The Chairman welcomed the members of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

Leave of absence was received from Dr. Raja Babu Panwar, Member Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.

No objection/observation made by any member of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee. The minutes of the last meeting confirmed.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.

Action has been taken on the minutes of the last meetings dated 24.05.2016, 03.06.2016, 17.06.2016, 01.07.2016, 12.07.2016, 26.07.2016 & 09.08.2016. Minutes of the remaining meetings dated 30.08.2016, 07.09.2016, 16.09.2016, 22.09.2016, 29.09.2016 and 05.10.2016 still not received from the Oversight Committee.

Action will be taken on receipt of the Minutes from the Oversight Committee.

3. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur - Recognition of MD/MS(Anatomy) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at T.D. Medical College, Alappuzha.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (26.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD/MS(Anatomy) qualification for 2 seats at T.D. Medical College, Alappuzha granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (26.07.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD/MS(Anatomy) qualification for 2 seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at T.D. Medical College, Alappuzha be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

4. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur - Recognition of M.Ch. (Neurosurgery) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at T.D. Medical College, Alappuzha.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (30.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of M.Ch. (Neurosurgery) qualification for 2 seats at T.D. Medical College, Alappuzha granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (30.07.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize M.Ch. (Neurosurgery) qualification for 2 seats granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at T.D. Medical College, Alappuzha because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. Biju Bhadrar, Professor, is not as per regulations. He was promoted in March, 2014 after the cut of date without any publications.
2. Dr. Rose Bist P.K., Assoc.Prof. is not as per regulations. He was promoted in January, 2015 after the cut of date without any publications.
3. Dr. Aneze Musthafa, Assoc.Prof. has been promoted in March, 2016 after the cut-off of date without any publications, which is not as per regulations.
4. There is Nil Senior Resident in the only Unit.
5. Average daily Major Operations are 1-2.

6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular / illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

“This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject.”

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

5. **Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 3 seats in respect of students being trained at Shri Vasant Rao Naik Govt. Medical College, Yavatmal `.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (10.08.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 3 seats at Shri Vasant Rao Naik Govt. Medical College, Yavatmal ` granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (10.08.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(General Surgery) qualification for 3 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Shri Vasant Rao Naik Govt. Medical College, Yavatmal ` because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. Ashwin Tawde, is not as per regulations. He was Asst.Prof. 4 years against the requirement of 5 years and was promoted Assoc.Prof. on 01.08.2016 after the cut-off date without any publications, which is not as per regulations.
2. Promotion of Dr. Nishant T Chauhan, Assoc.Prof. Unit-I, is not as per regulations. He was promoted Assoc.Prof. on 07.10.2015 after the cut-off date without any publications.
3. Dr. Arvind S Lal, Sr. Resident is DNB from non-teaching hospital. He has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident in a teaching hospital, hence, not eligible.
4. Dr. H.P. Mhatre, Asst. Prof. has appeared at Govt. Medical College, Gondia for UG assessment on 18/04/2016.
5. Academic parameter for the last 12 months – group discussions were only six, which is inadequate.
6. IPD has decreased from 4545 in 2014 to 3624 in last year.
7. MRI is not available.
8. No Specialty clinic is run by the department.
9. Nil new books have been purchased for Departmental Library during last 3 years.
10. CPC is not held.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 03 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

“This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject.”

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

6. Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur - Renewal of Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Academy of Medical Sciences, Pariyaram, Kannur.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (27.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification for 1 seat at Academy of Medical Sciences, Pariyaram, Kannur granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (27.07.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MS(ENT) qualification for 1 seat granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at Academy of Medical Sciences, Pariyaram, Kannur because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Shameem Ahmed has been promoted as Assoc. Prof. after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of publications", it is stated "No" implying Nil publications against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
2. Dr. K.P. Rajesh, Senior resident does not have any experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident against requirement of 3 years; hence not qualified to hold the post.
3. There is no MRI in the institution.
4. There were only 2 Major Operations on day of assessment as well as on randomly selected days.
5. Total number of Major Operations was only 360 last year implying daily average of 1.2.
6. Operations like Laryngectomy, Rhinoplasty & Laryngotracheoplasty are not performed.
7. Total workload of Angiofibroma was Nil & that of Maxillectomy was only 1 during preceding 3 years.
8. Speech & Voice Analysis services are not available.
9. There are only 2 publications from the department in last 3 years.
10. Departmental Library has only 54 books. Nil new books have been purchased in last 3 years.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat till renewal of their recognition will be irregular / illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

“...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.”

