05. <u>B.N. Mandal University, Madhepura - Recognition of M.D.(Microbiology)</u> <u>qualification in respect of students being trained at Katihar Medical College,</u> <u>Katihar.</u>

Read: the Council inspector report (July 2009) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Katihar Medical College, Katihar for purpose of recognition of M.D.(Microbiology) qualification granted by B.N. Mandal University, Madhepura.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council inspector report (July 2009) and noted that Dr. Ramanand Kumar Pappu, Assistant Professor does not possess recognized postgraduate qualification.

However, the teaching faculty complement other than the teacher mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend that M.D.(Microbiology) qualification granted by B.N. Mandal University, Madhepura in respect of students being trained at Katihar Medical College, Katihar be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2(Two) students per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

- 6.4 The recognition so granted to a Post Graduate Course shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.
- 6.6 Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub-cluase-4 shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course."

- 1. Daily OPD is 72-88, which is inadequate.
- 2. Resultantly, clinical material is inadequate.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in DCH course from the academic session 2010-2011.

07. <u>Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada – Approval of Gandhi</u> <u>Medical College, Hyderabad for the award of DM(Neurology) qualifications</u>

Read: the Council inspector report (July 2009) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Gandhi Medical College, Hyderabad for purpose of approval of the college for the award of DM(Neurology) qualification granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council inspector report (July 2009) and decided to recommend that Gandhi Medical College, Hyderabad be approved for the award of DM(Neurology) qualification granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada restricting the number of admissions to 1(One) student per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2(Two) students in M.D.(Obst. & Gynae.) and 1(One) student in DGO per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

However, the teaching faculty complement other than the teacher mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend that Mahatma Gandhi Medical & Research Institute Puducherry be approved for the award of DTCD qualification granted by Pondicherry University restricting the number of admissions to 1(One) student per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

- 6.4 The recognition so granted to a Post Graduate Course shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.

Read: the Council inspector report (July 2009) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Miraj for purpose of recognition of MD (Community Medicine)& DPH qualifications earlier granted by Shivaji University, and now by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council inspector report (July 2009) and decided to recommend that MD (Community Medicine) & DPH qualifications earlier granted by Shivaji University and now by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Miraj be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2(Two) students in MD(Community Medicine) & 2(Two) students in DPH per year prospectively commensurate with available postgraduate teachers.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council inspector report (July 2009) and decided to recommend that Narayana Medical College, Nellore be approved for the award of MS(ENT) qualification granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada restricting the number of admissions to 1(One) student per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to the following Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time:-

The Postgraduate Committee considered the inspection report (July, 2009) and decided to recommend that S.V.S. Medical College, Mahabubnagar be approved for the award of MD(TB & RD) qualification granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada restricting the number of admissions to 1(One) student per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

"……

- 6.4 The recognition so granted to a Post Graduate Course shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2009) and decided not to recognize MD(Anaesthesia) qualification granted by Ranchi University in respect of students being trained at Rajendra Institute of Medical Sciences, Ranchi because of the followings:-

- (i) Promotion of Dr. Rajesh Khanna, Associate Professor is not as per MCI norms as he has been promoted as Assoc.prof. with experience of only 3 years 4 months as Asst.Prof.
- (ii) The teaching faculty is deficient by 2 Assoc.Professors.
- (iii) There is deficiency of 3 Senior Residents.
- (iv) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in M.D.(Anaesthesia) course from the academic session 2010-2011.

15. <u>B.N. Mandal University, Madhepura - Recognition of M.D.(Biochemistry)</u> <u>qualification in respect of students being trained at Katihar Medical College,</u> <u>Katihar.</u>

Read: the Council Inspector's report (August, 2009) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Katihar Medical College, Katihar for purpose of recognition of M.D.(Biochemistry) qualification granted by B.N. Mandal University, Madhepura.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2009) and noted that Dr. K.R. Prasad, Professor, & Dr. Syed H Hussain, Asst.Prof., do not possess recognized postgraduate qualification.

However, the teaching faculty complement other than the teachers mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend that M.D.(Biochemistry) qualification granted by B.N. Mandal University, Madhepura in respect of students being trained at Katihar Medical College, Katihar be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 1(One) student per year prospectively commensurate with available postgraduate teacher.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

".....

- 6.4 The recognition so granted to a Post Graduate Course shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.
- 6.6 Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub-cluase-4 shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course."

Read: the Council Inspector's report (August, 2009) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Medical College, Kolkatta for purpose of recognition of D.M. (Clinical Haematology) qualification granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkatta.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2009) and noted that Dr. Siddhartha Shankar Ray, Asst.Prof., does not possess recognized postgraduate qualification.

However, the teaching faculty complement other than the teacher mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend that D.M. (Clinical Haematology) qualification granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkatta in respect of students being trained at Medical College, Kolkatta be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 1(One) student per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

".....

- 6.4 The recognition so granted to a Post Graduate Course shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.
- 6.6 Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub-cluase-4 shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course."

17. <u>University of Bombay/Mumbai & Maharashtra University of Health Sciences,</u> <u>Nashik - Recognition of DM (Nephrology) qualification in respect of students</u> <u>being trained at Bombay Hospital Institute of Medical Sciences, Mumbai.</u>

Read: the Compliance verification report (June,209) together with Council inspector report (August, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Bombay Hospital Institute of Medical Sciences, Mumbai for purpose of recognition of DM (Nephrology) qualification granted by University of Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (June,209) together with Council inspector report (August, 2008) and decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 22.09.2008 not to recognize DM (Nephrology) qualification granted by University of Mumbai in respect of students being trained at Bombay Hospital Institute of Medical Sciences, Mumbai because the following deficiencies are still persisting:-

- 1. Promotion of Dr. Jayesh Desai, Assoc.Prof., is not as per MCI norms as he has been promoted as Assoc.Prof. without any experience as Asst.Prof.
- 2. Resultantly, teaching faculty component is incomplete.
- 3. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

The Committee further decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 22.09.2008 to direct the institution authorities to stop admission in DM(Nephrology) course for the existing intake from the academic session 2009-10.

The Committee, in addition, decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in DM(Nephrology) course from the academic session 2010-2011 also.

18. <u>Rajasthan University & Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur –</u> <u>Approval of S.P.Medical College, Bikaner for the award of DA qualification.</u>

Read: the Council Inspector's report (June, 2009) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at S.P. Medical College, Bikaner for purpose of approval of the college for the award of DA qualification earlier granted by Rajasthan University & Now By Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (June, 2009) and decided not to approve S.P. Medical College, Bikaner for the award of DA qualification earlier granted by Rajasthan University & Now By Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur because of the following:-

- 1. There is deficiency of 3 Senior Residents.
- 2. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in DA course from the academic session 2010-2011. It was further decided to direct the instituton authorities to henceforth stop admission in MD(Anaesthesia) course from the academic session 2010-11 in view of the deficient of Senior Residents as shown above.

