1. <u>Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education</u> <u>Committee – confirmation of.</u>

The minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 14th May, 2015 were confirmed in the meeting itself.

2. <u>Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee</u> <u>– action taken thereon.</u>

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted & approved the action taken on the minutes of the previous meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee resolved that the appointed Assessor should submit the compliance verification assessment report only in prescribed SAF. Otherwise, it will not be considered. The SAF can be downloaded from the official website of MCI i.e. mciindia.org.

The Principal, J.J.M. Medical College, Davangere, Karnataka appeared in person before the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee alongwith Dr. Guru Prasad, Prof. & Head, Neonatology, Dr. R.C. Ashwini, Asstt.Prof., Neonatology and Mr. Sampanna, Coordinator and explained their position.

The Officiating Dean of Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College, Pune appeared in person before the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee alongwith Dr. Manas Behera, Prof. & HOD, Paediatrics and Dr. Parag Kalkar, Director, Sinhgad Institute and explained their position for consideration of Postgraduate Committee.

3. <u>Annamalai University, Annamalainagar - Recognition of MD (Pathology)</u> <u>qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats in respect of students</u> <u>being trained at Rajah Muthiah Medical College, Annamalainagar.</u>

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (28.05.2014) and compliance dated 23.01.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD (Pathology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats at Rajah Muthiah Medical College, Annamalainagar granted by Annamalai University, Annamalainagar.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (28.05.2014) alongwith the compliance dated 23.01.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify the compliance by way of assessment.

4. <u>Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur - Recognition of MD (DVL)</u> <u>qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats in respect of students</u> <u>being trained at R.N.T. Medical College, Udaipur.</u>

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2014) and compliance dated 12.02.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD (DVL) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats at R.N.T. Medical College, Udaipur granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2014) alongwith compliance dated 12.02.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided not to recommend for recognition of MD (DVL) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at R N T Medical College, Udaipur, Rajasthan because of the following facts:-

- 1. Unit-B has only 01Assistant Professor. Hence, it cannot be considered as teaching Unit.
- 2. Bed Occupancy 57% which is less than required.
- 3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The seats were permitted in 2011 and still not recognized.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee is of the considered opinion that the failure on the part of your Institution to timely rectify the deficiencies show that the standard of Postgraduate medical education is not maintained in your Institute and therefore, you are called upon to submit the reply as to why directions for stoppage of admissions in Postgraduate Courses MD (DVL)) be not issued from academic year 2015-2016.

The reply to this Show-Cause must reach to the office of the Council within a period of 15 days from the issue of the Notice failing which the Council may decide the matter on the basis of available material.

5. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. - Recognition of MD (Microbiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Guntur Medical College, Guntur.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2013) and compliance dated 03.02.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD (Microbiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats at Guntur Medical College, Guntur granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P..

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2013) alongwith compliance dated 03.02.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify the compliance by way of assessment.

6. <u>Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, New Delhi - Recognition of MS</u> (Orthopeaedices) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 06 seats in respect of students being trained at Postgraduate Institute of Medical Education and Research, Dr. R. M. L. Hospital, New Delhi.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (April, 2014) along with Council Assessor's Report (April, 2013) and compliance dated 26.03.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS (Orthopeaedices) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 06 seats at Postgraduate Institute of Medical Education and Research, Dr. R. M. L. Hospital, New Delhi granted by Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, New Delhi.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (April, 2014) along with Council Assessor's Report (April, 2013) alongwith compliance dated 26.03.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS (Orthopeaedices) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 06 seats granted by Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, New Delhi in respect of Postgraduate Institute of Medical Education and Research, Dr. R. M. L. Hospital, New Delhi be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of notification upon which the institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course.

7. <u>Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Renewal of DCP</u> <u>qualification for 4 seats in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical</u> <u>College, Miraj.</u>

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014) and compliance dated 04.02.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of DCP qualification for 4 seats at Govt. Medical College, Miraj granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014) alongwith compliance dated 04.02.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided not to recommend for renewal of recognition of DCP qualification granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Miraj because of the following facts:-

All deficiencies pointed out earlier stay as such i.e.

- 1. Blood component facility is not available.
- 2. Blood bank is not available in the institute. It is in Civil Hospital, Sangli, which is 8 kms.away.
- 3. Immunohistochemistry is not available.
- 4. Central research laboratory is not available.
- 5. Coagulometer is not available.
- 6. Annual specimens processed for Surgical Pathology have decreased from 5,647 in 2011 to 5, 229 in 2013.
- 7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned seats. As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (27.11.2014) along with Council Assessor's Report (May, 2011) and compliance dated 30.03.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided not to recommend recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification granted by Santosh University in respect of students being trained at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad because of the following facts:-

- (i) As per Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000; sub-clause 13.3; Amendment dated 20/10/2008, which is on MCI website, Postgraduate Degree/ Diploma/ Super-Speciality Course students shall be paid stipend at par with the stipend being paid to the Postgraduate students of State Government Medical Institutions/ Central Government Medical Institutions in the State/ Union Territory, where the Teaching Institution be located. The Institution is not willing to pay any stipend.
- (ii) There is no postmortem permission and no medico-legal work is done without which the training of students is incomplete.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014) and compliance dated 31.03.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD (General Medicine) qualification for 02 seats at Sri Gokulam Medical College Trust & Research Foundation, Trivandrum, Kerala granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2013) alongwith compliance dated 30.03.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided not to recommend recognition of MD(Radio-Therapy) qualification granted by Srimantha Sankardeva University of Health Sciences, Assam in respect of students being trained at Assam Medical College, Dibrugarh because of the following facts:-

- (i) Unit has only 02 faculties; hence it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
- (ii) There are no publication from the department.
- (iii) Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The college authorities did not pay the compliance fee but continued to admit students. However, there are still deficiency of 05 Senior Residents (04 available against the requirement of 09). The college authorities are not ready to pay stipend as per Regulation under the plea that there was no such condition imposed in Letter of Permission. However, as per Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000; subclause 13.3; Amendment dated 20/10/2008, which is available on the MCI official website i.e. mciindia.org. It is mandatory for the college authorities to pay stipend to Postgraduate students at par with the stipend paid in Govt. college in that state.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee is of the considered opinion that the failure on the part of your Institution to timely rectify the deficiencies show that the standard of Postgraduate medical education is not maintained in your Institute and therefore decided to recommend to the Central Government to stop admissions in DA course with immediate effect.

54. <u>Saurashtra University, University Road, Rajkot - Recognition of DGO</u> <u>qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at C.U.Shah</u> <u>Medical College & Hospital, Surendranagar.</u>

Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of notification upon which the institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course.

68. <u>Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of DM</u> (Cardiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats in respect of students being trained at Topiwala National Medical College, Mumbai.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2014) and compliance dated 04.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM (Cardiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats at Topiwala National Medical College, Mumbai granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (August, 2014) alongwith compliance dated 04.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to carry out fresh assessment at the time of next examination.

69. <u>Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Tirupati</u> - Recognition of DM (Neurology) qualification against increased intake from 01 (One) to 03 (Three) seat in respect of students being trained at Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09.02.2015) along with Council Assessor's Report (July, 2013) and compliance dated 13.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM (Neurology) qualification against increased intake from 01 (One) to 03 (Three) seat at Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati granted by Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Tirupati.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09.02.2015) along with Council Assessor's Report (July, 2013) and compliance dated 13.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following facts:-

(i) Experience details of Dr. K. Satya Rao, Prof. & HOD as given in his declaration forms and SAF do not tally with the experience details supplied with the compliance.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to obtain experience certificate issued by competent authority (in all designations and subject) in case of Dr. K. Satya Rao, Prof. & HOD.

70. <u>PT. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak - Recognition of M.Ch</u> (Cardiac Thoracic Surgery) qualifications for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Pt. B D Sharma Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Rohtak (Haryana).

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014) and compliance dated 29.01.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of M.Ch (Cardiac Thoracic Surgery) qualifications for 02 seats at Pt. B D Sharma Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Rohtak (Haryana) granted by PT. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014) alongwith compliance dated 29.01.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided not to recommend recognition of M.Ch (Cardiac Thoracic Surgery) qualifications for 02 (Two) seats granted by PT. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak in respect of students being trained at Pt. B D Sharma Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Rohtak, Haryana because of the following facts:-

- 1. There is no Asso. Prof. in the department. Dr. Sunil Sharma might be eligible but he has not been promoted as Associate Professor.
- 2. Explanation given by college authorities about less number of open heart surgeries is not tenable and cannot be accepted. Deficiency remains as it is.
- 3. There are no Senior Residents.
- 4. Dr. Dheer, Asst. Professor is absent since April, 2007. Consequently, there are only 2 faculty in the department, which is not as per Regulations.
- 5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned seats. As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

71. <u>Santosh University, Ghaziabad - Recognition of MD (Pharmacology)</u> <u>qualification for 3 seats in respect of students being trained at Santosh</u> <u>Medical College, Ghaziabad.</u>

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (December, 2014) along with Council Assessor's Report (May, 2011) and compliance dated 30.03.2015 submitted

by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD (Pharmacology) qualification for 3 seats at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad granted by Santosh University, Ghaziabad.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (December, 2014) along with Council Assessor's Report (May, 2011) and compliance dated 30.03.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided not to recommend recognition of MD(Pharmacology) qualification for 3 seats granted by Santosh University, Ghaziabad in respect of students being trained at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad because of the following facts:-

- (i) As per Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000; sub-clause 13.3; Amendment dated 20/10/2008, which is on MCI website, Postgraduate Degree/ Diploma/ Super-Speciality Course students shall be paid stipend at par with the stipend being paid to the Postgraduate students of State Government Medical Institutions/ Central Government Medical Institutions in the State/ Union Territory, where the Teaching Institution be located. The Institution is not willing to pay any stipend.
- (ii) Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The seats were sanctioned in the year 2008 and first assessment was carried out in 2011 which was rejected by the then Board of Governors. The college authorities did not submit any compliance till 22.03.2014 (2 ½ year) and continue to admit students. The compliance submitted by the college authorities is not satisfactory. The college authorities are not ready to pay stipend as per Regulation under the plea that there was no such condition imposed in Letter of Permission. However, as per Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000; sub-clause 13.3; Amendment dated 20/10/2008, which is available on the MCI official website i.e. mciindia.org. It is mandatory for the college authorities to pay stipend to Postgraduate students at par with the stipend paid in Govt. college in that state.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee is of the considered opinion that the failure on the part of your Institution to timely rectify the deficiencies show that the standard of Postgraduate medical education is not maintained in your Institute and therefore the Postgraduate Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government, Ministry of Health & F.W., to stop admissions in MD (Pharmacology) with immediate effect.