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

7. West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata - Recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Midnapore Medical College, Midnapore.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (18.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification for 2 seats at Midnapore Medical College, Midnapore granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (18.07.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Forensic Medicine) qualification for 2 seats granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata in respect of students being trained at Midnapore Medical College, Midnapore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

8. Annamalai University, Annamalainagar - Renewal of Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 12 seats in respect of students being trained at Rajah Muthiah Medical College, Annamalainagar.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (18.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 12 seats at Rajah Muthiah Medical College, Annamalainagar granted by Annamalai University, Annamalainagar.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (18.07.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 12 seats granted by Annamalai University, Annamalainagar in respect of students being trained at Rajah Muthiah Medical College, Annamalainagar because of the following facts:-

1. Unit II, which is the Unit of Professor & HOD Dr. J. Kabalimurthy does not have Asso. Prof. A teacher eligible to be Reader cannot be considered as Asso. Prof. till he is appointed/promoted as such and his joining report as Asso. Prof. is submitted; resultantly faculty complement is incomplete in this Unit & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
2. Dr. K. Ravichandran has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of publications", it is stated "No" implying Nil publications against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
3. Promotion of Dr. Ashok Swaminathan, Lecturer, is not as per regulations. He is DNB from non-teaching hospital. He has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident in a teaching hospital at the time of appointment as Sr. Resident and then lecturer.
4. Promotion of Dr. N. Junior Sundresh, Reader, is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 02.07.2015 after the cut of date without any publications. Resultantly, Unit-V, left with only 2 faculty.
5. Specialty clinics like Cardiovascular & Thoracic Surgery clinic, Urology clinic, Plastic Surgery clinic, Surgical Gastroenterology clinic, Neurosurgery clinic, Paediatric Surgery clinic, Surgical Oncology clinic are not run.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 12 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular / illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."

9. King Georges Medical University, Lucknow - Recognition of M.Ch. (Cardio Thoracic and Vascular Surgery) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (15.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of M.Ch. (Cardio Thoracic and Vascular Surgery) qualification for 1 seat at Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow granted by King Georges Medical University, Lucknow.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (15.07.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that M.Ch. (Cardio Thoracic and Vascular Surgery) qualification for 1 seat granted by King Georges Medical University, Lucknow in respect of students

being trained at Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

10. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of DMRD qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Indira Gandhi Medical College & Hospital, Nagpur.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (19.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DMRD qualification for 2 seats at Indira Gandhi Medical College & Hospital, Nagpur granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (19.07.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize DMRD qualification for 2 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Indira Gandhi Medical College & Hospital, Nagpur because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Ramesh R. Chaple has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of publications", it is stated "No" implying Nil publications against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
2. Dr. Sandeep Mahajan has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of publications", only 1 publication is cited which is a case report & hence cannot be considered; resultantly there is Nil research publication against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
3. Dr. Prashant Lagdive, Sr. Resident, is not eligible, he has no 3 years teaching experience as Jr. Resident in a medical college.
4. Deficiency of faculty: Assoc.Prof. -2 and Sr. Resident -1.
5. In respect of other Senior Residents, details of experience as Resident is not provided for anyone; hence it cannot be verified whether their appointment as Senior Resident is as per Regulations or not.
6. MRI is not available.
7. DSA is not available.
8. Out of 3 publications cited in the list, 1 is a case report; resultantly there are only 2 research publications from the department in last 3 years.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

