The minutes of the meeting of The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee held on 15.11.2016 confirmed.

## 2. <u>Minutes of the last meeting of The Postgraduate Medical Education</u> <u>Committee - action taken thereon.</u>

Minutes of the meetings dated 03/11/2016, and 15/11/2016 are still not received from the Oversight Committee. Action will be taken on receipt of the Minutes from the Oversight Committee.

#### 3. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh -Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Maharajah Institute of Medical Sciences, Nellimarella

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (30.09.2016) along with Council Assessor's Report (s) (May, 2015&30.03.2016) and compliance dated 23.05.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 04 seats at Maharajah Instt. of Med Sciences, Nellimarella granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (30/09/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015 & 30.03.2016) and compliance dated 23/05/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 04 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. in respect of students being trained at Maharajah Instt. Of Med Sciences, Nellimarella because of the following facts:-

- 1. Promotion of Dr. P. Sankra Rao Prof., Unit-III is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 01.06.2016 after the cut off date. He was Assoc.Prof. for 3 years 6 months against the requirement of 4 years. There are no publications cited in the faculty table.
- 2. Dr. S. Sasi Bhushana Rao, Professor, Dr. S.Appala Raju, Asst.Prof.&Dr. V. Naveen Kumar, Asst.Prof. were absent on the day of assessment.
- 3. 22 out of 79 cases (28%) were admitted for Physiotherapy only which means non-genuine patients. Similarly, out of 10 minor OT patients on 29.09.2016, 4 were metatarsal & 2 Scaphoid fracture, which is unlikely.
- 4. Only 2 deaths last year and one death in 2016 till 30.09.2016. It simply indicates that no serious patients of polytrauma were admitted without which training of PG students is inadequate. Only Patient's with minor ailments were admitted. Clinical material is grossly inadequate
- 5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 04 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

 $\square$  This permission for starting  $\checkmark$  increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject. $\square$

## 4. <u>Pondicherry University, Puducherry - Recognition of MD(General</u> <u>Medicine) qualification for 04 seats in respect of students being trained</u> <u>at Sri Manakula Vinayagar Medical College&Hospital, Pondicherry.</u>

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05.10.2016) along with Council Assessor's Report (s) ( April, 2015&29.03.2016) and compliance dated 25.05.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 04 seats at Sri Manakula Vinayagar Medical College&Hospital, Pondicherry granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015&29.03.2016) and compliance dated 25/05/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(General Medicine) qualification for 04 seats granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Sri Manakula Vinayagar Medical College&Hospital, Pondicherry because of the following facts:-

- 1. Promotion of Dr. S. Girija, Professor is not as per regulations. She has only 1 publication against the requirement of 4. She was shown in the last assessment as Professor but in the present assessment she has been shown Assoc.Prof. without any demotion order or joining report being provided. This is not permissible.
- Dr. Raghunathan, was shown Assoc.Prof. in last assessment and shown Asst.Prof. now. There are no demotion orders and fresh joining report. Resultantly, Unit 2 left with only 2 faculty.
- 3. Dr. B. Karthikeyan, Asst.Prof., Dr. Gayathri K, Asst.Prof. and Dr. R. Asaithambi, Sr. Resident were absent on the day of assessment.
- 4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 04 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central

Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015&21.03.2016) and compliance dated 30/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(General Medicine) qualification for 02 seats granted by Ch. Charan Singh Universitiy in respect of students being trained at Muzaffarnagar Medical College, Muzaffarnagar because of the following facts:-

- 1. Deficiency of Sr.Resident -4.
- 2. Dr. Mayank Arora, Senior Resident in Unit I, does not have any experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
- 3. Dr. Mugish Ahmad, Senior Resident in Unit II does not have any experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
- 4. Dr. Sumit Garg, Senior Resident in Unit III does not have any experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence

not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.

- 5. Dr. Govardhan Gupta, Senior Resident in Unit V does not have any experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
- 6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committeeconsidered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015&09.03.2016) and compliance dated 02/05/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Governmentthat MS(Anaesthesiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats granted by B.N. Mandal University in respect of students being trained at Mata Gujri Memorial Medical College, Kishanganj be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015&17.03.2016) and compliance dated 16/05/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 03 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at S S Institute of Medical Sciences&Research Centre, Davangere because of the following facts:-

- 1. Shatabdi Super Speciality Hospital&Sparsh Hospital, are nonteaching hospital, their experience cannot be counted. Resultantly, Deficiency of Dr. Narendra S S., Prof. and HOD, Dr. Parvathareddy Yerriswamy, Assoc.Prof. and Dr. Sudeendra Rao T, Asst.Prof. stay as such. None of the faculty is MD(Emergency Medicine or have 2 years special training in Emergency Medicine, hence not eligible.
- 2. Dr. Parwatha Reddy, Asso. Prof. and Dr. Surendra Rao were absent at 11 a.m. on day of assessment. Dr. Reddy presented himself at 3 p.m.&Dr.Rao at 4 p.m.; hence they cannot be considered.
- 3. OPD attendance was 45 on day of assessment.
- 4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (06/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015&30.03.2016) and compliance dated 28/05/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 04 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur because of the following facts:-

- 1. Dr. Anil C. Byakod is promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however, there are NIL research publications to his credit against requirement of 2 as per Regulations; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations&he cannot be considered. Unit left with only 2 faculty.
- 2. Dr. V.U. Munjawar, Senior Resident in Unit B does not have any experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
- 3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 04 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

**\square**.the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course. $\square$ 

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015&28.03.2016) and compliance dated 11/05/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognizeMS(ENT) qualification for 01 seat granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. in respect of students being trained at Santhiram Medical College, Nandyal because of the following facts:-

- 1. Details of experience of faculty&Residents are not provided in faculty table.
- 2. Bed Occupancy is 64 % on day of assessment.
- 3. There were only 2 Major&1 Minor Operations on day of assessment.
- 4. There is no improvement in BERA investigations as per registers. Deficiency remains as it is.
- 5. There is no participation in National Programme for Control of Deafness. Deficiency remains as it is.
- 6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (07/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (April,2012 June, 2013, Feb.,2015, 17.07.2015&04.04.2016) and compliance dated 01/06/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognizeMD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification for 04 seats granted by Vinayaka Mission's University, salem in respect of students being trained at Vinayaka Mission's Kirupananda Variyar Medical College, Salem because of the following facts:-

- 1. There is shortage of one Associate Professor.
- 2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 04 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

 $\square$  This permission for starting  $\checkmark$  increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject. $\square$

49. <u>Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh -</u> <u>Recognition of DLO qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being</u> <u>trained at Guntur Medical College, Guntur.</u> Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04.11.2016) along with Council Assessor's Report (s) (May, 2015&10.03.2016) and compliance dated 26.04.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition ofDLO qualification for 02 seats at Guntur Medical College, Guntur granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P..

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015&10.03.2016) and compliance dated 26/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that DLO qualification for 02 seats granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada, A.P. in respect of students being trained at Guntur Medical College, Guntur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

50. <u>Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur - Recognition of</u> <u>MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 07(Seven)</u> <u>to 10(Ten) seats in respect of students being trained at Dr SN Medical</u> <u>College, Jodhpur.</u>

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (03.10.2016) along with Council Assessor's Report (s) (July, 2013, November,2014&05.04.2016) and compliance dated 24.06.2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition ofMD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 07(Seven) to 10(Ten) seats at Dr SN Medical College, Jodhpur granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (03/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2013, November,2014&05.04.2016) and compliance dated 24/06/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognizeMD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 07(Seven) to 10(Ten) seats granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at Dr SN Medical College, Jodhpur because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Suresh Verma is promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however there are NIL publications to his credit against requirement of 4 as per Regulations; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations&he cannot be considered.