72. <u>Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of MS</u> (OBG) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at KJ Somaiyya Medical College & Research Centre, Mumbai.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (December, 2014) along with Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014) and compliance dated 31.03.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS (OBG) qualification for 02 seats at KJ Somaiyya Medical College & Research Centre, Mumbai granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (December, 2014) along with Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014) and compliance dated 31.03.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify the compliance by way of assessment.

73. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of MD (DVL) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 05 seats in respect of students being trained at Bangalore Medical College and Research Institute, Bangalore.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014) and compliance dated 08.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD (DVL) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 05 seats at Bangalore Medical College and Research Institute, Bangalore granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014) alongwith compliance dated 08.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend that MD(DVL) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 05 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Bangalore Medical College and Research Institute, Bangalore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of notification upon which the institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course.

74. <u>NITTE University, Bangalore/ Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences,</u> <u>Bangalore - Recognition of MD (Community Medicine) qualification for 04</u> <u>seats in respect of students being trained at K S Hegde Medical Academy,</u> <u>Mangalore.</u>

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014) and compliance dated 07.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD (Community Medicine) qualification for 04 seats at K S Hegde Medical Academy, Mangalore granted by NITTE University, Bangalore/ Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014) alongwith compliance dated 07.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend that MD (Community Medicine) qualification for 04 seats granted by NITTE University, Bangalore/ Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at K S Hegde Medical Academy, Mangalore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of notification upon which the institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course.

75. <u>H. N. B Garhwal University, Uttarakhand - Recognition of MD - Forensic</u> <u>Medicine/Forensic Medicine & Toxicology qualification for 02 seats in respect</u> <u>of students being trained at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical & Health</u> <u>Sciences, Dehradun.</u>

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) and compliance dated 06.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD - Forensic Medicine/Forensic Medicine

& Toxicology qualification for 02 seats at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical & Health Sciences, Dehradun granted by H. N. B Garhwal University, Uttarakhand.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) alongwith compliance dated 06.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided not to recommend recognition of MD - Forensic Medicine/Forensic Medicine & Toxicology qualification for 02 seats granted by H. N. B Garhwal University, Uttarakhand in respect of students being trained at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical & Health Sciences, Dehradun because of the following facts:-

- 1. The institution is not having permission to conduct postmortem and other medico-legal work without which the training of students is incomplete.
- 2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In case, the College Authorities desire to submit compliance, the same should be received in this office within 6 weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course against the above mentioned seats. As per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 (and stipulated in LoP) failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

76. Bharath University, Chennai - Recognition of MD/MS (OBG) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 08 seats in respect of students being trained at Sree Balaji Medical College & Hospital, Chennai.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2014) and compliance dated 07.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD/MS (OBG) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 08 seats at Sree Balaji Medical College & Hospital, Chennai granted by Bharath University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2014) alongwith compliance dated 07.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend that MD/MS (OBG) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 08 seats granted by Bharath University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Sree Balaji Medical College & Hospital, Chennai be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of notification upon which the institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course.

77. <u>Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of MD</u> (Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 07 to 09 seats in respect of students being trained at Topiwala National Medical College, Mumbai.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2014) and compliance dated 30.03.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for recognition of MD (Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 07 to 09 seats at Topiwala National Medical College, Mumbai granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2014) alongwith compliance dated 30.03.2015 submitted by the

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college authorities and decided not to recommend recognition of MD(Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 07 to 09 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Topiwala National Medical College, Mumbai because of the followings:-

All deficiencies pointed out earlier stay as such i.e.

- 1. There are no Journals of Community Medicine
- 2. There is neither any staff nor any work in Central Research Lab.
- 3. MRD is partly computerized.
- 4. There is no residential accommodation at RHTC.
- 5. No Medical Officers against the requirement of 2.
- 6. No Lady Medical Officers against the requirement of 2.
- 7. No Tutors against the requirement of 4.
- 8. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

The seats were permitted in 2010-11 and still not recognized.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee is of the considered opinion that the failure on the part of your Institution to timely rectify the deficiencies show that the standard of Postgraduate medical education is not maintained in your Institute and therefore, you are called upon to submit the reply as to why directions for stoppage of admissions in Postgraduate Courses MD (Community Medicine) be not issued from academic year 2015-2016.

The reply to this Show-Cause must reach to the office of the Council within a period of 15 days from the issue of the Notice failing which the Council may decide the matter on the basis of available material.

78. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. - Renewal of recognition of MD (Psychiatry) qualification & DPM qualification for 01 seat each in respect of students being trained at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) and compliance dated 08.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of of recognition of MD (Psychiatry) qualification & DPM qualification for 01 seat each at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P..

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (November, 2014) alongwith compliance dated 08.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided not to recommend renewal of recognition of MD(Psychiatry) qualification & DPM qualification for 01 seat each granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. in respect of students being trained at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad because of the following facts:-

- 1. 56 daily OPD is adequate for start of PG course but not after 07 years; hence the deficiency remains as such.
- 2. Promotion of Dr. Arrifuddin Ahmad is not as per Regulations. He has experience of Asstt. Prof. for 04 years without any publication. Hence he cannot be considered as Assoc. Prof. Resultantly, there is a deficiency of one Assoc. Prof. in the department.
- 3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

79. Bharath University, Chennai - Recognition of MD (Physiology) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Sri Lakshmi Narayana Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2014) and compliance dated 08.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD (Physiology) qualification for 01 seat at Sri Lakshmi Narayana Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry granted by Bharath University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2014) alongwith compliance dated 08.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to defer the matter as the college authorities has not submitted any compliance alongwith forwarding letter. The college authorities be asked to submit the compliance within 02 weeks.

80. <u>Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of MD</u> (Tuberculosis & Respiratory Diseases/Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Dr. Vasantarao Pawar Medical College & Research Centre, Nasik.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (19.02.2015) along with Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014) and compliance dated 24.03.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD (Tuberculosis & Respiratory Diseases/Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 02 seats at Dr. Vasantarao Pawar Medical College & Research Centre, Nasik granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (19.02.2015) along with Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014) and compliance dated 24.03.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify the compliance by way of assessment.

81. <u>Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of MS</u> (General Surgery) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Maharashtra Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Latur.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014) and compliance dated 31.03.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS (General Surgery) qualification for 1 seat at Maharashtra Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Latur granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2014) alongwith compliance dated 31.03.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS (General Surgery) qualification for 01 seat granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Maharashtra Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Latur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of notification upon which the institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course.

82. <u>Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of MD</u> (Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 02 (Two) to 03 (Three) seats in respect of students being trained at Indira Gandhi Medical College & Hospital, Nagpur.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2013) and compliance dated 08.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD (Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 02 (Two) to 03 (Three) seats at Indira Gandhi Medical College & Hospital, Nagpur granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2013) alongwith compliance dated 08.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to verify the compliance by way of assessment.

83. <u>Santosh University, Ghaziabad - Recognition of MD (Pathology) & DCP in</u> respect of students being trained at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (27.11.2014) along with Council Assessor's Report (May, 2011) and compliance dated 30.03.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD (Pathology) & DCP at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad granted by Santosh University, Ghaziabad.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (27.11.2014) along with Council Assessor's Report (May, 2011) and compliance dated 30.03.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided not to recommend recognition of MD(Pathology) & DCP qualification granted by Santosh University in respect of students being trained at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad because of the following facts:-

All deficiencies pointed out earlier stay as such i.e. 1 to 4:

- 1. Stipend paid by the Teaching Institute to I/II/III year Residents is Rs. 14,000 p.m.; Rs. 15, 000 p.m. & Rs. 16, 000 p.m. respectively, which is less than that paid by Govt. of U.P. to Residents and contrary to Section 13(3) of PG Medical Education Regulations, 2000 as amended.
- 2. Investigation workload continues to remain inadequate. Deficiency remains as not corrected.
- Average daily consumption of blood Units for the whole hospital is only 6 Units, which is inadequate. Data of blood Units consumed given on Page 9 (3-5) and on Page 18 (6) do not match. Deficiency remains as not corrected.
- 4. No Pathological postmortems are performed.
- 5. Promotion of Dr. Prachi Kumar, Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations. She has been Asst. Professor for 4 years 8 months against the requirement of 5 years without any publication. Her publications are after 2012 whereas she was promoted in 2011. Hence, she cannot be considered as Asstt. Professor.
- 6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Seats were permitted in 2007-08 and first assessment was held in 2011. The then Board of Governors rejected the request. The college authorities submitted first compliance on 13.05.2014 i.e. after 2 ½ years but continued to admit students. The present compliance is not satisfactory for reasons mentioned above. The college authorities are not ready to pay stipend as per Regulation under the plea that there was no such condition imposed in Letter of Permission. However, as per Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000; sub-clause 13.3; Amendment dated 20/10/2008, which is available on the MCI official website i.e. mciindia.org. It is mandatory for the college authorities to pay stipend to Postgraduate students at par with the stipend paid in Govt. college in that state.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government to stop admission in MD(Pathology) & DCP qualification granted by Santosh University in respect of students being trained at Santosh Medical College, Ghaziabad.

84. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh -Recognition of DLO qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Narayana Medical College, Nellore.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2011) and compliance dated 16.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DLO qualification for 01 seat at Narayana Medical College, Nellore granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2011) alongwith compliance dated 16.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that DLO qualification for 01 (One) seat granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of one students admitted in 2007-08, one student admitted in 2009-10, one student admitted in 2010-11(the course has been discontinued after that) at Narayana Medical College, Nellore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of notification upon which the institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course.

85. <u>Kerala University of Health Sciences - Recognition MS (OBG) qualification for</u> 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Sri Gokulam Medical College Trust & Research Foundation, Trivandrum, Kerala.