11. West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata - Renewal of Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 4 seats in respect of students being trained at Command Hospital, Kolkata.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (15.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 4 seats at Command Hospital, Kolkata granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (15.07.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 4 seats granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata in respect of students being trained at Command Hospital, Kolkata because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Anil Malik, Assoc. Prof. has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 4 years 1 months as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 5 years as per Regulations; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
2. Dr. S. Banerjee has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of publications", it is stated "No" implying Nil research publication against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
3. Dr. Siva Rama Krishna, Professor has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 2 years 5 months as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 5 years as per Regulations; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
4. Dr. S.K. Sen Gupta has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of publications", it is stated "No" implying Nil research publication against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
5. Dr. Manish Sharma has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of publications", it is stated "No" implying nil research publication against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
6. Promotion of Dr. S.R. Ghosh, Professor, is not as per regulations. His period as AIIMS cannot be counted as Asst.Prof. since he was super-speciality student during that period. At Udampur, he is shown Asst.Prof. & Assoc.Prof., both which is not feasible. Resultantly, his promotion is not as per regulations.
7. Dr. Manish Sharma and Dr. Anil Malik have not signed the faculty table, it means they were not present on the day of assessment.
8. There is no Senior Resident in Unit III.
9. In the faculty table in Part II Departmental Information, Units I, II & III are shown as having 46 beds in each Unit which is not as per Regulations.
10. Total number of Major Operations has decreased from 2,894 in 2013 to 2,240 in 2015.
11. Total number of Daycare Operations has decreased from 2,095 in 2013 to 1,744 in 2015.
12. Specialty clinic like Cardiovascular & Thoracic Surgery clinic is not run.

13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 04 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular / illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

“...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Read: the Council Assessor's Report (26.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 1 seat at T.D. Medical College, Alappuzha granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (26.07.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 1 seat granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at T.D. Medical College, Alappuzha because of the following facts:-

1. Faculty table is incomplete. Details of experience are not provided for some faculty. E.g. Dr. Reji Verghese is shown as “Assoc. Prof.” in the column of “Designation”; however, his experience as Asst. Prof. as well as date of promotion as Asso. Prof. are not shown. Similarly experience of several other faculty / Residents is not shown. Resultantly, there is no Assoc.Prof. in Unit-I.
2. Dr. Shajihan Hameed, Sr. Resident has D.Ortho. qualification. Hence, not eligible to be Lecturer or Sr. Resident.
3. Dr. Kumar Chandan, Senior Resident does not have any experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
4. There were only 2 Major Operations on day of assessment.
5. Total number of Minor Operations was only 64 during last year implying daily average of 0.21 which is grossly inadequate.
6. OPD space is inadequate. There are only 3 examination rooms against requirement of 4.
7. Female ward is comprising of small wards, each such ward accommodating 3-4 persons which is not conducive for teaching ward. Separate Nursing station is not available.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular / illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (22.07.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(General Surgery) qualification for 2 seats granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata in respect of students being trained at Midnapore Medical College, Midnapore because of the following facts:-

1. Unit 3 has only 2 faculty; hence it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
2. Unit 4 has only 1 Junior Resident against requirement of 2.
3. Dr. Tushar K. Chatterjee has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 4 years 2 months as Asst. Prof.; however the column of “Benefit of publications” in the faculty table has been left blank implying Nil publications against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
4. Promotion of Dr. Anil Kumar Saha, Professor is not as per regulations. He was Assoc.Prof. 3 years 9 months against the requirement of 4 years. He has no publications.
5. Promotion of Dr. Manoranjan Kar, Professor is not as per regulations. She was Assoc.Prof. 3 years 10 months against the requirement of 4 years. He has no publications.
6. Promotion of Dr. Tamal Kanti Sengupta, Assoc.Prof., is not as per regulations. He was Asst.Prof. 4 years 8 months against the requirement of 5 years. He has no publications.
7. Sr.Resident, Unit-II, Dr. Maumita Dey, was absent on the day of assessment. There is no other Sr.Resident in Unit-II.
8. The casualty beds are only 15 against the requirement of 30.
9. In the column of “Stipend paid by Institution to Residents” at Item § 26 in Summary, it is stated “-“. It needs to be clarified whether stipend is paid to Residents or not.

10. Specialty clinics like Cardiovascular & Thoracic Surgery clinic, Plastic Surgery clinic, Surgical Gastroenterology clinic, Neurosurgery clinic are not run.
11. Equipment like Colonoscope, Lower GI Endoscope are not available.
12. There are 5 O.T.s with 6 O.T. tables implying 1 O.T. has more than 1 table which is not permissible.
13. CPC is not held.
14. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. 1. Although 4 Units are shown, distribution of faculty & Residents and other details of only 3 Units are shown in the faculty table.
2. Dr. Kripa Singh Gantait has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however out of 5 publications listed in the column of “Benefit of publications”, 3 are case reports & in 1 he is 3rd author which cannot be considered; resultantly there is only 1 research publication to his credit against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
3. Dr. Gouranga Santra has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 4 years 6 months as Asst. Prof.; however the column of “Benefit of publications” in the faculty table has been left blank implying Nil publications against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.

