <u>college under a university – Notification regarding.</u>

Read: The matter regarding issuance of Gazette Notification from the Central Govt. for recognition of each postgraduate qualification of each of the medical college under a university.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the whole matter and decided that a request be made to the Central Government to issue Gazette Notification separately for each of the postgraduate courses of each college under the affiliating & examining University.

29. <u>Increase of seats in MD(Dermatology) course at Osmania Medical College,</u> <u>Hyderabad affiliated to NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s</u> <u>10A of the IMC Act, 1956- Consideration of compliance regarding.</u>

Read: The compliance together with Council Inspector's report (September, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad for consideration of starting of M.D.(Dermatology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with Council Inspector's report (September, 2003) and decided to refer the matter to the General Body of the Council for a policy decision whether by considering the matter for increase of seats in the degree course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956, the intake capacity in the concerned diploma course duly recognized may be reduced in consonance with the existing regulations of the Council on Postgraduate Medical Education, 2000 or otherwise.

30. <u>Increase of seats in MS(General Surgery) course at Rangayara Medical</u> <u>College, Kakinada under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s</u> <u>10A of the IMC Act, 1956.</u>

Read: The Council Inspector report (January, 2005) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for consideration of Increase of seats in MS(General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (January, 2005) and decided to seek a clarification from the institution authorities regarding the unit-wise distribution of teaching faculty.

The Committee further decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the information is received.

31. <u>Starting of M.D.(Microbiology) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical</u> <u>Sciences, Hyderabad affiliated to Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences,</u> <u>Hyderabad (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 –</u> <u>consideration of compliance regarding.</u>

Read: The compliance together with Council Inspector's report (August, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad for consideration of starting of M.D.(Microbiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with Council Inspector's report (August, 2003) and decided to again reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meetings held on 25.2.2004 recommending to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D.(Microbiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

- i) Promotion of Prof. & HOD and Assoc. Professor is not as per MCI norms.
- ii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

The Committee further decided to recommend that in view of the above, the Govt. may consider disapproving the proposal for starting of MD (Microbiology) course. However, the institution is free to apply afresh after rectification of the deficiencies, in accordance with the Council's Regulations on Postgraduate Medical Education, 2000.

32. <u>Starting of M.Ch.(Surgical Gastroenterology) course at Nizam Institute of</u> <u>Medical Sciences, Hyderabad affiliated to Nizam's Institute of Medical</u> <u>Sciences, Hyderabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956-consideration of</u> <u>compliance regarding.</u>

Read: The compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (July, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad for consideration of starting of M.Ch.(Surgical Gastroenterology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (July, 2004) and decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 29.10.2004 recommending to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.Ch.(Surgical Gastroenterology) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following:-

- 1. None of the teaching faculty possesses requisite recognized super speciality qualification.
- 2. Prof. & HOD does not possess requisite teaching experience in the super speciality for promotion as Professor.
- 3. Teaching complement is incomplete.
- 4. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

The Committee further decided to recommend that in view of the above, the Govt. may consider disapproving the proposal for starting of M.Ch. (Surgical Gastroenterology) course. However, the institution is free to apply afresh after rectification of the deficiencies, in accordance with the Council's Regulations on Postgraduate Medical Education, 2000.

33. <u>Starting of M.D.(Obst. & Gynae.) course at Govt. Medical College,</u> <u>Bhavnagar affiliated to Bhavnagar University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956</u> <u>– consideration of compliance verification regarding.</u>

Read: The compliance verification report (January,2005) togetherwith Compliance & Council Inspector's report (August, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Bhavnagar for starting of M.D.(Obst. & Gynae.) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (January, 2005) togetherwith Council Inspector's report (August, 2002) and decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 26.9.2002 recommending to the Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD (Obst. & Gynae) course at Govt. Medical College, Bhavnagar affiliated to Bhavnagar University u/s 10A of the IMC Act,1956 because

- (i) There is no Associate Professor in Unit-I; therefore teaching complement is incomplete.
- (ii) Other deficiencies/remarks in the report.