- 2. Dr. Mohan Makwana is promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however he does not have publications as required as per Regulations; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations&he cannot be considered.
- 3. NICU is shown as part of Unit II. This implies that Residents of other Units are not given any training in NICU which is not as per norms.
- 4. PICU is shown as part of Unit IV. This implies that Residents of other Units are not given any training in PICU which is not as per norms.
- 5. Faculty table has not been signed by any of the faculty members.
- 6. As per Asessor, there is only 1 Professor.
- 7. Prescribed SAF for compliance verification has not been used.
- 8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 7 to 10 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

 $\square$ This permission for starting  $\checkmark$  increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject. $\square$ 

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. # 51. Increase of seats in DM (Endocrinology) course at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (08/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (04/03/2016 and 02/05/2016) and letter of permission dated 20/08/2016 received from the Central Government in light of directives dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee for Increase of seats in DM (Endocrinology) course at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (08/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (04/03/2016 and 02/05/2016) and letter of permission dated 20/08/2016 received from the Central Government in light of directives dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in DM (Endocrinology) course at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2016-2017 from 2(Two) to 3(Three) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The minutes of this item is read and confirmed in this meeting itself.

# 52. <u>Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Neuro-Surgery) course at M.S. Ramaiah</u> <u>Medical College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health</u> <u>Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year</u> <u>2016-17.</u>

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (08/02/2016) and letter of permission dated 20/08/2016 received from the Central Government in light of directives dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee for Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Neuro-Surgery) course at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (09/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (08/02/2016) and letter of permission dated 20/08/2016 received from the Central Government in light of directives dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in M.Ch. (Neuro-Surgery)course at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2016-2017 from 1(One) to 2(Two) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The minutes of this item is read and confirmed in this meeting itself.

#### 53. <u>Increase of seats in DM (Cardiology) course at M.S. Ramaiah Medical</u> <u>College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences,</u> <u>Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.</u>

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (03/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (10/02/2016 and 28/04/2016) and letter of permission dated 20/08/2016 received from the Central Government in light of directives dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee for Increase of seats in DM (Cardiology) course at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Central Government vide its letter dated 20/08/2016 addressed to the M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore granted Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in DM (Cardiology) course from 1 to 2 seats for the academic year 2016-17, in light of directive dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee subject to submission of the following:

An affidavit from the Dean/Principal and Chairman of the Trust/Society/ University/Company etc concerned, affirming fulfillment of all deficiencies and statements made in the respective compliance report submitted to MHFW by 22 June 2016.

- *ii.* A bank guarantee in the amount of Rs. 2 crore in favour of MCI, which will be valid for 1 year or until the first renewal assessment, whichever is later. Such bank guarantee will be in addition to the prescribed fee submitted alongwith the application.
- iii. Government Colleges would submit an undertaking on the same lines, which are signed by Chief Secretary / Health Secretary of the respective State to MHFW.
  - 2. The OC has also stipulated as follows:

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- (a) OC may direct inspection to verify the compliance submitted by the college and considered by OC, anytime after 30 September 2016.
- (b) In default of the conditions (i) (ii) and (iii) in para 1 above as applicable, and if the compliances are found incomplete in the inspection to be conducted after 30 September 2016, such college (including Government College) will be debarred from fresh intake of students for 2 years commencing 2017-18.

Thereafter in pursuance of the directives of the Oversight Committee dated 24/09/2016, the assessment of the M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore has been carried out by the Council Assessor on 03/11/2016. The assessment report

was considered by the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/11/2016, wherein the Committee observed as under:-

- 1. Dr. Karthik Naidu; Dr. Abhinav Tibdewal; Dr. Bhaskar S. Rao; Dr. Medikonda P. Reddy, all Senior Residents do not possess 3 years experience as Resident in Cardiology; hence not qualified to hold the post. The college authorities has stated that there is one Sr. Resident Dr. Kiran who is eligible but in the faculty table, there is no such name in the report. Resultantly, there is no Sr. Resident, so deficiency of Sr. Resident still persists.
- 2. Dr. Nagamalesh, Assoc. Prof. passed DNB from non-teaching hospital and does not have 3 years experience from a medical college/teaching hospital at the time of appointment as Asst. Professor. Hence not eligible.
- 3. Dr. Anupama Hegde, passed DNB from the non-teaching hospital and does not have 3 years experience from a medical college/teaching hospital at the time of appointment as Asst. Professor. Hence not eligible.
- 4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that in its meeting held on 06,05,2016, the Postgraduate Committee had recommended to the Central Government not to grant Letter of Permission in view of the following deficiencies :-

- 1. Year of passing DM in case of Professor & HoD is not given in the faculty table.
- 2. Dr. Nagmalesh, Assoc. Professor passed DNB from non-teaching hospital. He has no 3 years experience in a teaching hospital at the time of appointment as Asst. Professor. Hence, not eligible.
- 3. Dr. Anupama Hegde passed DNB from non-teaching hospital. She has no 3 years experience as Junior Resident in a teaching institution. Hence, not eligible to be appointed as Senior Resident or Asst. Professor.
- 4. DM Students are shown as Senior Residents without showing 3 years experience as Resident in the department; hence none of them is qualified to hold the post; resultantly, there is NIL Senior Resident. Deficiency remains as such.
- 5. Bed occupancy has been computed taking into consideration patients in CCU also which is not permissible as beds in CCU are non-teaching beds.
- 6. OPD attendance was only 52 which is inadequate for increase in intake.
- 7. Department of Cardiology runs in association with Narayana Hrudayalaya. Institute has stated that it is for the purpose of co-branding only. Assessor has reported that all the clinical work & procedures are being done in the premises of M.S. Ramaiah Medical College. This implies that the true nature of association is not revealed. It is not clear who is carrying out the clinical work & procedures and what is the extent of training of PGs in such association.
- 8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the college has failed to abide by the undertaking it had given to the Central Govt. that there are no deficiencies in respect of the aforesaid course as per clause 1(ii) of the directions passed by the Supreme Court

mandated Oversight Committee vide communication dated 20/08/2016. The Postgraduate Committee, after due deliberation and discussion, have decided that the college has failed to comply with the stipulation laid down by the Oversight Committee. Accordingly, the Postgraduate Committee recommends that as per the directions passed by Oversight Committee in para 2(b) vide communication dated 20/08/2016 the college should be debarred from admitting students in the above course for a period of two academic years i.e. 2017-18 & 2018-19 as even after giving an undertaking that they have fulfilled the entire infrastructure for increase of seats in the super-speciality course in the speciality of DM (Cardiology) the college was found to be grossly deficient. It has also been decided by the Post Graduate Committee that the Bank Guarantee furnished by the college in pursuance of the directives passed by the Oversight Committee as well as GOI letter dated 20/08/2016 is liable to be encashed.

The decision be conveyed to the Oversight Committee and Central Govt.

The minutes of this item is read and confirmed in this meeting itself.

# 54. <u>Starting of DM (Nephrology) course at JSS Medical College, Mysore</u> <u>under JSS University, Mysore U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the</u> <u>academic year 2016-17.</u>

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (08/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (15/02/2016) and letter of permission dated 20/08/2016 received from the Central Government in light of directives dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee for Starting of DM (Nephrology) course at JSS Medical College, Mysore under JSS University, Mysore U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Central Government vide its letter dated 20/08/2016 addressed to the JSS Medical College, Mysore granted Letter of Permission for Starting of DM (Nephrology) course for 2 seats for the academic year 2016-17, in light of directive dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee subject to submission of the following:

- *a*. An affidavit from the Dean/Principal and Chairman of the Trust/Society/ University/Company etc concerned, affirming fulfillment of all deficiencies and statements made in the respective compliance report submitted to MHFW by 22 June 2016.
- *ii.* A bank guarantee in the amount of Rs. 2 crore in favour of MCI, which will be valid for 1 year or until the first renewal assessment, whichever is later. Such bank guarantee will be in addition to the prescribed fee submitted alongwith the application.
- iii. Government Colleges would submit an undertaking on the same lines, which are signed by Chief Secretary / Health Secretary of the respective State to MHFW.