4. Promotion of Dr. Bikas Chandra Seth, Assoc.Prof., is not as per regulations. He was Asst.Prof. 4 years 5 months against the requirement of 5 years. He has no publications.
5. There are only 3 units against the requirement of 4. Resultantly, deficiency of 1 Unit.
6. There are 70 beds in each unit which is not as per regulations. There are no recent medicine journals in library.
7. Separate ICCU is not available.
8. Teaching areas in OPD are inadequate.
9. Distance between 2 beds is < 1.5 mtr. in several wards.
10. Only 2 USG machines are available against requirement of 3.
11. Equipment like Bronchoscope, Endoscope, EMG, Nerve Conduction, Echo, TMT are not available in the department.
12. Details of beds occupied in ICUs are not provided.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular / illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. Charan Singh University in respect of students being trained at Muzaffarnagar Medical College, Muzaffarnagar because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. Neerja, Prof. & HoD, is not as per regulations. She was Asst.Prof. 4 years 3 months, Assoc.Prof. 3 year 2 months against the requirement of 5 years and 4 years respectively. Out of 4 publications quoted, 2 are in state journal, which is not indexed and cannot be accepted.
2. Promotion of Dr. Smita Tyagi, Assoc.Prof. is not as per regulations. She was promoted on 01.01.2015 after the cut-off date. One of the 2

publications is in State journal, which is not indexed and cannot be accepted.

3. Promotion of Dr. Bharti Maheshwari, Prof. is not as per regulations. She was Asst.Prof. 4 years. Assoc.Prof. 3 years and promoted 01.05.2015 after the cut-off date and has only 3 publications against the requirement of 4.
4. Dr. Shipra Shalwal, Sr. Resident is DNB from non-teaching hospital. She has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident in a medical college. Hence, not eligible for appointment as Sr. Resident.
5. Dr. Rimple Tiwary does not have 3 years experience as Resident in medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
6. Bed occupancy was 68.33 % in Obstetric wards on day of assessment.
7. Gynaec OPD was only 45 on day of assessment.
8. There was Nil Caesarean Section & only 1 Gynaec Major Operation on day of assessment.
9. Prenatal Diagnosis services are not available.
10. ART services are not available.
11. MRI workload for the whole hospital is only 01 & CT Scan only 07 on day of assessment.
12. On the day of assessment, major operation – nil.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular / illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

17. C.S.J.M. University, Kanpur - Recognition of MD/MS(OBG) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at U.P. Rural Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Etawah.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (19.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD/MS(OBG) qualification for 2 seats at U.P. Rural Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Etawah granted by C.S.J.M. University, Kanpur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (19.07.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD/MS(OBG) qualification for 2 seats granted by C.S.J.M. University, Kanpur in respect of students being trained at U.P. Rural Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Etawah because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Shikha Seth has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table, only 2 publications are cited against requirement of 4; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered. Same article has been published twice.
2. Promotion of Dr. Rajani Rawat, Assoc.Prof., Unit-I, is not as per regulations. She was promoted on 19.06.2015 after the cut-off date. One of the 2 publications quoted is in state journals which is not indexed and cannot be considered.
3. Promotion of Dr. Pooja Gupta, Assoc.Prof. is not as per regulations. She was Asst.Prof. 4 years 7 month against the requirement of 5 years. She was promoted on 13.07.2015 after the cut-off date. One of the 2 publications is in state journal which is not indexed and cannot be considered.
4. Dr. Manjul Agarwal, Sr.Resident is not eligible, she has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident in a medical college.
5. Dr. Nupur Mittal & Dr. Manjul Agarwal, Senior Residents in Unit II do not have 3 years experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post; resultantly there is no eligible Senior Resident in the Unit.
6. Dr. Pragya Shree, Senior Resident in Unit III does not have experience of 3 years as Resident in medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
7. There were Nil Obstetric Major & only 2 Gynaec Major Operations on day of assessment.
8. Total number of Major Operations was only 508 in 2015 implying daily average of 1.69 which is inadequate.
9. Total number of Minor Operations was only 849 in 2015 implying daily average of 2.8 which is inadequate.
10. Prenatal Diagnosis services are not available.
11. Separate Obstetric ICU / HDU is not available.
12. Specialty clinic like Gynaec Endocrine clinic is not run.
13. ART services are not available.
14. MRI workload for the whole hospital was only 06 on day of assessment.
15. Teaching area is not available in OPD. Patient examination arrangement is not available.
16. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular / illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Shortage of Senior Residents: 3.
2. Dr. Runu Dhar, Senior Resident does not have any experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
3. In the column of “Stipend paid by Institution to Residents” at Item § 23 in Summary, it is stated “Nil” which is contrary to PG Medical Education Regulations.
4. DSA is not available.
5. CT Scan is under PPP mode. Details of PPP mode are not provided.
6. Only 5 new books have been purchased for Departmental Library during last 3 years.
7. Data in table at Sr.No.5 page 2 cannot be of Radio-diagnosis department. Total number of patients admitted (IPD) last year has been shown as 1082231 which means 3607 admissions per day, which is not feasible.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular / illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to

Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

1. Faculty deficiency – Assoc.Prof.-1.

2. Dr. Rajendra K. Srivastav has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table, it is stated "No" implying Nil publications against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
3. Dr. Sharad K. Gangrade, Senior Resident does not have 3 years experience as Resident in medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
4. Dr. Shobhit Chandra, Senior Resident has experience of only 2 years 10 months as Resident before appointment as Senior resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
5. Workload of CT guided FNAC is only 5/month. Total workload in 2015 was only 47.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 2. Dr. Ganesh S. Deogaonkar, Senior Resident has experience of only 2 years 6 months as Resident in medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
3. On the day of assessment, clinical data on page no.2, sr.no.6 is left blank.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

3. Dr. Debbrata Das has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 4 years 7 months as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 5 years as per Regulations; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered. Resultantly, Unit-I, left only with 1 Asst.Prof. and it cannot be considered a PG unit.
4. Dr. Radhakrishna Mandal has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table has been left blank implying Nil publications against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular / illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 8. Facility for Computer Simulated model is not available.
9. Non-teaching staff is inadequate.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 1 to 2 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular / illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 2. There was Nil Gynaec Major & Nil Gynaec Minor Operation on day of assessment.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular / illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Dr. N.C. Srinivas Prabhu has been appointed straightaway as Professor of Emergency Medicine without any teaching experience in the department which is contrary to PG Medical Education Regulations.
2. Dr. B. Brinda has been shown as "Professor" in the column of "Designation" in the faculty table; however in the column of "Experience" it is shown as Senior Resident (Anaesthesia) from 05/11/2012 till date. Another Designation – i.e. Professor of Emergency Medicine is also shown; however previous experience as Asst. Prof. & Asso. Prof. are not shown; hence she could not have been appointed as

Professor of Emergency Medicine. Further date of joining as Professor is not shown. Hence she cannot be considered.

3. Dr. K. Somashekar has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 2 years 3 months as Asst. Prof.; Further although he is promoted after cut-off date, column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table is left blank implying Nil publications against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
4. Dr. H.V. Kiran Kumar, Senior Resident does not have any experience as Resident in this department; hence not qualified to hold the post.
5. None of the faculty has 2 year special training in Emergency Medicine or PG degree in Emergency Medicine. Hence not eligible to hold the post they are holding.
6. There is only 1 Major Operation on day of assessment.

1. There is only 1 Unit which has been exclusively assigned 35 beds & other 43 beds on sharing basis which is not as per Regulations.
2. Dr. Tushar Kanti Chattopadhyay, is shown as Prof. & HoD on pg.1 of the SAF. However, he has already crossed 70 years of age and he cannot be considered. In the faculty table Dr. S.K.Sarin, has been shown as Prof.

& HoD. However, the subject degree under consideration is M.Ch. Hepato Pancreato Biliary Surgery and Dr. S.K. Sarin is DM Medical Gastroenterology. Hence, he does not have the qualification to head the department of Hepato Pancreato Biliary Surgery.