19. <u>Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam - Recognition of MS/MD(Anatomy)</u> <u>qualification in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College,</u> <u>Kottayam.</u>

Read: the Council Inspector's report (August, 2009) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Kottayam for purpose of recognition of MS/MD(Anatomy) qualification granted by Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2009) and decided to recommend that MS/MD(Anatomy) qualification granted by Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Kottayam be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2(Two) students per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2(Two) students per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

6.6 Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub-cluase-4 shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2009) and decided not to recognize M.D.(Dermatology/Dermatology, Ven.& Lep.) & DVD/DDVL qualifications earlier granted by Agra University and now by Dr. B.R. Ambedkar University in respect of students being trained at S.N. Medical College, Agra because of the followings:-

- 1. Promotion of Dr. A.K. Malik, Prof. is not as per MCI norms.
- 2. Resultantly, teaching faculty component is incomplete.
- 3. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

"The members of the Adhoc Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and of the Executive Committee of the Council considered the Council Inspectors report (31^{st} July & 1^{st} August, 2008) and noted the following:-

- *ii)* Assoc. Professor 38 (2Anatomy, 4 Physio, 1Biochem, 2Pharma, 3 Patho, 2 Micro, 3 Forensic, 1PSM, 5Med, 1TB, 1Psy, 4Surg., 2 Ortho, 3 Gynae,1 Anaesth, 2 Radiology, 1 Dentistry)

- 3. Auditorium is not available. Common room for boys & girls are not available.
- 4. There are no residential quarters available within the campus for faculty, class III & IV employees.
- 5. In wards Teaching facilities are not adequate. Teaching areas are not provided in OPD & wards.
- 6. There is no Medical Record Section. The records of indoor patients are kept in each department. No ICD X Classification of diseases is followed for indexing. Follow up services are not available.
- 7. All the operation theatres are not air conditioned.
- 8. There is no central suction and oxygen in ICCU and ICU.
- 9. *Facilities and equipments in labour room are inadequate.*
- 10. In CSSD department No bowl sterilizer, no Glove inspection machine, no Ultrasound Instrument Cleaning Machine and no E.T.O. is available.
- 11. There is no EPABX available in the hospital.
- 12. *Central laundry is not available.*
- 13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the members of the Adhoc Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and of the Executive Committee of the Council decided to issue a show cause notice to the authorities of S.N. Medical College, Agra as to why the recognition for the award of MBBS degree should not be withdrawn u/s 19 of the IMC Act,1956 and further decided to advise the institute to respond to the show cause notice within two months on receipt of the communication. Copy of the letter be also marked to DME of the concerned State Govt., Registrar of the University to which the college is affiliated and also to the member of MCI representing the State where the college is located".

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in M.D (T.B. & Chest/ Resp. Dise.) course from the academic session 2010-2011.

34. <u>University of Mumbai & Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik –</u> <u>Recognition of M.Ch. (Neuro Surgery) qualification in respect of students being</u> <u>trained at L.T.M. Medical College, Mumbai.</u>

Read: the compliance verification report (August,2009) together with Council Inspector's report (July, 1998) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities existing at L.T.M. Medical College, Mumbai for purpose of recognition of M.Ch. (Neuro-Surgery) qualification granted by Mumbai University after 31st Dec., 1988.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (August,2009) and decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 12.06.2009 not to recognize M.Ch.(Neuro-Surgery) qualification granted by Mumbai University in respect of students being trained at L.T.M. Medical College, Mumbai as the compliance is unsatisfactory because the following deficiencies are still persisting:-

- 1. Dr. Batak Diyora, Assoc.Prof., does not possess prescribed academic qualification.
- 2. Dr. Rahul Modgi, Asst.Prof., does not posses recognized postgraduate qualification.
- 3. Resultantly, teaching faculty component is incomplete.
- 4. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

The committee further decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 12.06.2009 to direct the institution authorities to stop admission in M.Ch.(Neuro-Surgery) course for the existing intake from the academic session 2009-10.

The Committee, in addition, decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in M.Ch.(Neuro-Surgery) course from the academic session 2010-2011 also.

35. <u>Punjab University & Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot –</u> <u>Approval of Dayanand Medical College, Ludhiana for the award of</u> <u>M.D.(Microbiology) qualification.</u>

Read: the Council Inspector's report (July, 2009) inspection of standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Dayanand Medical College, Ludhiana for purpose of approval of the College for the award of MD(Microbiology) qualification earlier granted by Punjab University & now by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 2009) and noted that Dr. Rama Gupta, Assoc.Prof. and Dr. Vandana Kaushal, Asst.Prof., do not possess prescribed academic qualification.

However, the teaching faculty complement other than the teachers mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend that Dayanand Medical College, Ludhiana be approved for the award of MD(Microbiology) qualification earlier granted by Punjab University & now by Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot restricting the number of admissions to 3(Three) students per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

- *".....*6.4 The recognition so granted to a Post Graduate Course shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.
- 6.6 Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub-cluase-4 shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course."

36. <u>Starting of MD(Radio-Therapy) course at Government Medical College, Thrissur.</u>

Read: the Council Inspector's report (Aug,2009) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Government Medical College, Thrissur for Starting of MD (Radio-Therapy) course under University of Calicut u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Aug,2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD(Radio-Therapy) course at Government Medical College, Thrissur under University of Calicut u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following:-

- 1. Dr. Prema K.R., Asst.Prof., Dr. S.A. Khadar, Senior Lecturer, Dr. Shyama Latha K P, Lecturer, Dr. Ajith Kumar K.R. & Dr. T.R. Sona Ram, Lecturer, do not possess prescribed academic qualification.
- 2. Resultantly, teaching faculty component is incomplete.
- 3. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

37. <u>Starting of MD - Obstetrtics & Gynaecology course at Army Hospital Research &</u> <u>Referral, New Delhi.</u>

Read: the Council Inspector's report (Aug,2009) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Army Hospital Research & Referral, New Delhi for Starting of MD - Obstetrtics & Gynaecology course under University of Delhi u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Aug,2009) and decided to advise the institution authorities to re-organize the beds vis-à-vis units as per MCI norms.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the information is received.

38. <u>Starting of MD (D.V.L) course at Government Medical College, Thrissur.</u>

Read: the Council Inspector's report (Aug,2009) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Government Medical College, Thrissur for Starting of MD (D.V.L) course under University of Calicut u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Aug,2009) and noted that Dr. K. Muhammed, Assoc.Prof., does not possess prescribed academic qualification.