- 2. The OC has also stipulated as follows:
  - (a) OC may direct inspection to verify the compliance submitted by the college and considered by OC, anytime after 30 September 2016.
  - (b) In default of the conditions (i) (ii) and (iii) in para 1 above as applicable, and if the compliances are found incomplete in the inspection to be conducted after 30 September 2016, such college (including Government College) will be debarred from fresh intake of students for 2 years commencing 2017-18.

Thereafter in pursuance of the directives of the Oversight Committee dated 24/09/2016, the assessment of the JSS Medical College, Mysore has been carried out by the Council Assessor on 08/11/2016. The assessment report was considered by the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/11/2016, wherein the Committee observed as under:-

- 1. One remark pointed out earlier was regarding ineligibility of Dr. Manjunath M. Shetty, Professor & HOD who had passed DNB from non-teaching institute and at the time of his initial appointment as Assistant Professor did not have 3 years teaching experience in a medical college. Presently, his experience has been altered retrospectively so as to show his experience from 12/09/2005 to 11/09/2008 as Senior Resident instead of from 12/09/2005 to 31/12/2007 as Assistant Professor & from 01/01/2008 to 31/12/2011 as Associate Professor as shown in earlier assessment of February 2016. Such retrospective changes to make him eligible are not permissible. Hence deficiency remains as it is. There is no other Professor in the department.
- 2. Another remark pertained to Dr. C. Manoj, Senior Resident who does not have any experience as Resident in a medical college before appointment as Senior Resident against requirement of 3 years and hence not qualified to hold the post. Explanation given by the institute cannot be considered as it speaks of "such candidates shall undergo one additional year's Senior Residency or equivalent training or research in a MCI recognized institution". This Regulation only allows such candidate to be eligible if they undergo 1 additional year's Senior Residency. It does not permit to appoint a person as a Senior Resident even if he does not have 3 year experience as Resident in a medical college hospital. Hence Dr. C. Manoj is not eligible to be appointed as Senior Resident & the deficiency is not rectified. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
- 3. Both the deficiencies pointed out in earlier report stays as such.
- 4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that in its meeting held on 26,04,2016, the Postgraduate Committee had recommended to the Central

Government not to grant Letter of Permission in view of the following deficiencies:-

- 2. Dr. C. Manoj does not have 3 years experience as Resident in Nephrology; hence not qualified to hold the post. Deficiency remains as it is.
- 3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the college had failed to abide by the undertaking it had given to the Central Govt. that there are no deficiencies in respect of the aforesaid course as per clause 1(ii) of the directions passed by the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee vide communication dated 20/08/2016. The Postgraduate Committee, after due deliberation and discussion, have decided that the college has failed to comply with the stipulation laid down by the Oversight Committee. Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (07/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (14/03/2016 and 02/05/2016) and letter of permission dated 20/08/2016 received from the Central Government in light of directives dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committeefor Starting of DM (Neurology) course at Chalmeda Anand Rao Institute Of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Central Government vide its letter dated 20/08/2016 addressed to the Chalmeda Anand Rao Institute Of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar granted Letter of Permission for Starting of DM (Neurology) course for 2 seats for the academic year 2016-17, in light of directive dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee subject to submission of the following:

- *D*. An affidavit from the Dean/Principal and Chairman of the Trust/Society/ University/Company etc concerned, affirming fulfillment of all deficiencies and statements made in the respective compliance report submitted to MHFW by 22 June 2016.
- *ii.* A bank guarantee in the amount of Rs. 2 crore in favour of MCI, which will be valid for 1 year or until the first renewal assessment, whichever is later. Such bank guarantee will be in addition to the prescribed fee submitted alongwith the application.

The assessment report was considered by the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/11/2016, wherein the Committee observed as under:-

- Dr. D. Indira was not working as Jr. Resident in Neurology Department from 2013 to 2016. Hence, she is not eligible to be appointed as Sr.Resident. Resultantly, there is deficiency of Sr. Resident in the department.
- The Dean could not provide proof of payment of salary (bank transfer) to Dr. D. Indira as Jr. Resident from 2013 to 2016.
- 3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that in its meeting held on 12,05,2016, the Postgraduate Committee had recommended to the Central Government not to grant Letter of Permission in view of the following deficiencies :-

- 1. As per report, there was no JR in the department by the name Dr. D.Indira. There were two JR (Jagdish Kumar B & Dogga Sudhakar) names in the compliance. It is shown that Dr.D.Indira worked as JR in the department from 8.4.2013 to 8.4.2016 and promoted SR on 9.4.2016 which is not feasible. The PG Committee decided to seek clarification from the Dean and D.Indira for the same within two weeks.
- 2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the college had failed to abide by the undertaking it had given to the Central Govt. that there are no deficiencies in respect of the aforesaid course as per clause 1(ii) of the directions passed by the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee vide communication dated 20/08/2016. The Postgraduate Committee, after due deliberation and discussion, have decided that the college has failed to comply with the stipulation laid down by the Oversight Committee. - 1. PG Degree of Dr. Mayank A Patel, Assoc.Prof. is not recognized hence, he could not be considered Assoc.Prof.. Resultantly, there is no Assoc.Prof. in the department. Deficiency stays as it is.
- 2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that in its meeting held on 15,03,2016, the Postgraduate Committee had recommended to the Central Government not to grant Letter of Permission in view of the following deficiencies :-

- 1. PG degree of Dr. Mayank M. Patel is not recognized.
- 2. Resultantly, there is no Asso. prof. in the only Unit; hence faculty complement is incomplete in Unit I & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
- 3. Dr. Pranav Joshi is DNB from non-teaching. He has no 3 years experience in a Medical College. Hence, he is not eligible to hold the post of Asst. Professor.

- 4. None of Senior Residents possesses 3 years experience as Resident in the subject; hence not qualified to hold the post.
- 5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the college had failed to abide by the undertaking it had given to the Central Govt. that there are no deficiencies in respect of the aforesaid course as per clause 1(ii) of the directions passed by the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee vide communication dated 20/08/2016. The Postgraduate Committee, after due deliberation and discussion, have decided that the college has failed to comply with the stipulation laid down by the Oversight Committee. Accordingly, the Postgraduate Committee recommends that as per the directions passed by Oversight Committee in para 2(b) vide communication dated 20/08/2016 the college should be debarred from admitting students in the above course for a period of two academic years i.e. 2017-18 & 2018-19 as even after giving an undertaking that they have fulfilled the entire infrastructure for increase of seats in the super-speciality course in the speciality of DM (Neurology) the college was found to be grossly deficient. It has also been decided by the Post Graduate Committee that the Bank Guarantee furnished by the college in pursuance of the directives passed by the Oversight Committee as well as GOI letter dated 20/08/2016 is liable to be encashed.

The decision be conveyed to the Oversight Committee and Central Govt.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Central Government vide its letter dated 20/08/2016 addressed to the Christian Medical College, Vellore, Tamilnadu granted Letter of Permission for Starting of DM (Infectious Disease) course for 2 seats for the academic year 2016-17, in light of directive dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee subject to submission of the following:

*D*. An affidavit from the Dean/Principal and Chairman of the Trust/Society/ University/Company etc concerned, affirming fulfillment of all deficiencies and statements made in the respective compliance report submitted to MHFW by 22 June 2016.