- 6. There is no place for museum in the department. Space is allocated in Ward 5; however, specimens are borrowed from Anatomy/Pathology as and when required.
- 7. Instruments like USG machine, Colposcope & Hysteroscope are not in working order.
- 8. Services like Prenatal diagnosis are not available.
- 9. Academic parameters like Clinical seminar (only 4), Journal Club (only 6), Case presentation (only 8), Group Discussions (10 in number) are grossly inadequate.
- 10. On the day of Assessment OPD 63, Major Operations 2, Minor Operations 2, Caesarean Section 2, which is grossly inadequate.
- 11. There is a decline in OPD, IPD, Major Operations & Minor Operations and deliveries from 2012 to 2013.
- 12. No experience, details of many staff members has been given in Faculty Table (Page 2).
- 13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The seats were permitted in 2010 and still not recognized.

169. SLP(C) No. 15084/2015 – Medical Council of India Vs. Kashibai Navale Medical College and Hospital & Ors.

Read: SLP(C) No. 15084/2015 – Medical Council of India Vs. Kashibai Navale Medical College and Hospital & Ors.

1. This decision is being made in pursuance of the order dated 8.5.2015 of the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay in the following writ petitions: WP Nos. 3707 of 2015; 3708 of 2015; 3709 of 2015; 3710 of 2015; 3711 of 2015; 3712 of 2015; 3713 of 2015; 3714 of 2015; 3715 of 2015; 3716 of 2015; 3717 of 2015; 3718 of 2015.

2. The abovementioned writs were filed by Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College & Hospital aggrieved by the decision of the Central Govt. as well as Post-Graduate Medical Education Committee of the Council (hereinafter PG Committee) in respect of their applications for starting/ increase in admission capacity in twelve postgraduate medical courses for the Academic Year 2015-16.

3. The Council had preferred Special Leave Petition against the aforesaid order dated 08.05.2015 of the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay in WP No. 3707 of 2015. This matter pertained to recommendation of the Council in respect of the application of the starting of MD (Psychiatry) course. The Special Leave Petition (C) No. 15084 of 2015 came to disposed of on 15.05.15, while 11 SLP preferred by the Council are pending before the Hon'ble Apex Court.

4. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee while making its recommendation for starting/increase of seats for any postgraduate course in modern medicine makes its recommendation as per the provisions of Section 10A of the IMC Act, 1956, the Opening of a New or Higher Course of Study or Training (including Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) and Increase of Admission Capacity in any Course of Study or Training (including a Postgraduate Course of Study or Training) Regulations, 2000 and the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000. Every medical college conducting postgraduate courses have been permitted to admit students as per the approved intake in view of the requisite infrastructure, teaching faculty and other physical facilities including clinical material available in the said medical college. In case, if the availability of teaching faculty, clinical material and other physical facilities including clinical material is not sufficient for every student of the

higher / specialized medical courses, the same shall have an adverse effect on the quality of teaching and training available in the medical college. Therefore the intake capacity of a particular medical college cannot be decided ignoring the clinical material, teaching faculty and other physical infrastructural facilities available at the applicant medical college, since the same shall have an adverse effect on the quality of teaching and training available in the medical college.

5. The PG Committee after the scrutiny of applications calls for an assessment of the facilities of the concerned Postgraduate Department of a Medical College. The Assessment is conducted by a Professor of the concerned subject serving in a Government Medical College for an on-the spot assessment of clinical material, physical and human resources, and other facilities in the Medical College. The PG Committee considers the application alongwith the Assessment Report which provides the Committee with an insight as to the requirement of faculty, staff, infrastructure, equipment and other facilities available in the Medical College. The Committee also examines the operative workload, clinical material and generally considers all the applications of a College in respect of postgraduate courses collectively, so as to ensure that a comprehensive assessment is made as to the aforesaid requirements along with the pathological data, death rate, birth rate, blood consumption, nature of surgeries performed and type of patients admitted, so as to arrive at a conclusion and make its recommendations in respect of a particular number of seats. Unit wise fulfillment of faculty norms and simple count of patients are not the only criteria for making its positive or negative or partial recommendations as to the application of a College in respect of postgraduate seats. The Postgraduate Committee makes a comprehensive assessment keeping in mind whether each postgraduate student admitted in the Medical College will get the required training to handle and treat simple as well as complicated and emergency cases related to his specialty before arriving at its final considered decision and making their recommendations.

An opportunity is afforded to the College by way of Compliance Report regarding the recommendations of the Committee. The PG Committee is also conscious of the fact that the Medical College is entitled to run a postgraduate course only if it fulfills the relevant Minimum Standard Requirement Regulations for Annual Intake in respect of Undergraduate courses.

7. The aforesaid writ petitions were disposed of by 3 separate orders on 08.05.2015 by the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay.

8. The Postgraduate Committee in pursuance of the Order dated 08.05.15 of the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay in WP (C) No. 3707/2015 and 15.05.15 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in SLP (C) No. 15084/2015 granted hearing to the representatives of College Authorities in its meeting held on 26.05.15. During the course of hearing submissions on behalf of the College were tendered by Dr. P.S. Chawla, Officiating Dean, Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College, Pune; Dr. Manas Behera, Professor & HOD, Department of Pediatrics, Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College, Pune and Dr. Parag Kalkar, Director, Singhad Institute.

9. The Postgraduate Committee carefully scrutinized the collateral evidences which show the quality of Clinical material, which is more important than mere numbers of patients or infrastructure/equipments available for training of students. Needless to mention that the prime objective of the Council is to maintain Standard of Medical Education and to ensure that Postgraduate students get training not only to handle patients with minor ailments but also complicated cases suffering from serious medical/surgical problems and polytrauma.

10. The following Deficiencies (in addition to those listed in each subject at the time of disapproval of scheme) were observed.

11. In the Department of Anesthesia the Assessor's report mentioned that on the day of inspection 23 major, 12 minor and 3 caesarian section were done and same is the average of daily major operations of last 3 years. The report further points out that on an average one unit of Blood and one unit of FFA was used daily in Anesthesia department. The report further provides that only 2 specimens were sent for histopathology examination on inspection day. From this, it is amply clear that operations could not be major operations because surgeries on patients of Cancer, polytrauma, obstructed labour, gut resections etc. require lot of blood transfusions during prolonged surgeries. Further, the fact that only two specimens were sent for histopathological examination simply shows that operations must have been done for minor ailments. Otherwise almost every organ removed (like thyroid, intestines, uterus even appendix) are sent for histopathological examination. Training in this type of surgeries will be grossly inadequate for Postgraduate students who are going to become specialists in their subjects.

The Postgraduate Committee further observed that even the number of these so called major operations had decreased for 2012 to 2013 and there is almost no increase in 2014.

The College had already been permitted two seats in the specialty of Anesthesia and Postgraduate Committee found no justification for any increase in the Department of Anesthesia. The college authority had requested for increase of seats from 2 to 21 per year which by no stretch and imagination could be justified.

12. The 2nd most important observations made by the Postgraduate Committee was the number of important investigations done daily in the entire hospital which are most vital parameter for diagnosing/staging of various serious diseases.

The following were the investigations done in the entire hospital on the days of inspections of different subjects.

These figures do not support the data provided by college authorities that there were 3919 MRI in 2013 and 2876 in 2014.

6-7 MRI per day are done in any one major department of a busy tertiary care teaching hospital, But here 5-6 MRI per day are alone in entire hospital. This simply conveys that Clinical materials in either non-genuine or only patients with minor ailments are there to satisfy the requirement of numbers.

3. The other most important observations made by the Postgraduate Committee was about the daily blood units used in different departments and the entire hospital and the details are as below:

The OBG Assessor specifically checked the Blood issuing Registrar of 5 Days and reported that 54 units were issued to Different departments in 5 days which means average consumption of 11 units of blood in entire hospital. This number is too low and simply indicating that no major surgeries were done otherwise 10 units may be daily requirement in department of orthopedics alone. The college authorities have reported in some of the reports that 752 units of blood was stocked in the blood bank. In case if we go by the above mentioned daily consumption then 754 units will be used in 70 days which is not the shelf life of blood. The Data is blatantly non-genuine and cannot be believed.

4. The most important collateral evidence of clinical material is death rate(which usually cannot be escalated. In any busy tertiary care teaching hospital average death rate is 5-7%. In the present case the death rate of entire hospital in different departments (2013) is as under:

The death rate of all departments are very low. The above data leave nothing to doubt that the patients admitted were with minor ailments and there were no patients with major illnesses or serious emergency or polytrauma. This type of clinical material is not adequate for the training of P.G. students. They will have no exposure in major illnesses or emergencies and there is a requirement of training of P.G. students in all aspects including major illnesses and emergencies.

All these collateral evidence were considered by the Postgraduate Committee while deciding the applications of the applicant college under reference.

4. The P.G. committee had noted that in the department of ENT:

(i) Total number of Major and minor operations for the year 2012, 2013 and 2014 is almost three times the total IPD (number of patients admitted) of corresponding years which is not possible. Even if we take that some of the minor surgeries might be day care still the number of surgeries cannot be almost three times the number of IPD. There are always some cases admitted who do not require surgery.

(ii) Histopathology was one per day from 2011 till 2015 which means the department is hardly doing head & neck surgery. One histopathology per day will be Biopsy from Nodules like vocal cards.

(iii) The department had done 1-7 per year oesothagoscopy which simply indicate that there were no cases of dysphasia, foreign Body oesothagus which are very common ENT problems.

(iv) Death rate of the department was 0.05% and blood used in the department was 2 units in a month, which again indicate that hardly any malignancy cases were admitted/ operated because there is bound to be some mortality in these cases and these cases will always require some blood transfusion.

(v) The daily OPD is the department of ENT decreased from 28418 in 2012 to 27259 in 2013 as 18908 in 2014.

With these general observations, the case of the College in respect of 12 applications submitted by them and the decision of the Postgraduate Committee in respect of each subjects is as under:

I. Application for the starting of MD Psychiatry course with an annual intake of three (03) seats from the academic year 2015-16.