However, the teaching faculty complement other than the teacher mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MD (D.V.L) course at Government Medical College, Thrissur under University of Calicut u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2010-2011 restricting the number of admission to 1(One) student per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

39. Increase of seat(s) in M.Ch - Urology at Government Medical College, Kottayam.

Read: the Council Inspector's report (Aug,2009) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Government Medical College, Kottayam for Increase of seat(s) in M.Ch.(Urology) course under Mahatma Gandhi University, Kerala u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Aug,2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in M.Ch.(Urology) course at Government Medical College, Kottayam under Mahatma Gandhi University, Kerala u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2010-2011 from 1(One) to 2(Two) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

40. <u>Starting of MD (Paediatrics) & DCH courses at Dr. Ghatge Paediatrics Hospital &</u> <u>PG Institute, Sangli Maharashtra - Permission of Central Govt. - regarding.</u>

Read: the Central Government letter dated 24.07.2009 sending therewith a copy of letter dated 30.6.2009 received from the President, Dr. Ghatge Paediatrics Hospital & PG Institute, Sangli Maharashtra requesting to indicate that whether the proposal for starting of MD (Paediatrics) & DCH course could be forwarded to MCI on the ground mentioned in the above cited letter.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Central Government letter dated 24.07.2009 sending therewith a copy of letter dated 30.6.2009 received from the President, Dr. Ghatge Paediatrics Hospital & PG Institute, Sangli Maharashtra requesting to indicate that whether the proposal for starting of MD (Paediatrics) & DCH course could be forwarded to MCI and noted that the Postgraduate Committee at its meeting held on 29/12/2008 decided as under:-

"The Postgraduate Committee considered the matter with regard to starting of MD (Paediatrics) & DCH courses at Dr. Ghatge Paediatrics Hospital & PG Institute, Sangli Maharashtra and observed that the institute has applied for starting of MD (Paediatrics) & DCH courses, although it is not running any MBBS course. It was further observed that the Regulations 8(1) and 8(1A) of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 read as under:-

"8. GENERAL:

- (1) The institutions recognized by the Medical Council of India for running Post Graduate courses prior to the commencement of the Indian Medical Council (Amendment) Act, 1993 and those medical colleges recognized for running Bachelor of Medical and Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS) course or institutions established by the Central Government for the purpose of imparting Post Graduate medical education shall be eligible for starting any Post Graduate degree or diploma and higher speciality course.
- (1A) The Central Government shall exempt any such existing/proposed non-teaching institution or specialist institution or autonomous body owned and managed by the central government/state government from fulfilling the prescribe provision of having an undergraduate teaching facility, and allow starting Post Graduate medical course."

As Dr. Ghatge Paediatrics Hospital & PG Institute, Sangli Maharashtra is not an institute owned and managed by the Central Govt. /State Govt., the exemption available under 8(1A) is not applicable in the instance case.

In view of above, the members of the Postgraduate Committee decided to return the application to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of the Scheme."

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to reiterate its earlier decision to return the application to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of the Scheme as Dr. Ghatge Paediatrics Hospital & PG Institute, Sangli Maharashtra is not an institute owned and managed by the Central Govt. /State Govt., the exemption available under 8(1A) is not applicable in the instant case.

41. <u>Increase of seats in MD (Nuclear Medicine) course at Sanjay Gandhi</u> <u>Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow</u>

Read: the Central Govt. letter dated. 24/07/2009 sending therewith a copy of letter dated 17/7/2009 received from the Director, Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow requesting to reconsider the decision and continue the admission in the MD (Nuclear Medicine)course.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Central Govt. letter dated. 24/07/2009 sending therewith a copy of letter dated 17/7/2009 received from the Director, Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow requesting to reconsider the decision and continue the admission in the MD (Nuclear Medicine) course and decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 28/02/2009 not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in MD(Nuclear Medicine) course at Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow, as the compliance is unsatisfactory because the following deficiencies are still persisting:-

- 1. Dr. A.K. Shukla, Professor & HOD, is a non-medical person having Ph. D. (Bio-Medical Physics) qualification & Diploma in R.P. qualification from BARC which is not a medical degree.
- 2. Dr. S. Gambhir did not submit his declaration form & as such he cannot be considered as a teacher.
- 3. Resultantly, teaching component is incomplete.

The committee further decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 28th February, 2009 to direct the institution authorities to stop admission in MD (Nuclear Medicine) course for the existing intake from the academic session 2009-10.

The Committee, in addition, decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in MD (Nuclear Medicine) course from the academic session 2010-2011 also.

42. <u>Arvind Eye Hospital, Tamil Nadu – Excess admission made in D.O. course for the academic year 2009-10.</u>

Read: the matter with regard to Excess admission made in D.O. course for the academic year 2009-10 at Arvind Eye Hospital, Tamil Nadu.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the matter with regard to Excess admission made in D.O. course for the academic year 2009-10 at Arvind Eye Hospital, Tamil Nadu and decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 18.07.2009, which reads as under:-

"The members of the Postgraduate Committee observed that Regulation 9 of Medical Council of India (criteria for identification of students admitted in excess of admission capacity of medical colleges) Regulations 1997, pertaining to the excess admission reads as under:-

"9 Identification of excess admission & non-recognition of medical qualifications:-

The Council shall find out the excess admissions in a medical college and no medical qualification granted to any identified student of the medical college which comes under the excess admission shall be recognized medical qualification for the purpose of Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (102 of 1956). The names and other particulars of students so identified shall be intimated by the Council to all concerned for taking action under the provisions of the Act. Any dispute in the matter of identification of excess admission of students(s) in a medical institution shall be referred to the Central Govt., for decision."

In view of above, the members of the postgraduate Committee decided to initiate action by issuing the discharge notice in respect of the students who have been admitted in excess of the permissible intake".

The above decision was communicated to the institute vide letter dated 31/7/2009.

The Postgraduate Committee perused the letter from the institute dated 10/8/2009 and after due deliberations, decided to reiterate its earlier decision of issuing discharge notice taken at its meeting dated 18.7.2009

43. <u>Increase of seat(s) in some PG Degree courses at Sree Balaji Medical College & Hospital, Chennai</u>.

Read: the letter dated 26/8/2009 received from the Dean, Sree Balaji Medical College & Hospital, Chennai requesting to consider the proposals for increase of seats in MD(OBG), MD(Radio-Diagnosis), MS (Orthopaedics) and MS(ENT) for the next academic year i.e. 2011-2012.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 26/8/2009 received from the Dean, Sree Balaji Medical College & Hospital, Chennai requesting to consider the proposals for increase of seats in MD(OBG), MD(Radio-Diagnosis), MS(Orthopaedics) and MS(ENT) for the next academic year i.e. 2011-2012 and decided to return the application to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of the Scheme for increase of seats in MD(OBG), MD(Radio-Diagnosis), MS(Orthopaedics) and MS(ENT) courses at Sree Balaji Medical College & Hospital, Chennai u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act,1956, as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office.

44. <u>Increase of seats in MD (DVL) at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical</u> <u>Sciences, u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.</u>

Read: the Council Inspector report (September 2009) on the physical and other teaching facility available at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru for increase of seats in MD (DVL) course under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijaywada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (September 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in MD (DVL) course at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijaywada as the available clinical material is commensurate with present annual intake.

45. <u>Increase of seats in MD (Pulmonary Medicine) at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy</u> of Medical Sciences, Eluru u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.