- 1. The contention of college authorities that there is no requirement of Sr. Resident in super-speicality courses is incorrect. As per General instructions in MSR regarding requirements of staff in clinical departments, it is clearly laid down that minimum staff complement in each unit shall consists of Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor, Sr. Resident and Jr. Resident. This is also clarified in the decision of the General Body of the Council held in its meeting dated 11/03/2010 that for calculating requirement of Sr. Resident a unit with 30 beds will be considered as unit in Broad specialisties and a unit with 20 beds in superspecialities.
- 2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that in its meeting held on 06,05,2016, the Postgraduate Committee had recommended to the Central Government not to grant Letter of Permission in view of the following deficiencies :-

- 1. The deficiency of Senior Resident stays as such. There is no eligible Senior Resident in the department of Infectious Disease.
- 2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the college had failed to abide by the undertaking it had given to the Central Govt. that there are no deficiencies in respect of the aforesaid course as per clause 1(ii) of the directions passed by the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee vide communication dated 20/08/2016. The Postgraduate Committee, after due deliberation and discussion, have decided that the college has failed to comply with the stipulation laid down by the Oversight Committee. Accordingly, the Postgraduate Committee recommends that as per the directions passed by Oversight Committee in para 2(b) vide communication dated 20/08/2016 the college should be debarred from admitting students in the above course for a period of two academic years i.e. 2017-18 & 2018-19 as even after giving an undertaking that they have fulfilled the entire infrastructure for starting the super-speciality course in the speciality of DM (Infectious Disease) the college was found to be grossly deficient. Dr. Abraham Peedicayil, Professor & HOD is promoted as Professor on 09/07/2016 - i.e. after cut-off date; however the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table is left blank implying NIL publications against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered. Further in the present report he is shown as under:

Thus there is change in the details of experience with retrospective effect so as to make him eligible which is not permissible.

2. Out of 4, Dr. Ajit Sebastian, Dr. P.S. Bhageerathy were not available on the assessment day. They also do not have 3 year experience as Jr.

Resident in Gynaecological Oncology. Hence, not eligible. Tutor is not a Designation in clinical subjects.

3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that in its meeting held on 06,05,2016, the Postgraduate Committee had recommended to the Central Government not to grant Letter of Permission in view of the following deficiencies :-

- 1. Still there is no independent department of Gynaecological Oncology. It is a unit under the department of OBGY.
- 2. As per compliance submitted by the college authorities, they have said that first two years of service in the institute may be treated as training which is not permissible.
- 3. *If Dr. Rachel Chandy and Amit Thomas are to be demoted, it is to done by the institute and not by MCI.*
- 4. If Dr. Ajit Sebastian is to be made Senior Resident, the college authorities have to do it and not by MCI. MCI cannot remove any person from the list and cannot demote any person.
- 5. All special training/fellowship of HOD Dr. Abraham Peedicayil is after he completed his Assistant Professorship. He has no 02 year special training at the time of joining as Asstt.Prof. in the department.
- 6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Committee noted that factual matrix in respect of Dr. Abraham Peedicavil, as noted above brings out that the College has submitted fake and forged documents for the purpose of obtaining permission. Further, the Committee decided that it may be brought to the notice of the Dean/Principal that the Declaration Forms in respect of the said faculty member has been duly signed by the Principal/Dean of the college that were submitted for the purpose of obtaining permission to start postgraduate course in M.Ch. (Gynaecological oncology) course at Christian Medical College, Vellore, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 and the clear presumption is that the college authorities have connived and submitted fake and forged documents with the purpose of obtaining positive recommendation from the Council for the starting of M.Ch. (Gynaecological oncology) course at Christian Medical College, Vellore, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/11/2016 that the above misdemeanor on part of the college has been viewed seriously by the Committee and it is presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities amounts to playing fraud upon the Council Authorities. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

"... 8(3)(1)

(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked / forged document:

*If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked / forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form* 

of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. that Academic Year and the next Academic Year also."

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided that a Show Cause Notice be issued to the College and an explanation be sought within 10 days as to why regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 should not be invoked against their institution and why their college should not be debarred for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. that Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.

The Committee also decided to refer the matter to the Ethics Committee.

In view of the above, the college had failed to abide by the undertaking it had given to the Central Govt. that there are no deficiencies in respect of the aforesaid course as per clause 1(ii) of the directions passed by the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee vide communication dated 20/08/2016. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Central Government vide its letter dated 20/08/2016 addressed to the Nilratan Sircar Medical College, Kolkata, West Bengal granted Letter of Permission for Starting of DM (Cardiac Anaesthesia) course for 2 seats for the academic year 2016-17, in light of directive dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee subject to submission of the following:

- *D*. An affidavit from the Dean/Principal and Chairman of the Trust/Society/ University/Company etc concerned, affirming fulfillment of all deficiencies and statements made in the respective compliance report submitted to MHFW by 22 June 2016.
- *ii.* A bank guarantee in the amount of Rs. 2 crore in favour of MCI, which will be valid for 1 year or until the first renewal assessment, whichever is later. Such bank guarantee will be in addition to the prescribed fee submitted alongwith the application.

Further, he is transferred straightaway as Professor in Cardiac Anaesthesia from the parent department of Anaesthesiology, which is not as per regulations.

2. With regard to deficiency of *Dr.* Haripada Das being not eligible as he does not have certificate of 2 years ' special training in Cardiac Anaesthesia *I* In the faculty table, his experience is shown as under:

From this it appears that the period spent by him in department of Anaesthesiology is being shown as training period as he worked in CTVS OT, which is not permissible.

- 3. With regard to deficiency of Senior Resident, this Institute has also pointed out that SR is not mandatory as per Para 11.1 of PG Medical Education Regulations. However, Dr. Monalisa Dutta is D.M. in Cardiac Anaesthesia) & shown as Senior Resident. However in faculty table she is designated as RMO cum Clinical Tutor, and not Sr. Resident.
- 4. The contention of college authorities that there is no requirement of Sr. Resident in super-speicality courses is incorrect. As per General instructions in MSR regarding requirements of staff in clinical departments, it is clearly laid down that minimum staff complement in each unit shall consists of Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor, Sr. Resident and Jr. Resident. This is also clarified in the decision of the General Body of the Council held in its meeting dated 11/03/2010 that for calculating requirement of Sr. Resident a unit with 30 beds will be considered as unit in Broad specialisties and a unit with 20 beds in super-specialities.
- 5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that in its meeting held on 06,05,2016, the Postgraduate Committee had recommended to the Central Government not to grant Letter of Permission in view of the following deficiencies :-

- 1. Dr. Aniruddha Saha, Senior Resident does not possess 3 years experience in the department of Cardiac Anaesthesia; hence not qualified to hold the post.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Central Government vide its letter dated 20/08/2016 addressed to the Saveetha Medical College and Hospital, Kanchipuram, Tamilnadu granted Letter of Permission for Starting of DM(Cardiology) course for 2 seats for the academic year 2016-17, in light of directive dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee subject to submission of the following:

- *D*. An affidavit from the Dean/Principal and Chairman of the Trust/Society/ University/Company etc concerned, affirming fulfillment of all deficiencies and statements made in the respective compliance report submitted to MHFW by 22 June 2016.
- *ii.* A bank guarantee in the amount of Rs. 2 crore in favour of MCI, which will be valid for 1 year or until the first renewal assessment, whichever is later. Such bank guarantee will be in addition to the prescribed fee submitted alongwith the application.