An application was made by Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and Hospital, Pune for the starting of MD (Psychiatry) course with an annual intake of 3 admissions per year from the academic session 2015-16. The aforementioned scheme / application dated 28.04.2014 was considered by the Postgraduate Committee of the Council wherein it was decided to carry out physical assessment of the medical college. Accordingly, for verification of the availability of clinical material, infrastructural and other physical facilities at the medical college the physical assessment of the applicant medical college was carried out by the MCI's assessors on 26.09.2014. The assessment report dated 26.09.2014 was placed before the Postgraduate Committee of the Council in its meeting held on 14.11.2014. The PG Committee of the Council, after considering assessor's report dated 26.09.2014 and in view of available infrastructure and quality of clinical material available in the said medical college, decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to grant its permission to the applicant medical college to admit one M.D. student per year in the speciality of Psychiatry from the academic session 2015-16. The decision of the Postgraduate Committee was communicated to the Central Govt. vide letter dated 19.11.2014.

The Dean / Principal of the applicant medical college forwarded the compliance report dated 06.12.2014 to the MCI, requesting to reconsider the application / scheme of the Medical College for starting of MD (Psychiatry) course from the academic session 2015-16 with an annual intake of 3 admissions per year. The Dean/Principal of the College in his letter dated 06.12.14 inter alia requested for reconsideration of the number of seats permitted to the Institute for MD (Psychiatry) after a review of the infrastructure facilities, faculty position, clinical workload and academic research activities of the Department. The Institute also contended that their department has a good infrastructure facility and faculty which is more than the minimum required as per MCI Regulations. Furthermore, the Institute has stated that clinical work has also increased drastically during the years 2011 to 2014 and their hospital being a charitable hospital provided free services to the population in and around Pune. The documents on which Institute has placed reliance in the Compliance Report dated 06.12.14 are as under:-

The Postgraduate Committee of the Council considered the assessment report dated 26.09.2014 and the compliance report dated 06.12.2014 in its meeting held on 07.01.2015 wherein the Postgraduate Committee after considering the application / scheme of the medical college for starting of MD (Psychiatry) course with 3 seats as well as the assessment report dated 26.09.2014 and in view of the infrastructure, teaching faculty, clinical material and other physical facilities available in the medical college decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to grant its permission to the said medical college to admit one student in MD (Psychiatry) course, from the academic session 2015-16. This decision of the Postgraduate Committee was forwarded to the Central Govt. as well as the medical institute vide letter dated 15.01.2015.

The College authorities aggrieved by the decision of the PG Committee had preferred WP No.3707/2015 before the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay. The Hon'ble High Court was pleased to dispose of the Writ Petition filed by the applicant medical college on 08.05.2015 and directed the MCI to reconsider the case of the applicant medical college and pass a reasoned order. The Council aggrieved by the decision of the Hon'ble Bombay High Court preferred Special Leave Petition No. 15084/2015 before the Hon'ble Supreme Court which came up for hearing before the Hon'ble Supreme Court on 15.05.15. Wherein the Hon'ble Apex Court after hearing the parties vide its order dated 15.05.2015 directed the MCI to comply with the order passed by the Hon'ble Bombay High Court.

The Postgraduate Committee of the Council considered the assessment report dated 26.09.2014 and the compliance report dated 06.12.2014 as well as the oral submissions made by the College Authorities during the course of hearing on 27.05.2015.

The Committee noted that in the department of psychiatry the college authorities stated that OPD increased from 7784 in 2012 to 14071 in 2013 as well as the IPD has increased from 435 in 2012 to 705 in 2013. However, not a single MRI brain was done in the department over a period of one year. Needless to say that MRI brain is a common investigation in Psychiatry patients so as to exclude organic brain problems. Similarly, no patients were given blood transfusion over a period of one year although nutritional problems are common in these patients. Even otherwise as per the information supplied

by college authorities there are 21 persons working in the department and there will be addition of P.G. students. The Daily OPD is about 53 patients which means there will be 2-3 patients for hands on training for each Doctor, which is grossly inadequate. These observations simply indicate that the year-wise data is non-genuine or only patients with minor ailments had been treated in the department. Thus, based upon the aforesaid status the Postgraduate Committee is of the considered view that recommendation for grant of 01 seats against the application for 03 seats for MD (Psychiatry) is in order and does not require any change.

II. Application for the starting of MS (ENT) course with an annual intake of five (05) seats from the academic year 2015-16.

An application was made by Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and Hospital, Pune for the starting of MS (ENT) course with an annual intake of 5 admissions per year from the academic session 2015-16. The aforementioned scheme/application dated 28.04.2014 was considered by the Postgraduate Committee of the Council wherein it was decided to carry out physical assessment of the medical college. Accordingly for verification of the availability of clinical material, infrastructural and other physical facilities at the medical college assessment was carried out by the assessment team of the Council on 26.09.2014. The assessment report dated 26.09.2014 was placed before the Postgraduate Committee of the Council in its meeting held on 14.11.2014. The PG Committee of the Council, after considering Assessor's report dated 26.09.2014 and in view of available infrastructure as well as quantum and quality of clinical material available in the said medical college, decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to grant its permission to the medical college to admit one MS student per year in the speciality of ENT from the academic session 2015-16. The decision of the Postgraduate Committee was communicated to the Central Govt. vide letter dated 19.11.2014.

The Dean / Principal of the applicant medical college forwarded a copy of the compliance report dated 06.12.2014, requesting the Council to reconsider the application / scheme of the Medical College for starting of MS (ENT) course from the academic session 2015-16 with an annual intake of 5 students per year. The Dean/Principal of the College in his letter dated 06.12.14, inter alia, requested for reconsideration of the number of seats permitted to the Institute for MS (ENT) after a review of the infrastructure facilities, faculty position, clinical workload and academic research activities of the Department. The Institute also contended that their department has a good infrastructure facility and faculty which is more than the minimum required as per MCI Regulation. Furthermore, the Institute has stated that clinical work has also increased drastically during the years 2011 to 2014 and their hospital being a charitable hospital provided free services to the population in and around Pune. The documents on which Institute has placed reliance in the Compliance Report dated 06.12.14 are as under:-

- (a) The Institute has referred to relevant pages of the Standard Assessment Form to show that it has the requisite infrastructural facilities with equipment in the department of ENT as well as it is running speciality clinics. (Annexure 1.)
- (b) The Institute has referred to relevant pages of the Standard Assessment Form to show that it has the requisite teaching faculty and non-teaching faculty. (Annexure 2.)
- (c) The Institute has referred to relevant pages of the Standard Assessment Form to show that the clinical workload of the department of ENT is on the rise. (Annexure 3)
- (d) The Institute has referred to relevant pages of the Standard Assessment Form to show it's academic and research activities. (Annexure 4).
- (e) The Institute has also submitted copy of SAF submitted to the Assessor on the day of Inspection, i.e. 26.09.14.

- (f) The Institute has submitted the Department-wise blood unit issue data for the year 2014 and department wise daily consumption of bloods units in the year 2014.
- (g) The Institute has submitted the minutes of its Institutional Ethics Committee of various dates.

The Postgraduate Committee of the Council considered the assessment report dated 26.09.2014 and the compliance report dated 06.12.2014 in its meeting held on 07.01.2015 wherein the Postgraduate Committee after considering the application / scheme of the medical college for starting of MS(ENT) course with 5 seats as well as the assessment report dated 26.09.2014 and in view of the infrastructure, teaching faculty, Quantum and Quality of clinical material and other physical facilities available in the medical college to admit one student in MS(ENT) course, from the academic session 2015-16. This decision of the Postgraduate Committee was forwarded to the Central Govt. as well as the applicant medical institute vide MCI letter dated 15.01.2015.

The College authorities aggrieved by the decision of the PG Committee had preferred WP No.3709/2015 before the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay. The Hon'ble Bombay High Court after hearing the applicant medical college was pleased to dispose of the Petition on 08.05.2015 with the directions to the MCI to reconsider the application of the applicant medical college and pass a reasoned order. The MCI being aggrieved by the directions of the Hon'ble Bombay High Court has preferred a SLP before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India which is pending adjudication.

In the meanwhile the P.G. Committee considered the case of the applicant medical college in pursuance to the directions of the Hon'ble Bombay High Court and on the basis of assessment report, compliance report and the oral submissions made by the college authorities during personal hearing on 27/05/2015 noted that in the department of ENT:

(i) Total number of Major and minor operations for the year 2012, 2013 and 2014 is almost three times the total IPD (number of patients admitted) of corresponding years which is not possible. Even if we take that some of the minor surgeries might be day care still the number of surgeries cannot be almost three times the number of IPD. There are always some patients admitted who do not require any surgery.

(ii) Histopathology specimens sent was one per day from 2011 till 2015 which means the department is hardly doing any major head & neck surgeries. One or two per day are usually simple Biopsies taken and sent for histopathology examination by ENT department in any college.

(iii) The department had done 1-7 per year oesophagoscopy which simply indicate that there were no cases of dysphasia, foreign body oesophagus etc which are very common ENT problems.

(iv) Death rate of the department was 0.05% and blood used in the department was 2 units in a month, which again indicate that hardly any malignancy case were admitted/ operated because there is bound to be some mortality in these cases and there is always needed for some blood transfusion in these cases.

(v) The daily OPD is the department of ENT decreased from 28418 in 2012 to 27259 in 2013 as 18908 in 2014.

In view of the aforesaid, the PG Committee is of the considered view that the recommendation made for the grant of 01 seat in MS (ENT) against the request made by the college for grant of 05 seats is in order and does not require any change.

III. Application for starting of MD (General Medicine) course with an annual intake of Eleven (11) seats from the academic year 2015-16.

An application was made by Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and Hospital, Pune for starting of MD (General Medicine) course with an annual intake of 11 students per year from the academic session 2015-16. The aforementioned scheme/application dated 28.04.2014 was considered by the Postgraduate Committee of the Council and it was decided to carry out physical assessment of the medical college. Accordingly, assessment was carried out on 27.09.2014. The assessment report dated 27.09.2014 was placed before the Postgraduate Committee of the Council in its meeting held on 05.11.2014. The PG Committee of the Council, after considering Assessor's report dated 27.09.2014 and in view of available infrastructure as well as Quantum and Quality of clinical material available in the said medical college, decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to grant its permission to the medical college to admit 04 students in MD (General Medicine) from the academic session 2015-16. The decision of the Postgraduate Committee was communicated to the Central Govt. vide letter dated 08.11.2014.