3. Dr. Viniyendra Pamecha has been appointed as Asso. Prof. without any experience as Asst. Prof. in a medical college in India which is contrary to Regulations. Experience as Clinical Fellow or Senior Clinical fellow in hospitals in U.K. cannot be equated with that of Asst. Prof. required. Hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
4. Dr. Senthil Kumar has been appointed as Asso. Prof. without any experience as Asst. Prof. in a medical college in India which is contrary to Regulations. His experience as Registrar in surgery in hospitals in U.K. cannot be equated with that of Asstt.Prof. required. Hence, his promotion is not as per regulations and he cannot be considered.
5. Dr. Kishore K.S. Bharathy, Dr. Nikhil & Dr. Asit Arora have been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table has been left blank implying Nil publications against requirement of 2. No publications have been attached with their declaration form, hence their promotion is not as per Regulations & they cannot be considered.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2 to 3 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular / illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 1. Unit 2, which is the Unit of Dr. M. Sridhar, Professor & HOD, does not have Asso. Prof.; resultantly faculty complement is not complete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
2. Total number of patients in OPD has decreased from 53,642 in 2013 to 48,255 in 2015.
3. Total number of patients in IPD has decreased from 2,918 in 2013 to 2,289 in 2015.
4. Total number of Major Operations has decreased from 1,804 in 2013 to 1,583 in 2015.
5. There were only 2 research publications from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
6. There are 2 O.T.s with 7 tables implying more than 1 table/O.T. which is not as per norms.
7. Departmental Library has 72 books. Nil new books have been purchased during last 3 years.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

1. Unit A, which is the Unit of Dr. Y.B. Bajantri, Professor & HOD, does not have Asso. Prof.; resultantly faculty complement is not complete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
2. Dr. Pooja Kini, Senior Resident in Unit B does not have any experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
3. Unit C does not have any Senior Resident.
4. Details of experience in respect of faculty are not provided in the faculty table, without which their eligibility cannot be decided.
5. There were only 2 Major Operations on day of assessment.
6. Total number of patients admitted in IPD has decreased from 776 to 384 during preceding 3 year period.

2. Details of experience in respect of faculty are not provided.
3. Unit IV has only 2 faculty; hence it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
4. Dr. P. Sudharshan & Dr. V. Krishna Rao are promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of publications", it is stated "No" implying Nil publications against requirement of 4; hence their promotion is not as per Regulations & they cannot be considered.
5. Dr. Shankare Gowda is promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of publications", it is stated "No" implying Nil publications against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
6. Bed Occupancy is 70 % on day of assessment.
7. Total number of patients in IPD has decreased from 4,001 to 3,291 during preceding 3 years.
8. Only 1 bed was occupied in SICU on day of assessment.
9. Specialty clinics like Cardiovascular & Thoracic Surgery clinic, Surgical Gastroenterology clinic, Neurosurgery clinic, Surgical Oncology clinic are not run.
10. There are Nil research publications from the department during last 3 years.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

2. Dr. Ravindra P. Kulkarni is promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however the column of "Benefit of publications" has been left blank implying Nil publications against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
3. Dr. B.R. Naveen has only 1 year experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
4. Out of 4 publications cited in the list, 1 is not related with the subject of Radiodiagnosis & 2 appear to be case reports' resultantly there is only 1 research publication from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
5. Faculty table has not been signed by any of the faculty members.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Prof. against requirement of 5 years and promoted as Professor with experience of 3 years as Assoc.Prof. against the requirement of 4 years. He has no publications and hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
2. Dr. K.S. Hanumanthaiah has been promoted as Professor straightaway from Asst. Prof. without any experience as Assoc. Prof. against requirement of 4 years; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered. Unit left with 2 faculty.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (24.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Paediatric Hepatology) qualification for 01 seat at Institute of Liver and Biliary Sciences, New Delhi granted by Statutory Autonomous, Delhi.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (24.07.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Paediatric Hepatology) qualification for 01 seat granted by Statutory Autonomous, Delhi in respect of students being trained at Institute of Liver and Biliary Sciences, New Delhi because of the following facts:-

1. None of the faculty has 2 years special training in Paediatric Hepatology or DM(Paediatric Hepatology). Hence, they are not eligible for the post they are holding.
2. None of Senior Residents has experience of 3 years in the department. Hence, they are not eligible.
3. Paediatric Hepatology ward has only 16 beds against requirement of 20. Beds in PICU cannot be considered as teaching beds. Resultantly, teaching beds are inadequate by 4.
4. Departmental Library has only 20 books.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular / illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

“This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject.”