The assessment report was considered by the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/11/2016, wherein the Committee observed as under:-

- 1. Dr. A.G. Narayanswamy, Senior Resident does not possess 3 years experience in Cardiology in a medical college affiliated hospital; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
- 2. Bed Occupancy is 40 % on day of assessment.
- 3. There was Nil patient in ICCU on day of assessment.
- 4. There is gross discrepancy between registers, ECHO reports & computer data.
- 5. Specialty clinic registers are not maintained.
- 6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that in its meeting held on 13,04,2016, the Postgraduate Committee had recommended to the Central Government not to grant Letter of Permission in view of the following deficiencies :-

- 1. The only Unit still has 40 beds. Deficiency remains as it is. Posting of additional faculty in the Unit cannot be allowed to have beds in excess of maximum permissible as per Regulations.
- 2. Dr. Nagamony does not have 3 years experience as Resident in the department in a medical college; hence is not qualified to hold the post. Deficiency remains as it is.
- 3. In the faculty table, Dr. Asha Moorthy is shown as "Professor" in the column of "Designation"; however, in the column of experience, it is shown that she is working at Sri Ramachandra Medical College as Professor w.e.f. 24/03/2014 till date. Thus, she is working at two institutes simultaneously, which is not permissible.
- 4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the college had failed to abide by the undertaking it had given to the Central Govt. that there are no deficiencies in respect of the aforesaid course as per clause 1(ii) of the directions passed by the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee vide communication dated 20/08/2016. The Postgraduate Committee, after due deliberation and discussion, have decided that the college has failed to comply with the stipulation laid down by the Oversight Committee. - 2. Dr. Sushmita Namdeo, Senior Resident does not possess 3 years experience in the department as Resident; hence not qualified to be appointed as Senior Resident. Deficiency remains as it is.
- 3. Dr. B. Rajammal:
- *a.* In the old report, he worked at Amrita Institute from 09/09/1988 to 2001. In the compliance he is shown to have worked at Alleppy during this period.
- b. In old Assessment Report, he was shown as Professor at Amrita Institute from 01/06/2002 to 31/07/2015. In the compliance he is shown as Asst. Professor from 2002 to 2007, Assoc. Professor from 2007 to 2011 and Professor from 2011 till date.
- 4. Dr. Vivek Krishnan:
- a. In compliance, he is shown to have done fellowship in Fatal Medicine w.e.f. 2012 to 2013 and 2013 to 2014. No such fellowship shown in old report. He was only shown as Asst. Professor from 21/04/2014 till date.
- 5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Committee noted that factual matrix in respect of Dr. B. Rajammal and Dr. Jaya Benny as noted above brings out that the College has submitted fake and forged documents for the purpose of obtaining permission. Further, the Committee decided that it may be brought to the notice of the Dean/Principal that the Declaration Forms in respect of the said faculty member has been duly signed by the Principal/Dean of the college that were submitted for the purpose of obtaining permission to start postgraduate course in DM (Reproductive Medicine) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Elamkara, Kochi, Kerala under Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University (Deemed), Coimbatore U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 and the clear presumption is that the college authorities have connived and submitted fake and forged documents with the purpose of obtaining positive recommendation from the Council for the starting of DM (Reproductive Medicine) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Elamkara, Kochi, Kerala under Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham University (Deemed), Coimbatore U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/11/2016 that the above misdemeanor on part of the college has been viewed seriously by the Committee and it is presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities amounts to playing fraud upon the Council Authorities. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

"... 8(3)(1)

(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked / forged document:

If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked / forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. that Academic Year and the next Academic Year also."

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided that a Show Cause Notice be issued to the College and an explanation be sought within 10 days as to why regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 should not be invoked against their institution and why their college should not be debarred for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. that Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.

Prof. after cut-off date on 31/08/2015; however, in the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table, it is stated "No" implying NIL publications against requirement of 2 as per Regulations; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations&she cannot be considered. Unit-I has no other Assoc.Prof.
- 2. Dr. T. Uma is promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date on 31/08/2015; however, in the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table, it is stated "No" implying NIL publications against requirement of 2 as per Regulations; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations&she cannot be considered. Unit-II left with two faculty.
- 3. Dr. D. Srilakshmi is promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date on 01/10/2016; however, in the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table, it is stated "No" implying NIL publications against requirement of 2 as per Regulations; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations&she cannot be considered.
- 4. Dr. N. Lakshmi Sowbhagya, Senior Resident does not possess any experience as Resident in a medical college hospital; hence not qualified to hold the post. No other Sr. Resident in Unit-III.
- 5. Dr. K. Ramana, Senior Resident has only 2 years experience as Resident in a medical college hospital against requirement of 3 years required; hence not qualified to hold the post.
- 6. Biometric attendance and attendance of faculty members do not match.
- 7. Total number of deliveries is decreasing constantly. From 3,308 in 2012 to the number of deliveries has decreased to 3,136 in 2015 as pointed out in last report. In present report, as per present rate and data submitted by institute total deliveries would be around 3,000 in 2016. Deficiency remains as it is.
- 8. Elective&Emergency O.T. lists&relevant Statistics are not maintained.
- 9. O.T. list initiated is not completed on the same day. It was not possible to trace four cases posted as elective O.T. cases till end of assessment.
- 10. Full time teaching staff are not attending PG teaching programme. It amounts to ghost faculty. It was observed that only 2-3 teachers are attending PG teaching out of 17 teaching staff.
- 11. PG teaching programme is not circulated to faculty members&no documentation exists to this regard.
- 12. Pathology department is not able to trace relevant statistics of specimens sent by O.G. department case wise, month wise.
- 13. Pre Anaesthetic examination register is not maintained. Specialty wise workload could not be provided till end of assessment.
- 14. Minor O.T. statistics are not maintained.
- 15. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

- 3. Units III&IV are headed by Asst. Prof.&have 2 faculty each; hence they cannot be considered as a teaching Units.
- 4. There are NIL research publications from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years. Deficiency remains as it is.

- 2. Dr. K. Muthuraj is shown as "Professor" in the column of "Designation" in the faculty table; however in the column of experience, he is shown as "Associate Professor" w.e.f. 18/02/2015 till date, which is not feasible.
- 3. Dr. Periasamy is shown as "Professor" in the column of "Designation" in the faculty table; however in the column of experience, he is shown as "Associate Professor" w.e.f. 13/03/20006 in various colleges and at this institute w.e.f 15/04/2016 till date. Date of promotion as Professor is not shown in the column of "Experience."

- 1. Dr. A. Bhalla, Professor&HOD is promoted as Asso. Prof. in Surgical Gastroenterology with experience of only 3 years as Asst. Prof. in General Surgery which is not permissible. He has NIL experience as Asst. Prof. in Surgical Gastroenterology. Further he is promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however details of his research publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence it cannot be verified whether his promotion as Professor is as per Regulations or not.
- 2. None of 3 Senior Residents has any experience as Resident in Surgical Gastroenterology before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
- 3. Col. Sreejith A, Asst.Prof. has no certificate of 2 years special training in G.I. Surgery (from Amrita Institute, Kochi). Hence, not eligible.