Read: the Council Inspector report (September, 2009) on the physical and other teaching facility available at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru for increase of seats in MD (Pulmonary Medicine) course under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijaywada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (September, 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in MD (Pulmonary Medicine) course at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijaywada as the available clinical material is commensurate with present annual intake.

47. <u>Increase of seats in MS (OBG) at Vivekanand Institute of Medical Sciences,</u> Kolkata, u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.

Read: the Council Inspector report (August 2009) on the physical and other teaching facility available at Vivekanand Institute of Medical Sciecencs, Kolkata for increase of seats in MS (OBG) course under West Bengal University of Health Sceiences, Kolkata u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (August 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at Vivekanand Institute of Medical Sciences, Kolkata under West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 because of the following:-

- (i) All the teachers are not full time.
- (ii) Eclampsia room facilities are not available.
- (iii) No separate emergency theatre for Obst. labour.
- (iv) NICU facilities near labour room are not provided.
- (v) Institute is running DNB courses.

48. <u>Increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of</u> <u>Medical Sciences u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.</u>

Read: the Council Inspector report (September 2009) on the physical and other teaching facility available at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru for increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijaywada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

- 2. Resultantly, teaching faculty component is incomplete.
- 3. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

51. <u>Starting of MD (Forensic Medicine) at Government Medical College, Thrissur of</u> <u>Medical Sciences, u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.</u>

- 1. Number of beds vis-à-vis number of units are not as per MCI norms.
- 2. Space for indoor wards & OPD is inadequate.
- 3. Office space for faculty members is inadequate.
- 4. The teachers are not full time.
- 5. The institute is conducting DNB courses.
- 6. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

53. <u>Starting of MD (Forensic Medicine) at Government Medical College, Kottayam,</u> <u>Kerala u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.</u>

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (August 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD (Forensic Medicine) course at Government Medical College, Kottayam, Kerala under Mahatama Gandhi University, Kottayam u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following:-

- 1. Promotion of Dr. K. Sasikala, Prof. & HOD, is not as per MCI norms as she was promoted to the post of Professor with experience of only 3 years 8 months as Assoc.Prof.
- 2. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

54. <u>Annamalai University - Approval Rajah Muthiah Medical College,</u> <u>Annamalainagar for award of M.S.(Orthopaedics) qualification in respect of</u> <u>increased intake.</u>

Read: the compliance verification report (August,2009) together with Council Inspector's report (April,2009) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Rajah Muthiah Medical college, Annamalainagar for approval of the college for the award of M.S.(Orthopaedics) qualification granted by Annamalai University in respect of increased intake.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (August,2009) together with Council Inspector's report (April,2009) and and noted that Rajah Muthiah Medical college, Annamalainagar already stands approved for the award of M.S.(Orthopaedics) qualification with 6(Six) seats and now the matter is under consideration for approval of the qualification against the increased intake from 6(Six) to 8(Eight) seats; and decided to recommend that Rajah Muthiah Medical College, Annamalainagar be approved for the award of M.S.(Orthopaedics) qualification granted by Annamalai University in respect of increased intake restricting the number of admissions to 8(Eight) students per year.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (September,2009) together with Council Inspector report (May,2009) and decided to recommend that M.D. (General Medicine) qualification granted by Veer Narmed South Gujarat University, Surat in respect of students being trained at Surat Municipal Institute

of Medical Education & Research, Surat be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2(Two) students per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

Mandal University, Madhepura in respect of students being trained at Katihar Medical College, Katihar be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 4(Four) students per year.

Read: the compliance verification report (August,2009) together with Council Inspector's report (October, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Vijayanagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary togetherwith compliance for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Peadiatrics) & D.C.H. qualifications granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (August,2009) together with Council Inspector's report (October, 2003) and decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 22.5.2004 not to approve Vijayanagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary for the award of M.D.(Peadiatrics) & D.C.H. qualifications granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore compliance is unsatisfactory because the following deficiencies are still persisting:-

- 1. Promotion of Dr. Durgappa, Assoc.Prof. of Unit-I, is not as per MCI norms as he has been promoted to the post Assoc.Prof. with experience only 4 years 3 months as Asst.Prof.
- 2. Resultantly, teaching faculty component is incomplete.
- 3. Declaration Forms of teaching faculty are incomplete.
- 4. Special services like endoscopy are not available.
- 5. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in M.D.(Peadiatrics) & D.C.H. courses from the academic session 2010-2011.

59. <u>Rajasthan University & Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur –</u> <u>Recognition of MD (Microbiology) qualification in respect of students being</u> <u>trained at Dr. S.N. Medical College, Jodhpur.</u>

Read: the compliance verification report (August,2009) together with Council Inspector's report (September, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Dr. S.N. Medical College, Jodhpur for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Microbiology) qualification granted by Rajasthan University & Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (August,2009) together with Council Inspector's report (September, 2004) and decided to recommend that M.D.(Microbiology) qualification granted by Rajasthan University & Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at Dr.

S.N. Medical College, Jodhpur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 1(One) student per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

"……

- 6.4 The recognition so granted to a Post Graduate Course shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.
- 6.6 Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub-cluase-4 shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course."

60. <u>Permission to change of nomenclature of the Degree of MD in Tuberculosis and</u> <u>Chest Diseases to MD in Pulmonary Medicine.</u>

Read: the letter dated 22.08.2009 from the Registrar KLE University, Belgaum regarding change of nomenclature of MD(TB & Chest Diseases) to MD (Pulmonary Medicine).

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 22.08.2009 received from the Registrar KLE University, Belgaum regarding change of nomenclature of MD(TB & Chest Diseases) to MD (Pulmonary Medicine) and noted that the General Body of the Council at its meeting held on 01.03.2009 directed to advise all the institutions wherever M.D.(T.B. & Chest diseases) course is running to change the nomenclature of the course to M.D.(Pulmonary Medicine) and further to apply to the Council for its approval through the affiliating University; decided to recommend to the Central Govt. for notification recognizing the degree by the nomenclature of MD (Pulmonary Medicine).

The Postgraduate Committee also noted that in some institutes the nomenclature of MD(Respiratory Medicine) is being used and decided that this nomenclature should also be changed to MD(Pulmonary Medicine). The Committee further decided that nomenclature of Diploma in Tuberculosis and Chest Diseases (DTCD) also needs to be changed to Diploma in Pulmonary Medicine. These proposals may be placed before the General Body of the Council for its approval.

61. <u>Withdrawal of application for enhancement of Seats in Postgraduate Medical</u> <u>Courses at NRI Academy of Sciences, Guntur, Andhra Pradesh</u>

Read: the fax letter dated 05/09/2009 from Secretary, NRI Academy of Sciences, Guntur, Andhra Pradesh, withdrawal of their application for enhancement of seats in PG courses.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the fax letter dated 05/09/2009 reveived from Secretary, NRI Academy of Sciences, Guntur, Andhra Pradesh, with regard to withdrawal of their applications for enhancement of seats in PG courses and decided to return the application/scheme to the Central Govt. for increase of seats in (i) MD (General Medicine), (ii) MD (TB & Chest), (iii) MD (Dermatology), (iv) MD (Psychiatry), (v) MD (Paediatrics), (vi) MS (Orthopaedics), (vii) MS (ENT), (viii) MD (OBG), (ix) MD (Radiology) courses at NRI Academy of Sciences, Guntur, Andhra Pradesh under Vijayawada University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act,1956, as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office.