The Dean / Principal forwarded a copy of the compliance report dated 06.12.2014, requesting the Council to reconsider the application / scheme of the Medical College for starting of MD (General Medicine) course from the academic session 2015-16 with an annual intake of 11 students per year. The Dean/Principal of the College in his letter dated 06.12.14 inter alia requested for reconsideration of the number of seats permitted to the Institute for MD (General Medicine) after a review of the infrastructure facilities, faculty position, clinical workload and academic research activities of the Department. The Institute also contended that their department has a good infrastructure facility and faculty which is more than the minimum required as per MCI Regulations. Further, the Institute has stated that clinical work load has also increased drastically during the years 2011 to 2014 and their hospital being a charitable hospital provided free services to the population in and around Pune.

The Postgraduate Committee of the Council considered the assessment report dated 27.09.2014 and the compliance report dated 06.12.2014 in its meeting held on 07.01.2015 wherein the Postgraduate Committee after considering the application / scheme of the applicant medical college for starting of MD(General Medicine) course with 11 seats as well as the assessment report dated 27.09.2014 and in view of the infrastructure, teaching faculty, Quatum and Quality of clinical material and other physical facilities available in the medical college decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to grant its permission to the applicant medical college to admit four (04) students in MD (General Medicine) course, from the academic session 2015-16. This decision of the Postgraduate Committee was forwarded to the Central Govt. as well as the medical institute vide letter dated 15.01.2015.

The College authorities aggrieved by the decision of the PG Committee had preferred WP No.3711/2015 before the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay. The Hon'ble Bombay High Court after hearing the applicant medical college was pleased to dispose of the Petition on 08.05.2015 with the directions to the MCI to reconsider the application of the applicant medical college and pass a reasoned order. The MCI being aggrieved by the directions of the Hon'ble Bombay High Court has preferred a SLP before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India which is pending adjudication.

The documents on which Institute has placed reliance in the Compliance Report dated 06.12.14 are:-

(a) The Institute has referred to relevant pages of the Standard Assessment Form to show that it has the requisite infrastructural facilities with equipment in the

Department of General Medicine as well as it is running speciality clinics. (Annexure 1.)

- (b) The Institute has referred to relevant pages of the Standard Assessment Form to show that it has the requisite teaching faculty and non-teaching faculty and the number of Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor is shown to be 05, 09 & 07 respectively. Details of non-teaching staff are also mentioned in a table. (Annexure 2.)
- (c) The Institute has referred to relevant pages of the Standard Assessment Form to show that it has the clinical workload of the Department of General Medicine is on the rise. (Annexure 3)
- (d) The Institute has referred to relevant pages of the Standard Assessment Form to show its Academic and Research Activities. (Annexure 4).
- (e) The Institute has also submitted copy of SAF submitted to the Assessor on the day of Inspection, i.e. 27.09.14.
- (f) The Institute has submitted the Department-wise blood unit issue data for the year 2014 and department wise daily consumption of blood unit in the year 2014.
- (g) The Institute has submitted the minutes of its Institutional Ethics Committee of various dates.

The P.G. Committee on the basis of Assessment Report, Compliance verification Report and oral submissions made by the College Authorities during personal hearing on 27/05/2015 noted that in the Department of General Medicine the Data supplied by college authorities indicated some increase in OPD/IPD during the last three years but daily Radiological work load of the department during last three years showed a decline from 77 in 2012 to 63 in 2013 and 61 in 2014. This collateral evidence does not support the Quantum of clinical material. OPD of the year 2014 has been shown as 50978 on page 2 of the report whereas it has been shown as 44389 on page 41 of the report. Similarly IPD of the department for the year 2014 is shown as 4431 on page 2 of the report and 3840 on page 41 of the report. Similarly other clinical parameter of the year 2014 given in table on page 2 and page 41 do not match. Therefore this mismatch data cannot be relied upon.

In view of the aforesaid, the PG Committee of the Council is of the considered view that the recommendation made for the grant of 04 seats in MD (General Medicine) against the request made by the college for grant of 11 seats is in order and does not require any change.

IV. Application for increase of seats in MD (Pulmonary Medicine) course from 1 to 3 from the academic year 2015-16.

An application was made by Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and Hospital, Pune for increase of seats in MD (Pulmonary Medicine) course from 1 to 3 from the academic year 2015-16. The aforementioned scheme/application dated 28.04.2014 was considered by the Postgraduate Committee of the Council wherein it was decided to carry out physical assessment of the medical college. Accordingly assessment was carried out on 26.09.2014. The assessment report dated 26.09.2014 was placed before the Postgraduate Committee of the Council in its meeting held on 05.11.2014. The PG Committee of the Council, after considering Assessor's report dated 26.09.2014, decided to recommend for disapproval of the scheme for increase in seats in MD (Pulmonary Medicine) as 1. HoD was absent on the day of assessment. 2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report. The decision of the Postgraduate Committee was communicated to the Central Govt. vide letter dated 07.11.2014.

The Dean / Principal forwarded a copy of the compliance report dated 18.11.2014, requesting to reconsider the application / scheme of the Medical College for increase in seats from 1 to 3 seats in MD (Pulmonary Medicine) course from the academic session 2015-16. The Dean/Principal of the College in his letter dated 18.11.2014, inter alia, requested for reconsideration of the decision disapproving the

increase in number of seats in MD (Pulmonary Medicine). It was submitted by the Applicant that Dr. Gauri Godbole, Prof. & Head of Pulmonary Medicine was on presanctioned leave to attend the marriage ceremony of her brother. Hence, the mere absence due to pre-sanctioned leave on the day of surprise inspection should not be considered the grounds for disapproval of the proposal for increase in seats. The college also stated that Dr. Godbole, has been continuously working in their applicant college since 03/12/2007 and has attended all the previous inspections conducted by MCI.

The Postgraduate Committee of the Council in its meeting held on 31.01.2015 considered the compliance verification assessment report dated 15.12.2014 furnished by the college and the clarification dated 27.01.2015 from the Council assessor and decided to recommend to the Central Government for Increase of seats from 1 to 2 students per year from the academic year 2015-16.

The college authorities has also made a representation to the Central Government dated 21.01.2015 in which they had requested that considering the infrastructural facilities, increase in clinical work load, teaching faculty and other relevant parameter that are in their view more than sufficient as compared to the minimum requirement as per MCI regulations. The Central Government should reconsider its decision and grant them seats as applied by them i.e. from 1 to 3.

The College authorities aggrieved by the decision of the PG Committee had preferred WP No.3714/2015 before the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay. The Hon'ble Bombay High Court after hearing the applicant medical college was pleased to dispose of the Petition on 08.05.2015 with the directions to the MCI to reconsider the application of the applicant medical college and pass a reasoned order. The MCI being aggrieved by the directions of the Hon'ble Bombay High Court has preferred a SLP before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India which is pending adjudication.

The Postgraduate Committee of the Council in the meanwhile considered the case of the applicant medical college on the basis of Assessment Report, Compliance Report and the oral submissions made by the College Authorities during personal hearing on 27/05/2015 and noted that in the Department of Pulmonary Medicine the college authorities have provided information on the total IPD (Number of Patients admitted) for the last 3 years as below:

This means 43 patients were admitted daily in pulmonary Medicine against total of 40 beds in the department which is not feasible.

Pulmonary medicine department has one unit & 40 beds where as General Medicine department has 4 units and 130 beds. It is difficult to understand as to how IPD of Pulmonary Medicine can be more than General Medicine. The submission of college authorities that in Pulmonary Medicine it is total bed occupancy of the year is merely an afterthought. Word IPD cannot be interpreted differently in different departments. It is clear from above that Data is non-genuine or patients were shown as admitted in the morning and discharged in the evening the same day because they required no admission.

In view of the aforesaid, the PG Committee is of the considered view that the recommendation made from 01 to 2 seats in MD (Pulmonary Medicine) against the request made by the college for increase of seats from 1 to 3 is in order and does not require any change.

V. Application for the increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course from 2 to 11 from the academic year 2015-16.

An application was made by Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and Hospital, Pune for the increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course from 2 to 11 from the academic year 2015-16. The aforementioned scheme/application dated 28.04.2014 was considered by the Postgraduate Committee of the Council wherein it was decided to carry out physical assessment of the medical college. Accordingly for verification of the availability of clinical material, infrastructural and other physical facilities at the medical college the physical assessment was carried out on 26.09.2014. The assessment report dated 26.09.2014 was placed before the Postgraduate Committee of the Council in its meeting held on 05.11.2014. The PG Committee of the Council, after considering Assessor's report dated 26.09.2014, decided to recommend for disapproval of the scheme for increase in seats in MS (Orthopaedics) because of the following deficiencies:-

- 1. Paediatric-Orthopaedic cases are low in numbers.
- 2. Latest editions of standard textbooks are not available in the library.
- 3. Promotion of Dr. Devendra Vartak, Asso. Prof. is not as per the Regulations. He has been promoted on basis of 2 publications; However, one of these 2 publications is a case report.
- 4. Promotion of Dr. Nakul Shah, Professor is not as per the Regulations. He has been promoted on basis of 4 publications; However, 2 out of these 4 publications are case reports.
- 5. Speciality clinic like fracture clinic is not run.
- 6. Knee Arthroplasty set is claimed to be available & functional; However, its number is shown as "0".
- 7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report."

The decision of the Postgraduate Committee was communicated to the Central Govt. vide letter dated 07.11.2014.

The Dean / Principal forwarded a copy of the compliance report dated 18.11.2014 and requested the Council to reconsider the application / scheme of the Medical College for increase in MS (Orthopaedics) course from the academic session 2015-16 from 2 to 11. The Dean/Principal of the College in his letter dated 18.11.2014, inter alia, requested for reconsideration of the decision of the Council to disapprove the scheme of the applicant medical college for increase of the in MS (Orthopaedics). The College Authorities had submitted a chart whereby they tried to demonstrate that the deficiencies communicated by the PG Committee had been complied with.

The Postgraduate Committee in its meeting held on 16.01.2015 considered the compliance verification assessment report dated 15.12.2014 and the compliance report of the College dated 18.11.2014 and decided to recommend to the Central Government for Increase of seats from 2 to 3 students per year from the academic year 2015-16.