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

102. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Renewal of Recognition of DCP qualification for 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Bangalore Medical College and Research Institute, Bangalore.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (11.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of Recognition of DCP qualification for 04 seats at Bangalore Medical College and Research Institute, Bangalore granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (11.07.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of DCP qualification for 04 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Bangalore Medical College and Research Institute, Bangalore be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

103. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Renewal of Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 04 seats in respect of students being trained at M.V.J. Medical College, Bangalore.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (13.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 04 seats at M.V.J. Medical College, Bangalore granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (13.07.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 04 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at M.V.J. Medical College, Bangalore be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

104. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Renewal of Recognition of DDVL qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Bangalore Medical College and Research Institute, Bangalore.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (15.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of Recognition of DDVL qualification for 02 seats at Bangalore Medical College and Research Institute, Bangalore granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (15.07.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of DDVL qualification for 02 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Bangalore Medical College and Research Institute, Bangalore because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. G.S. Asha has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however, the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table is left blank implying Nil publications against requirement of 2; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
2. Dr. Divya Gonur, Senior Resident in Unit II does not possess any experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular / illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

105. Berhampur University - Recognition of MD(Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at MKCG Medical College, Berhampur.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (30.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats at MKCG Medical College, Berhampur granted by Berhampur University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (30.07.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 04 seats granted by Berhampur University in respect of students

being trained at MKCG Medical College, Berhampur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

106. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of DM(Cardiology) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at S S Institute of Medical Sciences& Research Centre, Davangere.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (27.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Cardiology) qualification for 01 seat at S S Institute of Medical Sciences& Research Centre, Davangere granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (27.07.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that DM(Cardiology) qualification for 01 seat granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at S S Institute of Medical Sciences& Research Centre, Davangere be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

107. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of M.Ch(Surgical Gastroenterology/G.I. Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Bangalore Medical College and Research Institute, Bangalore.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (27.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of M.Ch(Surgical Gastroenterology/G.I. Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats at Bangalore Medical College and Research Institute, Bangalore granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (27.07.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize M.Ch(Surgical Gastroenterology/G.I. Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Bangalore Medical College and Research Institute, Bangalore because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Nagesh has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; and he was Assoc.Prof. for 3 years against the requirement of 4 years. However, there are Nil publications against the requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
2. Dr. Sathish & Dr. Sumanth, both Senior Residents do not have experience of 3 years as Resident in the subject; hence not qualified to hold the post; resultantly there is no eligible Senior Resident.

3. Dr. B.N. Vinay is shown as Assistant Professor from February 2012 to February 2014 & as Associate Professor from February 2014 to February 2015; however his M.Ch. period is 2012-2015 which is not feasible. He cannot be a PG trainee & a faculty simultaneously.
4. There are 2 Units but only 30 beds instead of 40 beds required for 2 Units as per Regulations. Beds under PMSSY cannot be considered as they are not dedicated beds for this department. Beds in ICU & HDU are not considered as teaching beds.
5. Beds occupied in ICU on day of assessment are not provided.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 1 to 2 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular / illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

“This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject.”

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. Read: the Council Assessor's Report (15.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of Recognition of DCH qualification for 02 seats at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (15.07.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of DCH qualification for 02 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

109. Utkal University, Orissa - Recognition of MD/MS(Anatomy) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 05 seats in respect of students being trained at SCB Medical College, Cuttack.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (28.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD/MS(Anatomy) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 05 seats at SCB Medical College, Cuttack granted by Utkal University, Orissa.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (28.07.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD/MS(Anatomy) qualification against increased intake from 04 to 05 seats granted by Utkal University, Orissa in respect of students being trained at SCB Medical College, Cuttack be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

110. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh - Recognition of M.Ch(Neuro Surgery) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Guntur Medical College, Guntur.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (22.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of M.Ch(Neuro Surgery) qualification for 02 seats at Guntur Medical College, Guntur granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (22.07.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize M.Ch(Neuro Surgery) qualification for 02 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh in respect of students being trained at Guntur Medical College, Guntur because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. K.V.V. Satyanarayan Murthy is shown as "Professor" in the column of "Designation" in the faculty table; however in the column of "Experience" it is shown as Asso. Prof. at this institute from 29/03/2016 till date. This discrepancy needs to be clarified. It also means that there is no Professor.
2. There is no Assoc. Prof. in the only Unit; resultantly faculty complement is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
3. There is no Senior Resident.
4. Workload of Major Operations is 10-12 / week.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular / illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

“This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject.”

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.