62. <u>Withdrawal of application for enhancement of increase of Seats in Postgraduate</u> <u>Medical Courses at Datta Meghe Institute of Medical Sciences University, Nagpur.</u>

Read: the letter dated 05/09/2009 from the Registrar, Datta Meghe Institute of Medical Sciences University, Nagpur, withdrawal of their applications for increase of seats in some PG courses.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 05/09/2009 received from the Registrar, Datta Meghe Institute of Medical Sciences University, Nagpur with regard to withdrawal of their applications for increase of seats in some PG courses and decided to return the application/scheme to the Central Govt. for increase of seats in (i) MD (DVL), (ii) MD (OBG), (iii) MS (Ophthalmology), (iv) MD (Pathology), (v) MS (ENT) courses at Datta Meghe Institute of Medical Sciences University, Nagpur under Datta Meghe Institute of Medical Sciences University, (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956, as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office.

63. <u>Proposal from Government of NCT of Delhi seeking grant of status of 'deemed-to-be-university' to the institute of Liver and Biliary Sciences, New Delhi under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956.</u>

Read: the letter dated June, 2009 received from Deputy Secretary, U.G.C. enclosing therewith proposal of the Institute of Liver and Biliary Sciences and the report of the expert committee for seeking comments of the Council.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated June, 2009 received from Deputy Secretary, U.G.C. enclosing therewith proposal of the Institute of Liver and Biliary Sciences and the report of the expert committee for seeking comments of the Council and noted that the Expert Committee appointed by the University Grants Commission has submitted its report to assess the proposal to Institute of Liver and Biliary Science(ILBS), New Delhi for conferment of deemed to be university status under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956. The Committee of the Experts also included Dr. Anil Agarwal, Head of Department of G.I. Surgery, G.B. Pant Hospital, New Delhi as nominee of the Medical Council of India.

The Committee also noted that the Expert Committee in its report at Para -8 on page No.20 has stated as under:-

"The claim of the institute to be considered as a deemed to be university under de-novo category was also studied. It was appreciated by the experts that there has been rapid advances in the fields of hepatology and hepatobiliary science. There is a need in our country to have formal training programs for medical and para medical personnel in this field. This will improve the medical services provided to patients suffering from liver and biliary tract diseases and benefit the society as a whole. The Expert Committee was also apprised of the immense potential of research in hepatology. The claim submitted by the institute appears to be fully justified".

After due deliberations, the Postgraduate Committee was of the opinion that the following areas proposed by the institute indicates innovative features and are in the field of new and emerging areas:-

- (i) The concept of liver ICU for critical ill patients with acute liver failure, Hepatobiliary post-operative and hepatic coma patients.
- (ii) Development of fully equipped liver cancer unit.
- (iii) Services in the field of Paediatric and neonatal hepatology.
- (iv) Full fledged interventional biliary radiology.
- (v) Focusing research on stem cell therapy.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to recommend that the institute may come under de-novo category.

64. <u>Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical</u> <u>Sciences, u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.</u>

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (September 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijaywada u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2010-2011 from 3(Three) to 4(Four) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: the Council Inspector report (September 2009) on the physical and other teaching facility available at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru for increase of seats in MD(Radio Diagnosis) & DMRD courses under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijaywada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (September 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MD(Radio Diagnosis) & DMRD courses at Alluri Sitarama Raju Academy of Medical Sciences, Eluru under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijaywada u/s 10A of the I.M.C. The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (September 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for increase of seats in MS(Orthopaedics) course at Sri Devraj Urs Medical College, Kolar under Sri Devraj Urs University, Kolar u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956, as the available clinical material is commensurate with present annual intake.

68. <u>Starting of Diploma in Clinical Pathology at Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi</u> <u>u/s 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.</u>

Read: the Council Inspector report (September 2009) on the physical and other teaching facility available at Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi for Starting of Diploma in Clinical Pathology course under Amrita Vishwavidyapeetam u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (September 2009) and noted that Dr. Samira N.S. Asst.Prof. & Dr. Sita Laxami, Asst.Prof. do not possess prescribed academic qualification.

However, the teaching faculty complement other than the teacher mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of Diploma in Clinical Pathology course at Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi under Amrita Vishwavidyapeetam u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2010-2011 restricting the number of admission to 3(Three) students per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

69. <u>Starting of MD (Forensic Medicine) at Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi u/s 10</u> <u>A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.</u>

Read: the Council Inspector report (September 2009) on the physical and other teaching facility available at Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi for Starting of MD (Forensic Medicine) course under Amrita Vishwavidyapeetam u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

72. <u>Increase of seats in MS (ENT) at Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad u/s</u> 10 A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.

Read: the Council Inspector report (September 2009) on the physical and other teaching facility available at Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad for Increase of seats in MS (ENT) course Under Sardar Patel University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (September 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MS (ENT) course at Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad under Sardar Patel University u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2010-2011 from 1(One) to 2(Two) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to restrict the number of admissions to 1(One) student in Diploma per year prospectively from the academic session 2010-2011 commensurate with the number of units available in the department as per Section 12(1) of Postgraduate Medical Education Regulation, 2000, which states that *"in no circumstances more than two students for degree and one for diploma shall be registered in a unit in one academic year"*.

73 <u>Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Approval of M.S.</u> <u>Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore for the award of D.Ortho. qualification in</u> <u>respect of increased intake of seats.</u>

Read: the compliance together with the compliance verification report (February, 2009) alongwith the Council Inspector's report (May, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore for purpose of approval of the college for the award of D.Ortho. Qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of increased intake from 1(one) to 6(six) seats.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the compliance verification report (February, 2009) alongwith the Council Inspector's report (May, 2004) and noted that M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore already stands approved for the award of D.Ortho. qualification with 1(One) seat and now the matter is under consideration for approval of the qualification against the increased intake from 1(One) to 3(Three) seats; and decided to recommend that M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore be approved for the award of D.Ortho. Qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of increased intake restricting the number of admissions to 1(One) to 3(Three) students per year prospectively because Section 12(1) of Postgraduate Medical Education Regulation, 2000 states that *"in no circumstances more than two students for degree and one for diploma shall be registered in a unit in one academic year"*.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the attention of the institute be drawn to Clauses 6.4 and 6.6 of the Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2000, Part-II, dated 21st July, 2009 and act accordingly at appropriate time, which reads as under:-

- 6.4 The recognition so granted to a Post Graduate Course shall be for a maximum period of 5 years, upon which it shall have to be renewed.
- 6.6 Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required in sub-cluase-4 shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course."