34. <u>Starting of D.M.(Child & Adolescent Psychiatry) course at NIMHANS,</u> <u>Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956- consideration of compliance</u> <u>regarding.</u>

Read: The Council Inspector's report (July, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at NIMHANS togetherwith compliance for consideration of starting of D.M.(Child & Adolescent Psychiatry) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 2004) and was of the view that it is a statutory requirement to create a separate department and not just a unit in consonance with the Regulations of the on Postgraduate Medical Education, 2000 for starting of D.M.(Child & Adolescent Psychiatry) and decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the information is received in this regard.

35. <u>Starting of M.D.(Physiology) course at Burdwan Medical College, Burdwan affiliated to Burdwan University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – compliance regarding.</u>

Read: The compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (July, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Burdwan Medical College, Burdwan for consideration of starting of M.D.(Physiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (July, 2003) and decided to again reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meetings held on 9.10.2003 recommending to the Central Government not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD (Physiology) course at Burdwan Medical College, Burdwan u/s 10A of the IMC Act,1956 because of the following:-

- (i) Teaching staff is insufficient even for undergraduate intake.
- (ii) Other deficiencies/observations pointed out in the inspection report.

The Committee further decided to recommend that in view of the above; the Govt. may consider disapproving the proposal for starting of MD (Physiology) course. However, the institution is free to apply afresh after rectification of the deficiencies, in accordance with the Council's regulations on Postgraduate Medical Education,2000.

36. <u>Starting of D.M.(Nephrology) course at Coimbatore Medical College,</u> <u>Coimbatore affiliated to Dr. MGR Medical University u/s 10A of the IMC</u> <u>Act, 1956-consideration of compliance regarding.</u>

Read:- the compliance together with Council Inspector's report (July, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Coimbatore Medical College, Coimbatore for consideration of starting of D.M.(Nephrology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 2004) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Intent for starting of D.M.(Nephrology) course at Coimbatore Medical College, Coimbatore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year.

The Committee further decided to draw the attention to the observations made by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

37. <u>Starting of M.Ch.(Cardio-Vascular Thoracic Surgery)</u> course at Gandhi <u>Medical College, Bhopal affiliated to Barkatullah University</u> u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956-consideration of compliance regarding.

Read:- the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (September, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Gandhi Medical College, Bhopal for consideration of starting of M.Ch.(Cardio Vascular Thoracic Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (September, 2003) and decided to ascertain from the college authorities whether Prof. & Head of the Deptt. has superannuated? A list of present teaching faculty of the department of M.Ch. (Cardio Vascular Thoracic Surgery) be also obtained.

The Committee further decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the information is received.

38. <u>Starting of M.D.(Pathology) course at Annasheb Chudaman Patil Memorial</u> <u>Medical College, Dhule under North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon u/s</u> <u>10A of the IMC Act, 1956-compliance regarding.</u>

Read: the compliance and the Council Inspector's report (July, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Annasaheb Chudaman Patil Memorial Medical College, Dhule under North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon for consideration of starting of M.D.(Pathology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 2004) and decided to verify the compliance by way of an inspection.

39. <u>Starting of M.D.(Microbiology) course at S.C.B. Medical College, Cuttack</u> <u>affiliated to Utkal University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – Consideration</u> <u>of compliance regarding.</u>

Read: - the compliance Inspector's report (July-August, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at S.C.B. Medical College, Cuttack for starting of M.D.(Microbiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (Jan., 2005) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (July-August, 2002) and decided to again reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 22/5/2004 recommending to Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D.(Microbiology) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack because compliance verification report is unsatisfactory as additional staff component for PG are not available.

40. <u>Andhra University, Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences,</u> <u>Vijayawada and N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada -</u> <u>Approval of Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada for the award of</u> <u>M.D.(Paed.) & DCH qualifications- Consideration of compliance regarding.</u>

Read: - To compliance together with Council Inspector's report (May, 2001) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada for approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Paed.) & DCH qualifications granted by Andhra University, Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada & NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada. The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with Council Inspectors (May, 2001) and decided to verify the compliance by way of an inspection.