The college authorities has also made a representation to the Central Government dated 21.02.2015 in which they had requested that considering the infrastructural facilities, increase in clinical work load, teaching faculty and other relevant parameter that are in their view more than sufficient as compared to the minimum requirement as per MCI regulations. The Central Government should reconsider its decision and grant them seats as applied by them i.e. from 2 to 11.

The College authorities aggrieved by the decision of the PG Committee had preferred WP No.3713/2015 before the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay. The Hon'ble Bombay High Court after hearing the applicant medical college was pleased to dispose of the Petition on 08.05.2015 with the directions to the MCI to reconsider the application of the applicant medical college and pass a reasoned order. The MCI being aggrieved by

the directions of the Hon'ble Bombay High Court has preferred a SLP before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India which is pending adjudication.

The P.G. Committee of the Council on the basis of Assessment Report, Compliance Report on 27/05/2015 and the oral submissions made by the College Authorities during Personal hearing noted that in the department of Orthopedics the clinical material (OPD, IPD, Major Operations) either declined or were static during the last three years as detailed below:

The Department already has 2 MS (Ortho) seats from 2013 and without increase in clinical material there is no justification for any increase in P.G. seats. Moreover, death rate of 0.4% in the department of orthopedics indicated that the department treated no serious diseases or polytrauma patients; in the absence of which training of students in the Post Graduate course would be grossly inadequate.

In view of the aforesaid, the PG Committee is of the considered view that the recommendation made for increase of 01 (2 to 3) seat in MS (Orthopaedics) against the request made by the college for increase of seats from 2 to 11 is in order and does not require any change.

VI. Application for increase in intake capacity from 3 to 6 seats for MD (Pediatrics) from the academic year 2015-16.

An application was made by Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and Hospital, Pune for the increasing the intake of MD (Pediatrics) course from an annual intake of 3 seats to an annual intake of 6 admissions per year from the academic session 2015-16. The aforementioned scheme/application dated 28.04.2014 was considered by the Post Graduate Committee of the Council wherein it was decided to carry out physical assessment of the Institute to ascertain the availability of requisite Clinical material, infrastructural and other physical facilities at the Petitioner College. The physical assessment was carried out on 27.9.2014. The Assessment Report dated 27.9.2014 was placed before the Post-Graduate Committee of the Council, after considering Assessor's report dated 27.9.2014 and in view of available infrastructure as well as Quantum and Quality of clinical material available in the petitioner medical college, decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to allow the application for increase of seats. The Council vide letter dated 7.11.2014 communicated the decision of the Council to the applicant.

The Dean/Principal of the College forwarded a copy of the compliance report dated 18.11.2014, vide his letter dated 18.11.14 inter alia requesting for reconsideration of the number of seats in the applicant college in the specialty of MD (Paediatrics) after a review of the infrastructure facilities, faculty position, clinical workload and academic research activities of the Department. The Institute also stated that if required they are prepared to give presentation on the matter.

The deficiencies point out by the Postgraduate Committee and the Compliance submitted by College vide its Compliance Report dated 18.11.14 are as under:-

The Postgraduate Committee of the Council considered the assessment report dated 27.09.2014 and the compliance report dated 18.11.2014 in its meeting held on 23.12.2014 wherein the Postgraduate Committee after considering the application / scheme of the medical college for increase in intake of seats from 3 to 6 seats in MD (Pediatrics) and in view of the infrastructure, teaching faculty, quality and quantum of clinical material and other physical facilities available in the medical college decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to deny permission to the petitioner medical college to increase the intake from 3 seats to 6 seats in MD (Pediatrics) course, from the academic session 2015-16. This decision of the Postgraduate Committee was forwarded to the Central Govt. as well as the medical college vide MCI letter dated 12.01.2015.

The College authorities aggrieved by the decision of the PG Committee had preferred WP No.3708/2015 before the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay. The Hon'ble Bombay High Court after hearing the applicant medical college was pleased to dispose of the Petition on 08.05.2015 with the directions to the MCI to reconsider the application of the applicant medical college and pass a reasoned order. The MCI being aggrieved by the directions of the Hon'ble Bombay High Court has preferred a SLP before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India which is pending adjudication.

The P.G. Committee on the basis of Assessment Report, Compliance Report and the oral submissions made by the College Authorities during personal hearing on

27/05/2015 noted that in the Department of Pediatrics there was a decline in OPD from 39276 in 2012 to 34986 in 2013 and was static in 2014 (23524 upto August, corrected upto Dec 2014 on average basis will be 35284). Average daily blood used was 0.81 units per day. This is despite the fact that the department was running a thalassemia clinic where children come for repeated blood transfusion. The postgraduate committee also noted that the department of paediatrics (2013) was only 0.48%, which is very low. The above data leaves nothing to doubt that the children admitted were with minor ailments and no really sick children were treated or this simply raises doubt about the genuineness of clinical material. The department already is having three P.G. Seats and with declining OPD there cannot be increase in PG seats. Furthermore the Committee noted that with OPD decreasing from 39276 in 2012 to 34986 in 2013 an increase in weekly clinical workload in IPD from 107 in 2012 to 115 in 2013 is not plausible.

In view of the aforesaid, the PG Committee is of the considered view that no further increase in intake capacity requested by the Institute can be recommended for the Academic Year 2015-16 and the recommendation to disapprove the scheme submitted by the College for increase in seats from 03 to 06 is in order and does not call for any change.

VII. Application for increase in intake from 1 seat to 3 seats for MD (Dermatology) from the academic year 2015-16.

An application was made by Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and Hospital, Pune for the increasing the intake of MD (Dermatology) course from an annual intake of 1 seat to an annual intake of 3 seats per year from the academic session 2015-16. The aforementioned scheme/application dated 28.04.2014 was considered by the Postgraduate Committee of the Council wherein it was decided to carry out physical assessment of the Institute to ascertain the availability of requisite Clinical material, infrastructural and other physical facilities at the Petitioner College. The physical assessment of the applicant medical college was carried out by the assessment team of the Council on 29.9.2014. The Assessment Report dated 29.9.2014 was placed before the Post-Graduate Committee of the Council, after considering Assessor's report dated 18.11.2014 and in view of available infrastructure as well as Quantum and Quality of clinical material available in the petitioner medical college decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to allow the application for increase of seats. The Council vide its letter dated 29.9.2014 communicated its decision to applicant and the Central Govt.

The Dean/Principal of the College forwarded a copy of the compliance report dated 27.11.2014, vide his letter dated 27.11.14, inter alia, requesting for reconsideration of the number of seats permitted to the Institute for MD (Dermatology) after a review of the infrastructure facilities, faculty position, clinical workload and academic research activities of the Department. The Institute also stated that if required they are prepared to give a presentation on the matter.

The deficiencies found by the Postgraduate Committee and the compliance furnished by the College vide its Compliance Report dated 27.11.14 are as under:-

The Postgraduate Committee of the Council considered the assessment report dated 29.9.2014 and the compliance report dated 27.11.2014 in its meeting held on 23.12.2014 wherein the Postgraduate Committee after considering the application / scheme of the medical college for increase in intake of seats from 1 seat to 3 seats in MD (Dermatology) and in view of the infrastructure, teaching faculty, quality and quantum of clinical material and other physical facilities available in the medical college decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to grant its permission to the applicant medical college for increase the intake in MD (Dermatology) course, for the academic session 2015-16. This decision of the Postgraduate Committee was forwarded to the Central Govt. as well as the applicant college vide MCI letter dated 12.1.2015.

The College authorities aggrieved by the decision of the PG Committee had preferred WP No.3710/2015 before the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay. The Hon'ble Bombay High Court after hearing the applicant medical college was pleased to dispose of the Petition on 08.05.2015 with the directions to the MCI to reconsider the application of the applicant medical college and pass a reasoned order. The MCI being aggrieved by the directions of the Hon'ble Bombay High Court has preferred a SLP before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India which is pending adjudication.

The P.G. Committee on the basis of Assessment Report, Compliance Report and oral submissions made by the College Authorities during the personal hearing on 27/05/2015 noted that in the department of Dermatology total IPD of 2013 is claimed to be 8761 on page 2 and 10051 on page 3 (of the SAF) which means 29 or 33 admissions per day against 40 Beds which is not feasible. The contention of College authorities that 8761or 10051 IPD is total Bed occupancy of the year cannot be accepted because if IPD has been interpreted as number of patients admitted in the year in all subjects, then interpretation of IPD cannot be different in Dermatology. IPD of the year means number of patients admitted in that year. At the time of admission each patient is given an IPD number, which remains the same even if the patient stays in hospital for many

days. Total IPD numbers given in a year is the total IPD of that year, which is same as the total number of patients admitted in that year.

The Data is clearly non-genuine or otherwise mean that 33 patients who were admitted in the morning are discharged in the evening on the same day. Obviously, they were no patients with genuine diseases and that was only a way to complete the required numbers. Further no immunological investigations were done over a period of one year in Dermatology department and only two endocrine investigations were done despite the fact that patients with immunological & thyroid diseases present in dermatology department quite frequently. Department is already having one P.G. seat and there was no justification for further increase

In view of the aforesaid, the PG Committee is of the considered view that no further increase in intake capacity from the current intake capacity permitted to the Institute can be recommended for the academic session 2015-16. Accordingly, the recommendation to disapprove the scheme of the College for increase in seats from 01 to 03 seats in MD (DVL) course is in order and does not require any change.

VIII. Application for increase in intake from 2 seats to 5 seats for MD (Radiodiagnosis) from the academic year 2015-16.

An application was made by Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and Hospital, Pune for the increasing the intake of MD (Radio-diagnosis) course from an annual intake of 2 seats to an annual intake of 5 seats per year from the academic session 2015-16. The aforementioned scheme/application dated 28.04.2014 was considered by the Postgraduate Committee of the Council wherein it was decided to carry out physical assessment of the Institute to ascertain the availability of requisite Clinical material, infrastructural and other physical facilities at the Petitioner College. The physical assessment was carried out by the assessment team of the Council on 26.9.2014. The Assessment Report dated 26.9.2014 was placed before the Post-Graduate Committee of the Council in its meeting held on 14.11.2014. The Post-Graduate Committee of the Council, after considering Assessor's report dated 26.9.2014 and in view of available infrastructure as well as clinical material available in the applicant medical college, decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to allow the application for increase of seats. The Council vide its letter dated 18.11.2014 communicated the decision of the Council to the Central Government.