74. <u>Saurashtra University- Recognition of M.D.(Gen. Medicine)& M.D.(P.S.M.)</u> <u>qualification in respect of Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay Medical College, Rajkot-</u> <u>regarding amendment in the notification of Government of India.</u>

Read: the letter dated 24.08.2009, from the Dean, Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay Medical college, Rajkot regarding amendment in notification in respect of M.D.(General Medicine) & M.D.(S.P.M./Community Medicine) qualifications of the college.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 24.08.2009, from the Dean, Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay Medical college, Rajkot regarding amendment in notification in respect of M.D.(General Medicine) & M.D.(S.P.M./Community Medicine) qualifications of the college and noted that

"The General Body of this Council at its meeting held on 13.11.2008 considered the inspection report (May, 2008) together with the Council Inspector's report (August, 2006) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhayay Medical College, Rajkot for purpose of recognition of M.D(SPM/Community Medicine) qualification granted by Saurashtra University, Rajkot. The Council approved the following recommendations of the Postgraduate Committee:-

"The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's Report (May, 2008) and decided to recommend that MD ((SPM/Community Medicine) qualification granted by Saurashtra University, Rajkot in respect of students being trained at Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay Medical College, Rajkot be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act,1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year.

The General Body of this Council at its meeting held on 18.02.2006 considered the Council Inspector report (December, 2004) of standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay Medical College, Rajkot for purpose of approval of the college for the award of MD(General Medicine) qualification granted by Saurashtra University. The Council approved the following recommendations of the Postgraduate Committee:-

"The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (December 2004) and decided to recommend that Pt. Now, the Dean, Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay Medical College, Rajkot vide his letter dated 24.08.2009 has informed that the first batch for MD(SPM / Community Medicine) passed in August 2006 and for MD(Gen. Medicine) April, 2004".

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to recommend to the General Body of the Council to recognize the MD(Medicine) degree when granted on or after April, 2004 (as the first batch passed in April, 2004) and the MD(PSM) degree when granted on or after August, 2006 (As the first batch passed in August, 2006).

75. <u>Amendments in the earlier Notification against the entry M.D.(Psychiatry)</u> <u>qualification of B.J.Medical College, Ahmedabad- regarding change of date.</u>

Read: the letter dated 28.08.2009 from the Dean, B.J. Medical College, Ahmedabad, regarding amendments in the notification in respect of M.D.(Psychiatry) course.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 28.08.2009 from the Dean, B.J. Medical College, Ahmedabad, regarding amendments in the notification in respect of M.D.(Psychiatry) course and noted that:

The Dean, B.J. Medical College, Ahmedabad, vide his letter dated 28.09.2009 has informed that the Ist batch of M.D.(Psychiatry) qualification of this college had granted Ist degree in October, 1978. While, as per MCI website, the qualification is recognized when granted on or after October, 1979. He has therefore, requested the Council to make necessary changes in the notification and MCI website accordingly.

It may be stated that The Postgraduate Committee at its meeting held on 29.10.1998 considered the Council Inspector's report (April 98) on the standard of examination

and other teaching facilities available at B.J. Medical College, Ahmedabad for purpose of recognition of M.D. (Psychiatry) qualification granted by Gujarat University. The Council approved the following recommendations of the Postgraduate Committee :-

"The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (April 98) and decided to recommend that M.D. (Psychiatry) qualification granted by Gujarat University in respect of students being trained at B J. Medical College, Ahmedabad be recognized and included in the first Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956. However, the authorities of the institution are directed to restrict the number of admission from the ensuing academic session to 3(three) student per year."

The members of the Postgraduate Committee observed that Regulation 9 of Medical Council of India (criteria for identification of students admitted in excess of admission capacity of medical colleges) Regulations 1997, pertaining to the excess admission reads as under:-

"9 Identification of excess admission & non-recognition of medical qualifications:-

The Council shall find out the excess admissions in a medical college and no medical qualification granted to any identified student of the medical college which comes under the excess admission shall be recognized medical qualification for the purpose of Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (102 of 1956). The names and other particulars of students so identified shall be intimated by the Council to all concerned for taking action under the provisions of the Act. Any dispute in the matter of identification of excess admission of students(s) in a medical institution shall be referred to the Central Govt., for decision."

In view of above, the members of the postgraduate Committee decided to ask for clarification from the abovementioned institutes with regard to the excess admissions made as above.

82. <u>Amendments in the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 under</u> <u>clause 12(1)(2), (3) & (4) notified in the Gazette of India on 24th July, 2009.</u>

Read: the matter with regard to amendments in the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 under clause 12(1)(2), (3) & (4) notified in the Gazette of India on 24th July, 2009.

The Postgraduate Committee observed that the Government of India had taken a policy decision for enforcement of reservation for OBC Category to the extent of 27% in all the Government Institutions in the country including the institutions of higher learning. The Government of India had also decided, in principle, that with a view to ensure that the number of seats available to general category candidates should not get reduced and seats required for implementation of reservation of OBC category should be created over a period of three years in a phased manner. The Medical Council of India had also submitted certain constructive proposals for facilitating this avowed objective sought to be achieved through Government policy and while ensuring that there is no compromise to the standards to be maintained in imparting the medical education. One of such proposal was sent to the office of the Hon'ble Prime alongwith MCI communication dt. 10.09.08.

In the same direction, the MCI had specifically sent more proposals for further rationalizing the minimum norms in relation to infrastructure teaching and other facilities prescribed by it for imparting postgraduate medical education. These constructive suggestions which has the potential of creation of approximately 5,000 additional PG seats

in the Government medical colleges / institutions, had been submitted to the Ministry of Health, Govt. of India and which has been granted approval. The consequential statutory notifications for implementation of these decisions of the MCI approved by the Govt. of India have also been published in the official gazette in 21.07.09.

The Council has notified following amendments in the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 under clause 12(1)(2), (3) & (4) which was published in the Gazette of India on 24^{th} July, 2009:-

"Clause 12(1)(2) & (3) under the heading number of postgraduate students to be admitted shall be substituted as under:-

- 1. The ratio of recognized postgraduate teacher to the number of students to be admitted for the degree course where diploma is not prescribed shall be 1:2 for a Professor and 1:1 for other cadres in each unit per year subject to a maximum of 4 PG seats for the degree per unit per academic year provided a complement of 10 teaching beds is added to the prescribed bed strength of 30 for the unit for broad specialities.
- 2. The ratio of recognized postgraduate teacher to the number of students to be admitted for the degree course in broad specialities where diploma is prescribed shall be 1:2 for a Professor and 1:1 for other cadres in each unit per year subject to a maximum of 4 PG seats including diploma per unit per academic year provided a complement of 10 teaching beds is added to the prescribed bed strength of 30 for the unit.
- 3. The requirement of units and beds shall not apply in the case of Postgraduate degree or diploma courses in Basic and para-clinical departments.