- 4. One remark was that *I*The only Unit has 20 teaching&10 non-teaching beds. It is not clarified whether there is separate staff for non-teaching beds.*I*In present assessment the same number of teaching&non-teaching beds are shown&there is no clarification regarding management of non-teaching beds.
- 5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

- 1. No reply to original 5 deficiencies have been given in the compliance verification assessment report. Since, nothing has been stated about them, they stay as such.
- 2. Discrepancy of salary of faculty Senior faculty getting less salary than his junior staff
- 3. Salary slips of other Residents could not be provided;
- 4. In the present compliance the college authorities have only specified about experience given to faculty prior to first LOP when college was not in existence. The college has stated that LOP was given with same faculty which cannot be accepted. One mistake can not form the basis for its perpetuation.
- 5. Institute should reply to all deficiencies pointed out in the beginning and get them verified after rectification.
- 6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

- 1. Dr. Jayanthi Arulneyam is promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table is left blank implying NIL publications against requirement of 4 as per Regulations; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations&he cannot be considered.
- 2. In present assessment, Dr. Georgi Abraham is shown as working as Professor at this institute since 01/11/2008. However his name is not shown in faculty list in assessment dt. 10/04/2015. Further, his name does not appear in any of 4 Units in the faculty table provided during that assessment. Further, the details of experience provided during

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (21.05.2013, 09.07.2015&21.03.2016) and compliance dated 20/05/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD (Biochemistry) qualification for 02 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Dr Vaishampayan Memorial Medical College, Solapur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

### 100. <u>Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Renewal of</u> recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 02 seats and recognition against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats in respect of students being trained at Institute of Naval Medicine, INHS, Aswini.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (14/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 11/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 02 seats and recognition against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats at Institute of Naval Medicine, INHS, Aswini granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (14/03/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and compliance dated 11/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that the recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 02 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Institute of Naval Medicine, INHS, Aswini be renewed.

The Committee also decided to recommend to the Central Government that the MD(Pathology) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashikin respect of students being trained at Institute of Naval Medicine, INHS, Aswini be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of

recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

# 101. <u>Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition</u> ofMS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Latur.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015&01.04.2016) and compliance dated 06/06/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 2 seats at Govt. Medical College, Latur granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (June, 2015&01.04.2016) and compliance dated 06/06/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognizeMS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 2 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Latur because of the following facts:-

- 1. Dr. J.G. Agroya is appointed as Asso. Prof. vide order dt. 09/02/2016 on contract for 120 days only. Hence his appointment is not as per Regulations&he cannot be considered.
- 2. Dr. Shashikant, Asst. Prof. is DNB from non-teaching institute. He does not have requisite experience as Resident in a medical college hospital. Hence his appointment is not as per Regulations. Deficiency remains as it is.
- 3. Dr. S.R. Gawali, Assoc.Prof. was absent on the day of assessment. Unit left only with 2 Lecturer. It cannot be considered a PG Unit.
- 4. Out of total 60 beds in 2 wards, 10 beds are shared by ENT department; resultantly there are only 50 functional beds in 2 Units which is not as per Regulations.
- 5. There was only 01 Major&NIL Daycare Operation on day of assessment
- 6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:  $\square$  This permission for starting  $\checkmark$  increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject. $\square$ 

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2013) and compliance dated 07/08/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Paediatrices) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats at Command Hospital, Kolkata granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2013) and compliance dated 07/08/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to recognizeMD(Paediatrices) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata in respect of students being trained at Command Hospital, Kolkata because of the following facts:-

- 1. Professor & HOD was not available on day of assessment.
- 2. Dr. Subhash C. Shaw is promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however there is only 1 research publication against requirement of 2; a chapter in a book cannot be equated with a research publication; resultantly there is only 1 research publication to his credit against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations&he cannot be considered.
- 3. OPD attendance was 80 on day of assessment.
- 4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2 to 3 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

 $\square$  This permission for starting  $\checkmark$  increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject. $\square$

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014, 06.07.2015&10.03.2016) and compliance dated 13/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 02 seats at Command Hospital, Lucknow granted by Chhatrapati Shahuji Maharaj Medical University, Lucknow.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (21/10/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2014, 06.07.2015&10.03.2016) and compliance dated 13/04/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS(General Surgery) qualification for 02 seats granted by Chhatrapati Shahuji Maharaj Medical University, Lucknow in respect of students being trained at Command Hospital, Lucknow be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

# 104. Increase of seats in MD(Radio-Diagnosis) course at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical&Health Sciences, Dehradun, Uttarakhand under H. N. B Garhwal University U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (15th July 2016) together with the order dated 02/05/2016 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and compliance dated 03/09/2016 submitted by the college authorities for Increase of seats in MD(Radio-Diagnosis) course at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical&Health

Sciences, Dehradun, Uttarakhand under H. N. B Garhwal University U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (15th July 2016) together with the order dated 02/05/2016 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and compliance dated 03/09/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

- 1. Dr. Sharad Kumar Gangrade is not eligible to be a Senior Resident. He is DNB and does not possess 3 years experience as Resident in a Medical College hospital. Reference made by the institute to letter of Govt. of India dt. 10/12/2014 to the effect that *DNB candidates can be appointed as Senior Resident after completing DNB* is of no relevance as the Regulations stipulate experience of 3 years as Resident and an executive letter cannot override a Statutory Regulation. Deficiency remains as it is.
- 2. With regard to Dr. Shobhit Chandra, Senior Resident, he possesses experience of only 2 years 10 months as Resident against requirement of 3 years before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. Further, the details of experience provided during assessments dt. 10/09/2015 & dt. 15/07/2016 are at variance as shown under:

It was also observed that while in assessment dt. 15/07/2016, he is shown as having worked at this institute from 15/05/2007 to 30/03/2008, no such experience was shown at assessment dt. 10/09/2015.

Such retrospective changes are not permissible. Hence he cannot be considered.

- 3. Deficiency of *"Workload of CT guided FNAC is very low:*, no compliance is submitted. Deficiency remains as it is.
- 4. With regard to remark that DSA is not available, it is stated that "DSA is *available in the institute*" but it is not specified whether it is available in this department or not.
- 4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Committee noted that factual matrix in respect of Dr. Shobhit Chandra as noted above brings out that the College has submitted fake and forged documents for the purpose of obtaining permission. Further, the Committee decided that it may be brought to the notice of the Dean/Principal that the Declaration Forms in respect of the said faculty member has been duly signed by the Principal/Dean of the college that were submitted for the purpose of obtaining permission to increase of seats postgraduate course in MD(Radio-Diagnosis) course at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical&Health Sciences, Dehradun, Uttarakhand under H.N.B Garhwal University U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 and the clear presumption is that the college authorities have connived and submitted fake and forged documents with the purpose of obtaining positive recommendation from the Council for the increase of seats in MD(Radio-Diagnosis) course at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical&Health Sciences, Dehradun, Uttarakhand under H. N. B Garhwal University U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/11/2016 that the above misdemeanor on part of the college has been viewed seriously by the Committee and it is presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities amounts to playing fraud upon the Council Authorities. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

#### 8(3)(1)

(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked / forged document:

If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked / forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. that Academic Year and the next Academic Year also."

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided that a Show Cause Notice be issued to the College and an explanation be sought within 10 days as to why regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 should not be invoked against their institution and why their college should not be debarred for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. that Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.

The Committee also decided to refer the matter to the Ethics Committee.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MD(Radio-Diagnosis) course at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical&Health Sciences, Dehradun, Uttarakhand under H. N. B Garhwal University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The decision be conveyed to the Oversight Committee and Central Govt. with copy to college authorities for submission of compliance within time period as the matter is time bound u/s 10A.

The minutes of this item is read and confirmed in this meeting itself.