The Dean/Principal of the College forwarded a copy of the compliance report dated 27.11.2014, vide their letter dated 27.11.14 inter alia requesting for reconsideration of the number of seats permitted to the Institute for MD (Radio-diagnosis) after a review of the infrastructure facilities, faculty position, clinical workload and academic research activities of the Department. The Institute also stated that if required they are prepared to give a presentation on the matter.

The deficiencies found by the PG Committee and the compliance furnished by College vide its Compliance Report dated 18.11.14 are as under:-

The Hon'ble Bombay High Court after hearing the applicant medical college was pleased to dispose of the Petition on 08.05.2015 with the directions to the MCI to reconsider the application of the applicant medical college and pass a reasoned order. The MCI being aggrieved by the directions of the Hon'ble Bombay High Court has preferred a SLP before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India which is pending adjudication.

In the meanwhile, the P.G. Committee on the basis of Assessment Report, Compliance Report and oral submissions made by the College Authorities during the personal hearing on 27/05/2015 considered the case of the applicant medical college and noted that the number of important investigations done daily in the entire hospital which are most vital for Diagnosing/staging of various serious diseases is grossly inadequate. The following were the investigations done in the entire hospital on the days of inspections of different subjects.

These figures do not support the Data provided by college authorities that there were 3919 MRI in 2013 and 2876 in 2014.

6-7 MRI per day are done in any one major department of a busy tertiary care teaching hospital, but here 5-6 MRI per day are done in entire hospital. This simply conveys that clinical material is either non-genuine or only patients with minor ailments are there only to complete the required numbers.

In the department of Radio-diagnosis there is no DSA without which permission for even starting of Postgraduate courses in Radio-diagnosis is not granted. On the Day of inspection in the department of radio-diagnosis no CT guided or Ultrasound guided FNAC was done. These are common investigation and do not required any prior appointment. There are already 3 seats in the department permitted in 2013. The PG Committee found no justification for increase in seats in this department.

In view of the aforesaid, the PG Committee is of the considered view that no further increase in intake capacity from the current intake capacity permitted to the Institute can be recommended for the academic session 2015-16. Accordingly, the decision on the application of the College to increase seats in MD (Radio-diagnosis) course from 03 to 05 is in order and does not require any change.

IX. Application for increase in intake of seats from 2 seats to 21 seats for MD (Anaesthesiology) from the academic year 2015-16.

An application was made by Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and Hospital, Pune for the increasing the intake of MD (Anaesthesiology) course from an annual intake of 2 seats to an annual intake of 21 seats from the academic session 2015-16. The aforementioned scheme/application dated 28.04.2014 was considered by the Postgraduate Committee of the Council wherein it was decided by the Post Graduate Committee of the Council to carry out physical assessment of the Institute to ascertain the availability of requisite Clinical material, infrastructural and other physical facilities at the Petitioner College. The physical assessment of the applicant medical college was carried out by the assessment team of the MCI on 29.9.2014. The Assessment Report dated 29.9.2014 was placed before the Post-Graduate Committee of the Council in its meeting held on 14.11.2014. The Post-Graduate Committee of the Council, after considering Assessor's report dated 29.9.2014 and in view of available infrastructure as well as quality and quantum of clinical material available in the petitioner medical college, decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to grant its permission to the applicant medical college for increase of seats. The Council vide their letter dated 18.11.2014 communicated its Central Government.

The Dean/Principal of the applicant college forwarded a copy of the compliance report dated 27.11.2014, vide his letter dated 27.11.14 inter alia requesting for reconsideration of the number of seats permitted to the Institute for MD (Anaesthesiology) after a review of the infrastructure facilities, faculty position, clinical workload and academic research activities of the Department. The applicant college further informed if required they are prepared to give a presentation on the matter.

The deficiencies found by the Postgraduate and the compliance furnished by college vide its Compliance Report dated 27.11.2014 are as under:-

The Postgraduate Committee of the Council considered the assessment report dated 29.9.2014 and the compliance report dated 27.11.2014 in its meeting held on 23.12.2014 wherein the Postgraduate Committee after considering the application / scheme of the medical college for increase in intake of seats from 2 seats to 21 seats in MD (Anaesthesiology) and in view of the infrastructure, teaching faculty, Quantum and Quality of clinical material and other physical facilities available in the medical college

decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to not to grant its permission to the applicant medical college to increase the intake in MD (Anaesthesiology) course, from the academic session 2015-16. This decision of the Postgraduate Committee was forwarded to the Central Govt. vide MCI letter dated 12.01.2015.

The College authorities aggrieved by the decision of the PG Committee had preferred WP No.3715/2015 before the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay. The Hon'ble Bombay High Court after hearing the applicant medical college was pleased to dispose of the Petition on 08.05.2015 with the directions to the MCI to reconsider the application of the applicant medical college and pass a reasoned order. The MCI being aggrieved by the directions of the Hon'ble Bombay High Court has preferred a SLP before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India which is pending adjudication.

In the meanwhile, the P.G. Committee of the Council considered the Assessment Report, Compliance Report and oral submissions made by the college authorities during personal hearing and noted that in the department of anesthesia the assessors report said that on the day of inspection 23 major, 12 minor and 3 caesarian sections were done and same is the average of daily major operations of last 3 years. The reports further reveal that on an average one unit of Blood and one unit of FFA was used daily in anesthesia department. The reports further reveal that only 2 specimens were sent for Histopathology examination on inspection day. From this, it is amply clear that operations could not be major operations because surgeries on patients of Cancer, polytrauma, obstructed labour, Intestinal resections etc. require lot of blood transfusions during prolonged surgeries. Further the fact that only two specimens were sent for histopathological examination simply shows that operations must have been done for minor ailments otherwise almost every organ removed (like thyroid, part of intestines, uterus and even appendix) are sent for Histopathological examination. Training in this type of surgeries will be grossly inadequate for Postgraduate students who are going to become specialists in their subjects.

The Postgraduate Committee further observed that even the number of these so called major operations had decreased for 2012 to 2013 and almost no increase in 2014, The College was already having two seats and Postgraduate Committee found no justification for any increase in this department.

In view of the aforesaid, the PG Committee is of the considered view that no further increase in intake capacity from the current intake capacity permitted to the Institute can be recommended for the academic session 2015-16. Accordingly, the recommendation of the PG Committee to disapprove the application of the College for increase in seats in MD (Anaes) course from 02 to 21 is in order and does not require any change.

X. Application for increase in intake capacity from 3 to 8 seats for MS (Obstetrics & Gynecology) from the academic year 2015-16.

An application was made by Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and Hospital, Pune for the increasing the intake of MS (Obstetrics & Gynecology) course from an annual intake of 3 seats to an annual intake of 8 admissions per year from the academic session 2015-16. The aforementioned scheme/application dated 28.04.2014 was considered by the Postgraduate Committee of the Council wherein it was decided to carry out physical assessment of the Institute to ascertain the availability of requisite Clinical material, infrastructural and other physical facilities at the Petitioner College. The physical assessment of the applicant medical college was carried out by the Council's Assessors on 27.9.2014. The Assessment Report dated 27.9.2014 was placed before the Post-Graduate Committee of the Council in its meeting held on 05.11.2014. The Post-Graduate Committee of the Council, after considering Assessor's report dated 27.9.2014 and in view of available infrastructure as well as clinical material available in

the petitioner medical college decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to grant its permission to the applicant medical college for increase of seats. The Council vide its letter dated 7.11.2014 communicated its decision to the Central Govt. as well as the applicant college.

The Dean/Principal of the applicant college forwarded a copy of the compliance report dated 6.12.2014, vide their letter dated 06.12.14, inter alia, requesting for reconsideration of the application/scheme of the applicant college for increasing the intake capacity of the number of seats permitted to the Institute for MS (Obstetrics & Gynecology) after a review of the infrastructure facilities, faculty position, clinical workload and academic research activities of the Department. The Institute also submitted that if required they are prepared to give a presentation on the matter.

The deficiencies found by the P.G. Committee and the compliance furnished by the applicant college vide its Compliance Report dated 06.12.14 are as under:-

The Postgraduate Committee of the Council considered the assessment report dated 27.09.2014 and the compliance report dated 06.12.2014 in its meeting held on 07.01.2015 wherein the Postgraduate Committee after considering the application / scheme of the medical college for increase in intake of seats from 3 to 8 of MS (Obstetrics & Gynecology) as well as the assessment report dated 27.09.2014 and in view of the infrastructure, teaching faculty, clinical material and other physical facilities available in the medical college decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to grant its permission to the applicant medical college to increase the number of seats in MS (Obstetrics & Gynecology) course, from the academic session 2015-16. This decision of the Postgraduate Committee was forwarded to the Central Govt. as well as the medical institute vide letter dated 12.01.2015.

The College authorities aggrieved by the decision of the PG Committee had preferred WP No.3716/2015 before the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay. The Hon'ble Bombay High Court after hearing the applicant medical college was pleased to dispose of the Petition on 08.05.2015 with the directions to the MCI to reconsider the application of the applicant medical college and pass a reasoned order. The MCI being aggrieved by the directions of the Hon'ble Bombay High Court has preferred a SLP before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India which is pending adjudication.

In the meanwhile, the P.G. Committee of the Council considered assessment report, compliance report and oral submissions made by the college authorities during personal hearing on 27/05/2015 and noted that in the department of Obstetrics & Gynaecology there was a decline in OPD from 66938 to 2012 to 66911 in 2013. The Daily blood used in the department was only 1.4 units per day. This is despite the fact that college authorities claim to be treating Gynaecological malignancies for which there is lot of blood requirement and blood is also needed in patients coming with APH, PPH, DUB etc. Hence, claim of college authorities regarding clinical work load cannot be relied upon. The Postgraduate Committee further noted that IPD of the department was 6473 in 2013 and 5146 in 2014. The total number of operations plus deliveries for corresponding years was 6453 and 5073 respectively which means there were hardly any patients admitted who did not require any surgery or were not delivery cases. It is a common observation that a significant number of patients are admitted with problems which do not require surgery or delivery. The P.G. Committee further noted that death rate in the department of OBG was merely 0.06%, which is unimaginably low for a

department which handles gynaecological malignancies and obstructed labour. It is amply clear that data is non-genuine or only patients with minor ailments were admitted to complete the required numbers. The department already has 3 P. G. seats and with the above observations, there can be no justification for any increase in seats.