Provided that against the very same units, teaching personnel and infrastructure, no other postgraduate courses under any other streams like National Board of Examinations, College of Physicians & Surgeons etc. are permitted."

Clause 12 (4) shall be substituted as under:-

"1. The ratio of PG teacher to the number of students to be admitted for super specialities course shall be 1:2 for Professor/Assoc. Professor and 1:1 for remaining cadre in each unit per year subject to a maximum of 4 PG seats for the course per unit per academic year provided the complement of 10 teaching beds per seat is added to the prescribed bed strength of 20 for the unit."

Provided that against the very same units, teaching personnel and infrastructure, no other postgraduate courses under any other streams like National Board of Examinations, College of Physicians & Surgeons etc. are permitted."

This notification has not only been put on the website of the MCI but the copy of this notification dt. 21.07.09 have also been sent by the MCI to all the Govt. medical colleges in the states and the union territories.

In this regard and specifically having regard to the fact that all the Govt. medical colleges / institutions deserve to take immediate necessary action in this direction, it would also deserve to emphasise that there is already in place an earlier notification dt. 15.03.05 making a suitable provision in the Post Graduate Medical Education permitting only the Govt. medical colleges / institutions to treat, to the required extent alone, the consultants working in the government hospitals to be given the status / nomenclature of medical teachers towards the requirement of minimum faculty for conducting any PG medical course. In other words, by the notification dt. 15.03.05 creating a suitable modification in the PG Medical Education Regulation 2000 permits the Govt. medical colleges / institutions to consider the required number of consultants i.e. for the minimum requirement of PG faculty members in relation to the PG courses conducted by them as per the regulations.

All these Govt. medical colleges / institutions are now required to submit their respective applications under the amended regulations immediately for fixation of the permissible annual admission capacity for each of its PG medical course being run by them respectively. The submission of the required applications in accordance with the amended provisions of the regulations through the notification dt. 21.07.09 will thereafter permit the MCI to process all those applications and then to coordinate with the Ministry of Health, Govt. of India for immediately fixing the permissible annual intake for each of the PG medical course in all these government medical colleges/institutions and which, as of today, is expected to bring into existence almost 5,000 additional PG seats.

It was further observed that a letter dated 15.09.2009 has been sent by the office of the Council to the Health Secretaries of all the States with the request to direct the Deans/Principals to send the information as regards availability of Professors in the subjects of broad specialities and availability of Professors & Associate Professors in respect of super-specialities. The copy of the letter was also marked to the DME's of all the States and Secretary to the Govt. of India, MOHFW for information and necessary action.

After due deliberations, the Postgraduate Committee ratified the action taken by the office as mentioned above and further decided that the matter of increasing postgraduate seats in the government medical colleges w.e.f. academic year 2010-11 be taken up in earnest for ensuring that all existing Govt. medical colleges / institutions are mobilized for immediate submission of the information by them for each of their PG medical course and upon submission of such information by the said Govt. institutes, for fixation of the sanctioned annual intake in such Government/Municipal Corporation/University institutes in terms of the latest notification dt. 21.07.09 provided that the courses are recognized by the Council and continue to be recognized and the Council has not recommended to the Central Govt. for withdrawal of recognition u/s 19 of the IMC Act, 1956 or has not issued any show cause notice to the institute for recommending withdrawal of recognition and further provided that so far as preclinical and paraclinical subjects are concerned, the number of seats in courses in these subjects may be recommended as per Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2009 at the starting of the courses also.

83. <u>Rationalization of grant of teaching designation to the specialists working in</u> <u>Govt. Hospitals.</u>

Read: Rationalization of grant of teaching designation to the specialists working in Govt. Hospital.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the matter with regard to rationalization of grant of teaching designation to the specialists working in Govt. Hospital and observed that vide amendment dated 16th March, 2005 of Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000:-

"2. In the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulation, 2000 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulation).

(i) In regulation 11.1 relating to 'staff – Faculty', after clause (c), the following clause shall be inserted, namely:-

"(d) Consultants of specialists who have the experience of working for a period of not less than 18 years and 10 years in the teaching and other general departments in the institution or hospitals, not attached to any medical college, where with the affiliation from any university, postgraduate teaching is being imparted as contemplated under sub-regulation (1A) of regulation 8, shall respectively be eligible to be equated as Professor and Associate Professor in the department concerned. The requisite experience for equating a Consultant or Specialist working in the super-speciality department of the said institution or hospitals as Professor and Associate Professor shall respectively be 16 years and 8 years. Consultants or specialists having postgraduate degree qualification, working in such an institution or hospital, who do not have the said period of experience, shall be eligible to be equated as Assistant Professor in the department concerned."

(ii) In regulation 11.2 relating to 'Minimum requirement for a post graduate institution', after clause (b), the following clause shall be inserted, namely:-

(c) An institution eligible to start postgraduate course(s) under sub-regulation (1A) of regulation 8 may enter into a comprehensive Memorandum of Understanding with an ongoing recognized medical college, located within a reasonable distance from it as would not disrupt the smooth running of the said course(s), for the purpose of availing the facilities of the basic medical sciences departments of the college concerned; or it shall create the requisite facilities in its own set-up as per the guidelines indicated in Appendix-III. In addition, such an institution shall set up full-fledged departments of Pathology, Biochemistry, Microbiology and Radiology".

This was primarily provided with a view to facilitate the conduct of the PG Medical Education in Govt. medical colleges/institutions for augmentation of the capacity in the PG medical seats in the Govt. medical colleges/institutions. In terms of the Clause 11 of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations,2000 as amended on 15.03.05, it had become possible for all the Govt. medical colleges/institutions to consider and treat a few of their consultants as PG medical teachers towards fulfillment of the immediate requirement of PG medical faculty for the number of seats sanctioned as annual intake in each of the PG medical teachers disciplines in those Govt. medical colleges/institutions. It is emphasized that this provision had been made only for the Govt. medical colleges/institutions and also only to the extent of fulfillment of the regulations for minimum required PG medical faculty for the sanctioned number of PG seats only.

The provision of Regulation 11.1 of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 provide that every clinical department or its unit for the training of PG medical seats shall have a minimum of three full time faculty members belonging to the concerned discipline out of whom one shall be a Professor, one Associate Professor/Reader and one Assistant Professor/Lecturer possessing the prescribed medical qualification.

Perusal of the records submitted at the time of inspection of various postgraduate medical institutions, it has been observed that the status of Postgraduate medical teachers are given indiscriminately to all the consultants working in such institutions and not restricted to the number of teachers required commensurate with the permitted annual intake.

After due deliberation the Postgraduate Committee was of the opinion that the provision of this notification of the MCI dt.15.03.05 has been misused by certain entities by conferring the status of PG medical teachers i.e. status of Professor, Addl. Professor, Associate Professor, Asstt. Professor, indiscriminately upon all consultants working in the Govt. hospitals/institutions. In other words, when a particular Govt. Hospital/institution had required only three consultants to be given the nomenclature of PG medical teachers it was observed that every consultant in that Govt. Hospital had been given the status of PG medical teachers it under the notification dt.15.03.05 issued by the MCI.