# 105. <u>Starting of MS(OBG) course at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of</u> <u>Medical&Health Sciences, Dehradun, Uttarakhand under H. N. B</u> <u>Garhwal University U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year</u> <u>2017-18.</u>

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (16th July 2016) together with the order dated 02/05/2016 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and compliance dated 03/09/2016 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of MS(OBG) course at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical&Health Sciences, Dehradun, Uttarakhand under H. N. B Garhwal University U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

- 1. Dr. Rajiv Acharya, Professor- as per notification Armed Forces Officers to be designated as Assoc.Prof. should have worked for atleast 5 years as graded/classified specialists in a recognized hospital of defence services Dr. Rajiv Acharya was never graded specialist. He has been shown Assoc.Prof. only after working as classified specialist for 3 years and 3 months instead of 5 years, which is not as per regulations.
- 2. Faculty table with signatures of faculty&Residents is not provided.
- 3. Dr. Shweta Jain is not eligible to be a Senior Resident She is DNB and does not possess 3 years experience as Resident in a Medical College hospital. Reference made by the institute to DNB Gazette is of no relevance as the Regulations stipulate experience of 3 years as Residentand an executive letter cannot override a Statutory Regulation. Deficiency remains as it is.
- 4. ART services are not available. IUI Laboratory cannot be equated with full-fledged ART services.
- 5. No breakup of 5085 surgeries (Major Operation, Minor Operation, Deliveries, Caesarian Section) is provided. Typing mistakes cannot be at all places.
- 6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MS(OBG) course at Shri Guru Ram Rai Institute of Medical&Health Sciences, Dehradun, Uttarakhand under H. N. B Garhwal University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The decision be conveyed to the Oversight Committee and Central Govt. with copy to college authorities for submission of compliance within time period as the matter is time bound u/s 10A.

#### The minutes of this item is read and confirmed in this meeting itself.

## 106. <u>Starting of DM(Cardiology) course at Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed</u> <u>University Medical College&Hospital, Pune under Bharati Vidyapeeth</u>

# University (Deemed), Pune U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (17/11/2016) along with theCouncil Assessor's Report (30th November 2015) and letter of permission dated 20/08/2016 received from the Central Government in light of directives dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee for Starting of DM (Cardiology) course at Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University Medical College & Hospital, Pune under Bharati Vidyapeeth University (Deemed), Pune U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Central Government vide its letter dated 20/08/2016 addressed to the Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University Medical College & Hospital, Pune granted Letter of Permission for Starting of DM (Cardiology) course for 2 seats for the academic year 2016-17, in light of directive dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee subject to submission of the following:

- *D*. An affidavit from the Dean/Principal and Chairman of the Trust/Society/ University/Company etc concerned, affirming fulfillment of all deficiencies and statements made in the respective compliance report submitted to MHFW by 22 June 2016.
  - A bank guarantee in the amount of Rs. 2 crore in favour of MCI, which will be valid for 1 year or until the first renewal assessment, whichever is later. Such bank guarantee will be in addition to the prescribed fee submitted alongwith the application.
- iii. Government Colleges would submit an undertaking on the same lines, which are signed by Chief Secretary / Health Secretary of the respective State to MHFW.

2. The OC has also stipulated as follows:

ii.

- (a) OC may direct inspection to verify the compliance submitted by the college and considered by OC, anytime after 30 September 2016.
- (b) In default of the conditions (i) (ii) and (iii) in para 1 above as applicable, and if the compliances are found incomplete in the inspection to be conducted after 30 September 2016, such college (including Government College) will be debarred from fresh intake of students for 2 years commencing 2017-18.

Thereafter in pursuance of the directives of the Oversight Committee dated 24/09/2016, the assessment of the Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University Medical College & Hospital, Pune has been carried out by the Council Assessor on 17/11/2016. The assessment report was considered by the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/11/2016, wherein the Committee observed as under:-

1. With regard to Dr. Chandrakant Chavan, the details of experience provided during assessments dt. 30/11/2015&dt. 17/11/2016 are at variance as shown under:

Such retrospective changes are not permissible. Hence he cannot be considered.

- 2. Dr. Anuja Mulay; Dr. Sachin Lakade, both Senior Residents do not possess 3 years experience in Cardiology in a medical college hospital; hence not qualified to hold the post.
- 3. Dr. Raghav Lumb; Dr. Matin Parkar, both Senior Residents do not possess 3 years experience in Cardiology; hence not qualified to hold the post.
- 4. Resultantly there is no eligible Senior Resident in the department.
- 5. Dr. Rahul Sawant, Asst.Prof. is shown as Asst.Prof. in this college from 01.08.2015. However, in the assessment dated 30.11.2015 he is not shown as Asst.Prof. he is shown as Sr. Resident from 02.03.2015 till date, such retrospective changes are not permissible and he cannot be considered.
- 5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that in its meeting held on 13.04.2016, the Postgraduate Committee had recommended to the Central Government not to grant Letter of Permission in view of the following deficiencies :-

- 1. Average daily OPD is 35-40.
- 2. None of the Senior Residents has 3 years experience as Resident in the department; hence not qualified to hold the post.
- 3. Dr. Chandrakant Chauhan, Assoc. Professor is shown Asst. Professor from 01/08/2008 to 01/08/2010 in the Assessment Report. In the compliance, he is shown as Senior Resident from 01/08/2007 to 31/07/2009. He was shown Assoc. Further, the Committee decided that it may be brought to the notice of the Dean/Principal that the Declaration Forms in respect of the said faculty member has been duly signed by the Principal/Dean of the college that were submitted for the purpose of obtaining permission to start postgraduate course in DM (Cardiology) course at Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University Medical College & Hospital, Pune under Bharati Vidyapeeth University (Deemed), Pune U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17 and the clear presumption is that the college authorities have connived and submitted fake and forged documents with the purpose of obtaining positive recommendation from the Council for the starting of DM (Cardiology) course at Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University Medical College & Hospital, Pune under Bharati Vidyapeeth University (Deemed), Pune U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/11/2016 that the above misdemeanor on part of the college has been viewed seriously by the Committee and it is presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities amounts to playing fraud upon the Council Authorities. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

#### 8(3)(1)

(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked / forged document:

If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked / forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. that Academic Year and the next Academic Year also."

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided that a Show Cause Notice be issued to the College and an explanation be sought within 10 days as to why regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 should not be invoked against their institution and why their college should not be debarred for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. that Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (18/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th November 2015) and letter of permission dated 20/08/2016 received from the Central Government in light of directives dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee for Starting of M.Ch. ( Urology/Genito-Urinary Surgery) course at Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University Medical College&Hospital, Pune under Bharati Vidyapeeth University (Deemed), Pune U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

- 1. Dr. K.P. Vartak, Asso. Prof. was on leave on day of assessment. It is not know how he has signed the faculty table which is supposed to be signed in front of Assessor.
- 2. Dr. Ibrahim Kothawala, Senior Resident does not have 3 years experience as Resident in a medical college hospital; hence not qualified to hold the post.
- 3. Dr. Hrishikesh Deshmukh, Senior Resident does not have 3 years experience as Resident in a medical college hospital; hence not qualified to hold the post.
- 4. Dr. Kshitij Raghuvanshi & Dr. Abid Raval, both Senior Residents do not have 3 years experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
- 5. Dr. Devender Kumar Jain is shown graded/qualified specialist and Advisor in surgery and urology both which is not feasible.
- 6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that in its meeting held on 13,04,2016, the Postgraduate Committee had recommended to the Central Government not to grant Letter of Permission in view of the following deficiencies :-