41. <u>Andhra University, Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences,</u> <u>Vijayawada and N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada -</u> <u>Approval of Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada for the award of</u> M.S.(E.N.T.) & D.L.O. qualifications.

Read: - the compliance together with Council Inspector's report (May, 2001) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada for approval of the college for the award of M.S.(E.N.T.) qualification granted by Andhra University, Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada & NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with Council Inspectors report (May, 2001) and decided to verify the compliance by way of an inspection.

42. <u>Saurashtra University – Approval of MS(Ophthalmology) qualification in</u> respect of students being trained at Pt. Deendayal Upadhyaya Medical <u>College, Rajkot.</u>

Read: the Council Inspector (December, 2004) of standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Pt. Deendayal Upadhyaya Medical College, Rajkot for purpose of approval of the college for the award of MS (Ophthalmology) qualification granted by Saurashtra University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (December, 2004) and decided to recommend that Pt. Deendayal Upadhyaya Medical College, Rajkot be approved for the award of MS(ophthalmology) qualification granted by Saurashtra University restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year.

43. <u>Himachal Pradesh University - Recognition of D.O./DOMS qualification in</u> respect of students being trained at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Shimla – considration of compliance regarding.

Read: - the Compliance together with Council Inspector's report (July, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Shimla for purpose of recognition of D.O./DOMS qualification granted by Himachal Pradesh University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (July, 2004) and noted that the units are not as per Mci norms in terms of bed strength.

The Committee further decided to advise the institution authorities to re-organise the units in terms of bed strength i.e. minimum of 30 beds per unit in consonance with the regulations of the Council on Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 and defer the consideration of the matter till the information is received.

44. <u>Kerala University – Approval of T.D. Medical College, Alappuzha for the</u> <u>award of MD(Dermatology, Venereology & Leprosy) – consideration of</u> <u>compliance regarding.</u>

45. <u>Madras University and The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University,</u> <u>Chennai – Approval of Stanley Medical College, Chennai for the award of</u> <u>MD(Dermatology) & D.D. qualifications.</u>

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Compliance verification report (December,2004) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (February,2004) and decided to recommend that Govt. Medical College, Chandigarh be approved for the award of MD (Anatomy) qualification granted by Panjab University restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year.

61. <u>The matter for restoration of intake capacity in PG courses at</u> <u>B.R.Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore– consideration of judgement</u> <u>regarding.</u>

Read: the matter togetherwith Ld.DB of the honorable Karnataka high court regarding restoration of seats in PG courses at B.R.Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the matter togetherwith Ld.DB of the honorable Karnataka high court regarding restoration of seats in PG courses at B.R.Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore and decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the inspection is carried out for undergraduate.

- 3. No Endocrine Lab.
- 4. No Immunology Work lab. is available.
- 5. Stock Register for equipments are not maintained.
- 6. Other Deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

66. <u>Gulbarga University and Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences,</u> <u>Bangalore – Approval of Vijayanagar Institute of Medical Sciences,</u> <u>Bellary for the award of M.D.(Pharmacology) qualification – Consideration</u> <u>of compliance regarding.</u>

Read: the compliance verification report (January, 2005) togertherwith compliance Council Inspector's report (Oct., 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Vijayanagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary togetherwith compliance for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Pharmacology) qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (January,2005) togertherwith compliance Council Inspector's report (Oct., 2003) and decided to again reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 23.3.2004 as the compliance is not satisfactory.

The Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to stop admissions prospectively in MD (Pharmacology) course with immediate effect.

67. <u>Marathwada University/Dr.Baba Saheb Ambedkar Marathwada</u> <u>University, Aurangabad – Approval of Govt. Medical College,</u> <u>Aurangabad for the award of DCP qualification.</u>

Read: the Council Inspector report (February, 2005) of standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Aurangabad for purpose of approval of the college for the award of DCP qualification granted by Marathwada University and now by Dr.Baba Saheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (February,2005) and decided to recommend that Govt. Medical College, Aurangabad be approved for the award of DCP qualification granted by Marathwada University and now by Dr.Baba Saheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad restricting the number of admissions to 4 (four) students per year.