On account of the above mentioned indiscriminate misutilisation of the provision of the notification dt.15.03.05, this notification has been put under challenge in the court of law and its validity is being questioned by an association of PG medical teachers. It has, thus, become necessary that the Council recommends to the Ministry of Health, Govt. of India for grant of approval for publication of a clarificatory notification whereby and whereunder – in certain and unequivocal terms, the Council to clarify that the provisions

of the notification dt.15.03.05 would be used for conferment of the nomenclature/status of PG medical teachers only to those many number of consultants in any Govt. Hospital/institution so as to fulfill the minimum requirement for imparting PG medical education to the sanctioned annual intake for the Govt. Hospital/institution in every PG medical discipline.

The minutes of this item were read out and confirmed in the meeting itself and it was decided that the decision be sent to the members of the General Body of the Council by circulation immediately for consideration and sending their decision within 10 days.

84. <u>Clarification regarding number of beds to be made available in a unit in case of increase in teacher student ratio from 1:1 to 1:2 for Professor in the subject of broad specialities.</u>

Read: the matter with regard to clarification regarding number of beds to be made available in a unit in case of increase in teacher student ratio from 1:1 to 1:2 for Professor in the subject of broad specialities.

The Postgraduate Committee observed that vide the notification dated 21^{st} July, 2009, the Council had notified the following amendments in the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 under Clause 12 (1),(2) &(3) as under:-

"Clause 12(1)(2) & (3) under the heading number of postgraduate students to be admitted shall be substituted as under:-

- 1. The ratio of recognized postgraduate teacher to the number of students to be admitted for the degree course where diploma is not prescribed shall be 1:2 for a Professor and 1:1 for other cadres in each unit per year subject to a maximum of 4 PG seats for the degree per unit per academic year provided a complement of 10 teaching beds is added to the prescribed bed strength of 30 for the unit for broad specialities.
- 2. The ratio of recognized postgraduate teacher to the number of students to be admitted for the degree course in broad specialities where diploma is prescribed shall be 1:2 for a Professor and 1:1 for other cadres in each unit per year subject to a maximum of 4 PG seats including diploma per unit per academic year provided a complement of 10 teaching beds is added to the prescribed bed strength of 30 for the unit.
- 3. The requirement of units and beds shall not apply in the case of Postgraduate degree or diploma courses in Basic and para-clinical departments.

Provided that against the very same units, teaching personnel and infrastructure, no other postgraduate courses under any other streams like National Board of Examinations, College of Physicians & Surgeons etc. are permitted."

The office of the Council has received a query that whether bed strength in a unit has to be increased to 40 even in those cases wherein the number of postgraduate seats in a unit, even after allocation in the ratio 1:2 for Professor does not result in more than 3 seats in that unit.

The Postgraduate Committee after due and detailed deliberations; decided that the additional complement of 10 beds in the unit is to be made applicable only when the allocation by higher teacher student ratio 1:2 results in awarding 4 postgraduate seats in degree and diploma courses in the unit, further clarifying that the strength of 30 beds per unit as prescribed in the present Regulations will be considered adequate upto total 3 postgraduate seats in degree/diploma courses.

The minutes of this item were read out and confirmed in the meeting itself and it was decided that the decision be sent to the members of the General Body of the Council by circulation immediately for consideration and sending their decision within 10 days.

85. <u>Clarification regarding number of beds to be made available in a unit in case of increase in teacher student ratio from 1:1 to 1:2 for Professor/Associate Professor in the subjects of super-specialities.</u>

Read: the matter with regard to clarification regarding number of beds to be made available in a unit in case of increase in teacher student ratio from 1:1 to 1:2 for Professor/Associate Professor in the subjects of super-specialities.

The Postgraduate Committee observed that vide the notification dated 21st July, 2009, the Council had notified the following amendments in the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 under Clause 12 (4) as under:-

"1. The ratio of PG teacher to the number of students to be admitted for super specialities course shall be 1:2 for Professor/Assoc. Professor and 1:1 for remaining cadre in each unit per year subject to a maximum of 4 PG seats for the course per unit per academic year provided the complement of 10 teaching beds per seat is added to the prescribed bed strength of 20 for the unit."

Provided that against the very same units, teaching personnel and infrastructure, no other postgraduate courses under any other streams like National Board of Examinations, College of Physicians & Surgeons etc. are permitted."

The office of the Council has received a query that whether bed strength in a unit has to be increased to 40 even in those cases wherein the number of postgraduate seats in a unit, even after allocation in the ratio 1:2 for Professor does not result in more than 2 seats in that unit.

The Postgraduate Committee after due and detailed deliberations; decided that the additional complement of 10 beds per seat in the unit is to be made applicable only when the allocation by higher teacher student ratio 1:2 results in awarding 3 or more postgraduate seats in D.M./M.Ch. courses in the unit, further clarifying that the strength of 20 beds per unit as prescribed in the present Regulations will be considered adequate upto total 2 postgraduate seats in D.M./M.Ch. courses.

The minutes of this item were read out and confirmed in the meeting itself and it was decided that the decision be sent to the members of the General Body of the Council by circulation immediately for consideration and sending their decision within 10 days.

86. <u>Weightage in the entrance marks for postgraduate courses to be given to the doctors serving in rural area.</u>

Read: the matter with regard to Weightage in the entrance marks for postgraduate courses to be given to the doctors serving in rural area.

The Postgraduate Committee observed that vide the notification dated 21st July, 2009, the Council had notified the following amendments in the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 under Clause 9 (1)(b) as under:-

"…

(b) 50% of the seats in Post Graduate Diploma courses shall be reserved for Medical Officers in the Government service, who have served for at least three years in

remote and difficult areas. After acquiring the PG Diploma, the Medical Officers shall serve for two more years in remote and/or difficult areas.

It was further observed that at the meeting chaired by the Hon'ble Minister of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India with the Medical Council of India office bearers and officials with regard to the amendments of the MCI Regulations on 19.08.2009, it was agreed that the weightage in entrance marks for postgraduate courses may be given as an incentive at the rate of 10% of the marks obtained for each year upto the maximum of 30% as it was felt that some incentive has to be given to the doctors who are serving in such remote and/or difficult areas.

After due and detailed deliberations, the members of the Postgraduate Committee concurred with above and decided that the following proviso may be added to Clause 9(2) under the head "Selection of Postgraduate Students" to give effect to the consensus arrived at the above meeting:-

"…

..."

Further provided that in determining the merit and the entrance test for postgraduate admission weightage in the marks may be given as an incentive at the rate of 10% of the marks obtained for each year in service in remote or difficult areas upto the maximum of 30% of the marks obtained".

The minutes of this item were read out and confirmed in the meeting itself and it was decided that the decision be sent to the members of the General Body of the Council by circulation immediately for consideration and sending their decision within 10 days.