In view of the aforesaid, the PG Committee is of the considered view that no further increase in intake capacity from that already permitted to the Institute can be recommended for the Academic Year 2015-16. Accordingly, the recommendation of the PG Committee to disapprove the application of College for increase in seats in MS (OBG) course from 03 to 08 is in order and does not require any change.

XI. Application for increase in intake capacity from 2 to 5 seats for MS (Ophthalmology) from the academic year 2015-16.

An application was made by Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and Hospital, Pune for increase in intake capacity from an annual intake of 2 seats to an annual intake of 5 seats for MS (Ophthalmology) from the academic session 2015-16. The aforementioned scheme/application dated 28.04.2014 was considered by the Postgraduate Committee of the Council wherein it was decided to carry out physical assessment of the Institute to ascertain the availability of requisite Clinical material, infrastructural and other physical facilities at the Petitioner College. The physical assessment of the applicant medical college was carried out by the assessment team of the Council on 29.9.2014. The Assessment Report dated 29.9.2014 was placed before the Post-Graduate Committee of the Council in its meeting held on 14.11.2014. The Post-Graduate Committee of the Council, after considering Assessor's report dated 29.9.2014 and in view of available infrastructure as well as clinical material available in the petitioner medical college, decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to not allow the application for increase of seats. The Council vide letter dated 18.11.2014 communicated the decision of the Council to the Central Government.

The Dean/Principal of the applicant college forwarded a copy of the compliance report dated 06.12.2014, vide his letter dated 06.12.14 inter alia requesting for reconsideration of the number of seats permitted to the Institute for MS (Ophthalmology) after a review of the infrastructure facilities, faculty position, clinical workload and academic research activities of the Department. The Institute also stated that if required it was prepared to give a presentation on the matter.

The deficiencies found by the P.G. Committee and the compliance furnished by applicant college vide its Compliance Report dated 6.12.14 are as under:-

The Postgraduate Committee of the Council considered the assessment report dated 29.09.2014 and the compliance report dated 06.12.2014 in its meeting held on 23.12.2015 wherein the Postgraduate Committee after considering the application / scheme of the medical college for increase in intake of seats from 2 to 5 of MS (Ophthalmology) and in view of the infrastructure, teaching faculty, quality and quantum of clinical material and other physical facilities available in the medical college decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to not to grant its permission to the applicant medical college to increase the intake of seats from 2 to 5 in MS (Ophthalmology) course, from the academic session 2015-16. This decision of the Postgraduate Committee was forwarded to the Central Govt. as well as the medical institute vide MCI letter dated 12.01.2015.

The College authorities aggrieved by the decision of the PG Committee had preferred WP No. 3717/2015 before the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay. The Hon'ble Bombay High Court after hearing the applicant medical college was pleased to dispose of the Petition on 08.05.2015 with the directions to the MCI to reconsider the application of the applicant medical college and pass a reasoned order. The MCI being aggrieved by the directions of the Hon'ble Bombay High Court has preferred a SLP before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India which is pending adjudication.

In the meanwhile, the P.G. Committee considered the Assessment Report, Compliance Report and the oral submissions made by the College Authorities during personal hearing on 27/05/2015 and noted that in the department of Ophthalmology (Major & Minor operations) have been reported as 15 per day which means 4500 operations per year (taking average 300 working days in a year). However, total IPD (Number of Patients admitted) in the department for the year 2013 was 1410 which means number of operations reported is three times the numbers of patient admitted which is not possible. It may be assumed that some of the minor operation might have been on day care basis but at the same time there are many patients admitted with eye problem which do not require any surgery. Hence, the total number of surgeries cannot be three times the total number of surgeries cannot be relied upon. College authorities have also not provided any information about other services being provided by the department. The column has been left blank in SAF.

In view of the aforesaid, the PG Committee is of the considered view that no further increase in intake capacity from that already offered by the Institute can be recommended for the Academic Year 2015-16. Accordingly, the recommendation of the PG Committee to disapprove the application of College for increase in seats in MS (Opthalomology) course from 02 to 05 is in order and does not require any change.

XII. Application for increase in intake of seats from 2 seats to 10 seats for MS (General Surgery) from the academic year 2015-16.

An application was made by Smt. Kashibai Navale Medical College and Hospital, Pune for the increasing the intake of MS (General Surgery) course from an annual intake of 2 seats to an annual intake of 10 seats per year from the academic session 2015-16. The aforementioned scheme/application dated 28.04.2014 was considered by the Postgraduate Committee of the Council wherein it was decided to carry out physical assessment of the Institute to ascertain the availability of requisite Clinical material, infrastructural and other physical facilities at the Petitioner College. The physical assessment of the applicant medical college was carried out by the MCI's Assessors on 26.9.2014. The Assessment Report dated 26.9.2014 was placed before the Post-Graduate Committee of the Council in its meeting held on 5.11.2014. The Post-Graduate Committee of the Council, after considering Assessor's report dated 5.11.2014, in view of available infrastructure as well as clinical material available in the applicant medical college, decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to allow the application for increase of seats. The Council vide its letter dated 7.11.2014 communicated its decision to the Central Government as well as the Petitioner College.

The Dean/Principal of the applicant college forwarded a copy of the compliance report dated 18.11.2014, vide his letter dated 18.11.14, inter alia, requesting for reconsideration of the number of seats permitted to the Institute for MS (General Surgery) after a review of the infrastructure facilities, faculty position, clinical workload and academic research activities of the Department. The Institute further submitted that if required they are prepared to give a presentation on the matter.

The MCI being aggrieved by the directions of the Hon'ble Bombay High Court has preferred a SLP before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India which is pending adjudication.

In the meanwhile, the P.G. Committee of the Council considered the Assessment Report, Compliance Report and oral submissions made by the College Authorities during the personal hearing on 27/05/2015 and noted that in the department of General Surgery there was a decline in OPD, IPD and Major Operations during the last three years, details of the same are as under:

Further, daily Blood consumed in the department was only 2 units and only 8 Histopathology samples were sent from entire Hospital which clearly indicate that no major surgeries were actually being done. The department already had 2 P.G. Seats and therefore could be no consideration for increase of seats when OPD and Major Surgeries were decreasing. The P.G. Committee also noted that:

1. Dr. Rahul Selke, Professor, Unit-III has been shown as Asst. Professor for 2 years in the present Faculty Table as well. Hence his promotion is not as per regulations.

2. Deficiency of Senior Resident: 2 (Required: 9 Available: 7). Asst. Professor cannot substitute for Senior Resident.

In view of the aforesaid, the PG Committee is of the considered view that no further increase in intake capacity from the current intake capacity permitted to the Institute can be recommended for the academic session 2015-16. Accordingly, the recommendation of the PG Committee to disapprove the application of College for increase in seats in MS (General Surgery) course from 02 to 10 seats is in order and does not require any change.

170. <u>Problem being faced to Monitor the admissions in PG Courses at Govt.</u> <u>Colleges - reg.</u>

Read: the matter with regard to problems being faced to monitor the admissions in PG Courses at Govt. Colleges.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the matter with regard to problems being faced to monitoring cell for monitoring the admissions made by the college authorities in PG Courses at Govt. Colleges and decided that the Monitoring Section to collect the information from all the Medical Colleges by sending emails and comparing the data available with the Council.

171. Request for confirmation of eligibility for the post of Assistant Professor in the department of Surgical Gastroenterology in respect of Dr. Pankaj Kumar in a Medical College.

Read: the minutes of TEQ Committee with regard to request for confirmation of eligibility for the post of Assistant Professor in the department of Surgical Gastroenterology in respect of Dr. Pankaj Kumar in a Medical College which were sent to Postgraduate Committee.

The Postgraduate Committee perused the decision of the TEQ Committee regarding confirmation of eligibility of Dr. Pankaj Kumar for the post of Asstt. Prof. in Surgical Gastroenterology in a Medical College and noted:

(1) That the Rule/Regulations quoted by the TEQ Committee pertain to various specialties and not to super-speciality. The present case pertains to Surgical Gastroenterology which is a super-speciality. The relevant regulation pertaining to Surgical Gastro-enterology as stated in Minimum Qualifications for Teachers in Medical Institutions is reproduced below:-

2. It may be pertinent to mention here that the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations has further been amended on 20/10/2008 according to which the requirement is only PG degree in the subject concerned – which in the present case will be M.Ch. in Surgical Gastroenterology.

Relevant amendment is reproduced below:-

"(b) In a Department, training candidates for Super-speciality, there shall be a minimum of three faculty members with requisite postgraduate qualification and experience, one shall be Professor, one Assoc. Professor/Reader and one Asstt.Prof./Lecturer".

3. As such the provisions incorporated in the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations are binding and are not open for any condonation or waiver.

The said statutory position has been consistently upheld by the Postgraduate Committee. However, it is advisable that the TEQ Regulations is appropriately amended in tune with the amendment to Postgraduate Regulations vide notification of 2008.

The Postgraduate Committee decided that this decision be communicated to the President, MCI before the recommendations of the TEQ Committee are placed before the Executive Committee for ratification.

172. <u>Clarification regarding recognition as PG teacher-Non-Medical Teacher</u>.

Read: the letter dated 22.05.2015 received from the Dean, Pt. B.D. Sharma Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Rohtak with regard to clarification regarding recognition as PG teacher-Non-Medical Teacher.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 22.05.2015 received from the Dean, Pt. B.D. Sharma Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Rohtak and decided as under:-

- (i) The Committee clarified that criterion for recognition as postgraduate teaching for medical and non-medical faculty is the same.
- (ii) The Committee further clarified that M.Sc. in Applied Biochemistry from a Medical Institute is an acceptable qualification in Biochemistry and similarly Ph.D. Medical Biochemistry is an acceptable qualification in Biochemistry.

The minutes of the meeting were read out and confirmed in the meeting itself.