The Committee further decided to draw the attention of the university authorities as regards the second examiner not being from outside the state which is inconsistent with the Council norms.

68. <u>Increase of seats in MD(Paedidatrics) & DCH courses at Padamshree Dr.</u> <u>D.Y. Patil Medical College, Pimpri, Pune (Deemed University) –</u> <u>consideration of compliance verification regarding.</u>

Read: the compliance verification (February,2005) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (October, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Padamshree Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Pimpri, Pune (Deemed University) for consideration of increase of seats in MD(Paediatrics) & DCH courses.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Compliance verification (February,2005) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (October, 2004) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MD(Paediatrics) & DCH courses at Padamshree Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College, Pimpri, Pune (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2005-2006 restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students for degree & 2 (two) students for diploma courses per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examination of the said course.

69. <u>Starting of MD(Tuberclosis & Resp. Diseases) & DTCD courses at</u> <u>Padamshree Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College for Women, Pune (Deemed</u> <u>University) – consideration of compliance verification regarding.</u>

Read: the compliance verification report (February,2005) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (September,2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Padamshree Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Pimpri, Pune (Deemed University) for consideration of increase of seats in MD(Tuberclosis & Resp. Diseases) & DTCD courses.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (February,2005) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's (February,2005) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MD(Tuberclosis & Resp. Diseases) & DTCD courses at Padamshree Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College, Pimpri, Pune (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956

prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2005-2006 restricting the number of admission to 1 (one) student in each course per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examination of the said course.

70. Increase of seats in MD(General Medicine) course at Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal, Manipur affiliated to Manipur University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance verification regarding.

Read: the Council Inspector's report (September, 2003) togetherwith compliance and compliance verification inspection report (October,2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal, Manipur for consideration of increase of seats in MD(General Medicine) course.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (September,2003) togetherwith compliance and compliance verification report (October,2004) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) course at Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal, Manipur affiliated to Manipur University u/s 10A of the IMC Act,1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2005-2006 restricting the number of admissions from 4 (four) to 6 (six) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examination of the said course.

The Committee further decided to draw the attention of the authorities that the incharge of Unit II does not possess requisite recognized postgraduate qualification.

71. <u>Marathwada University/Dr. Baba Saheb Bhim Rao Ambedkar Marathwada</u> <u>University – recognition of MD (Radio-therapy) qualification in respect of</u> <u>students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Aurangabad.</u>

Read: the matter together with WP NO.2911/1996 – Dr.Balaji Keshavrao Vs. State of Maharashtra & Ors. filed before the Hon'ble High Court at Aurangabad for starting/recognition of MD (Radio-therapy) course at Govt. Medical College, Aurangabad.

The Postgraduate Committee deliberated upon the matter at length and decided to obtain the legal opinion in the matter and defer the consideration of the item till then.

72. <u>Starting of MD (Paediatrics) course at Coimbatore Medical College,</u> <u>Coimbatore affiliated to The Tamilnadu Dr.M.G.R. Medical University u/s</u> <u>10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – compliance for issuance of LOP regarding.</u>

Read: the Council Inspector's report (July,2002) togetherwith compliance and WP No.24505 of 2004 at Hon'ble High Court of Madras for starting of MD (Paediatrics) course at Coimbatore Medical College, Coimbatore affiliated to The Tamilnadu Dr.M.G.R. Medical University.

The Postgraduate Committee deliberated upon the matter at length and observed that the college has admitted one student in MD (Paediatrics) at Coimbatore Medical College, Coimbatore affiliated to The Tamilnadu Dr.M.G.R. Medical University in each academic year i.e. 2003 & 2004 without obtaining the statutory and binding formal Letter of Permission from the Govt. of India as required u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Committee further decided to initiate the proceedings u/s 10B in respect of the candidates admitted without getting the prior permission for the course from the Govt. of India and decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the proceedings in respect of such irregularly admitted students are concluded.

However, as the candidate has been permitted to sit in the examination by the order of the Hon'ble Madras High Court, hence a legal opinion may be procured in the matter before invoking Section 10B.