- 1. Dr. S.P. Dhangar, Senior Resident does not possess 3 years experience as Resident in the department in a medical college; hence not qualified to hold the post.
- 2. Deficiency 2 stays as such. Dr. Ibrahim Kothawala has only 1 year 10 months experience instead of required 3 years at the time of appointment as Asst. Professor. His experience at Ruby Hall cannot be counted.
- 3. There is no Certificate of experience from Competent Authority of the Office of Director General Armed Forces Medical Services (DGAFMS) specifying the subject, period and place of posting as Graded Specialist, Classified Specialist and advisor without which their equated teaching designations cannot be calculated. No other certificate signed by any other authority will be entertained.
- 4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the college had failed to abide by the undertaking it had given to the Central Govt. that there are no deficiencies in respect of the aforesaid course as per clause 1(ii) of the directions passed by the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee vide communication dated 20/08/2016. Dr. Pradeep Suryanvanshi, professor & HOD is promoted as Professor after cut-off date; out of 5 publications cited in the list of publications in the faculty table, in 2 he is 3<sup>rd</sup> author & cannot be considered; resultantly there are only 3 research publications to his credit against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
- 2. Dr. Sujata Deshpande was promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table, it is stated "No" implying NIL publications against requirement of 2 as per Regulations; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
- 3. Dr. Amol Pokharkar; Dr. Rameshwar, both Senior Residents do not have experience of 3 years as Resident in Neonatology before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. Resultantly, there is no eligible Senior Resident.
- 4. With regard to Dr. Nandini Malshe, the details of experience provided during assessments dt. 05/02/2016 & dt. 18/11/2016 are at variance as shown under:

During her IAP Neonatology Fellowship at Rainbow Hospital, Hyderabad, she was also shown as Assistant Professor in Paediatrics upto 31/12/2010 & in Neonatology from 01/01/2011 in earlier assessment report; in the present assessment report, she is shown as Assistant Professor in Paediatrics upto 31/12/2009 so as to escape overlap & in Neonatology from 01/01/2011 which also coincides with period of her Fellowship in Rainbow Hospital, Hyderabad which is not permissible as she cannot be in two places simultaneously. Her Clinical Fellowship in Neonatology from April 2004 to March 2005 also coincided with Junior Residency as shown in earlier report which has now been changed to end on 31/03/2004 so as to escape the overlap.

Such retrospective changes are not permissible. Hence she cannot be considered.

5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that in its meeting held on 13,04,2016, the Postgraduate Committee had recommended to the Central Government not to grant Letter of Permission in view of the following deficiencies :-

- Dr. Pradeep Suryavanshi Deficiency stays as such. His period of trainee cannot be counted as experience. He is promoted Professor after the cut-off date on 01/03/2015 without any publications, which is not as per Regulations.

- a. In earlier report, from 01/04/2004 to 31/03/2005, no fellowship training was shown to her credit, which has now been shown in the compliance.

- 3. All dates and designations have been changed from previous report, which is not permissible. The Dean may be asked to explain, how these changes have been done.

Ostensibly such a change has been made because while considering assessment report dt. 30/11/2015, PG Committee at its meeting dt. 15/03/2016 had decided that "Prof. S.S. Iyer has not worked as Asst. Prof. in Critical Care Medicine. His experience in ICU cannot be counted. Resultantly his promotion is not as per Regulations. **I**Contention of the institute that "Intensive Care Medicine" & "Critical Care Medicine" are synonymous is neither relevant nor applicable as "Intensive Care Medicine" is different from "ICU" and as such "ICU" forms a small segment of "Critical Care Medicine". Such retrospective changes are not permissible.

Further, although he is promoted as Professor after cut-off date, details of his research publications are not provided in the faculty table.

In view of above, he cannot be considered. Deficiency remains as such.

- 2. Dr. Sampada Kulkarni; Dr. Prashant Jedge; Dr. Abhay Khare, all Senior Residents do not have 3 years experience as Resident in the department of Critical Care Medicine; hence not qualified to hold the post.
- 3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that in its meeting held on 13/04/2016, the Postgraduate Committee had recommended to the Central Government not to grant Letter of Permission in view of the following deficiencies :-

- 1. Experience of Dr. S.S. Iyer as Senior Resident, Lecturer and Asst. Professor has been changed from ICU (earlier report) to Critical Care Medicine in the compliance, which is not permissible.
- 2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

As per General instructions in MSR regarding requirements of staff in clinical departments, it is clearly laid down that minimum staff complement in each unit shall consists of Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor, Sr. Resident and Jr. Resident. This is also clarified in the decision of the General Body of the Council held in its meeting dated 11/03/2010 that for calculating requirement of Sr. Resident a unit with 30 beds will be considered as unit in Broad specialisties and a unit with 20 beds in super-specialities.
- 3. There is 1 SR available who was DM Trainee for 3 years from 01/08/2013 to 31/07/2016 and SR from 01/08/2016. However, there are 2 Units and remaining all other 8 SRs are not having experience of 3 years in the department.

- 5. Dr. Suresh E R, Asst.Prof. appeared in DM yet not passed. Hence, not eligible.
- 6. The contention of college authorities that there is no requirement of Sr. Resident in super-speicality courses is incorrect. As per General instructions in MSR regarding requirements of staff in clinical departments, it is clearly laid down that minimum staff complement in each unit shall consists of Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor, Sr. Resident and Jr. Resident. The Postgraduate Committee, after due deliberation and discussion, have decided that the college has failed to comply with the stipulation laid down by the Oversight Committee. Accordingly, the Postgraduate Committee recommends that as per the directions passed by Oversight Committee in para 2(b) vide communication dated 20/08/2016 the college should be debarred from admitting students in the above course for a period of two academic years i.e. 2017-18 & 2018-19 as even after giving an undertaking that they have fulfilled the entire infrastructure for starting the super-speciality course in the speciality of DM (Medical Oncology) the college was found to be grossly deficient. It has also been decided by the Post Graduate Committee that the Bank Guarantee furnished by the college in pursuance of the directives passed by the Oversight Committee as well as GOI letter dated 20/08/2016 is liable to be encashed.

Sunil KS Bhadoria, Section Officer, Ministry of Health&Family Welfare, New Delhi forwarding therewith a copy of Ministry's letter dated 15/07/2016 with regard to proposal of Central Govt. for incentives for Doctors serving in remote and/ or difficult areas.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 19/05/2016 received from Sh. Ali R. Rizvi, Joint Secretary, Govt. of India, Ministry of Health&Family Welfare, New Delhi along with the letter dated 18/10/2016 received from Sh. Sunil KS Bhadoria, Section Officer, Ministry of Health&Family Welfare, New Delhi forwarding therewith a copy of Ministry's letter dated 15/07/2016 with regard to proposal of Central Govt. for incentives for Doctors serving in remote and/ or difficult areas.

The Committee noted that the matter involves wide ranging issues, the PG Committee proposed that the President may constitute a Sub-Committee taking members from the Executive Committee, Postgraduate Committee&Academic Council and other and its recommendations be placed in the General Body.

Matter pertains to extending scope of Section 9(2)(d) of PG Medical Education Regulations providing for weightage in marks @ 10%/year of service in remote&difficult areas upto maximum 30 % for those who have served in remote or difficult areas.

Central Govt. vide letter dt. 19/05/2016 had requested for consideration of following incentives to Doctors who have served in remote/difficult areas:

- (1) Expanding reservation of 50 **%** reservation in Diploma courses for inservice doctors to Regular PG courses as well as Senior Residency;
- (2) Conversion of bond for PG studies to irrevocable Bank Guarantee;
- (3) Provision of Mandatory deregistration of MBBS/PG doctors who do not render service in Rural areas as per bond conditions;
- (4) Shifting of Internship to District hospitals.

Subsequently vide letter dt. 15/07/2016, Govt. of India intimated that it was decided by the Ministry that Proviso to Section 9(2)(d) be amended so as to provide that upto 50 % of seats in PG degree courses&Senior Resident positions for Medical officers in Govt. service who have served in remote&difficult areas for a period which shall not less than 2 years. Further, after acquiring PG Degree/ Completing Senior Residency, he shall serve for further 2 years. In this letter, reference of a case in Hon'ble Supreme Court is also cited wherein decision of UP State Govt. to reserve 30 % PG seats for in-service candidates. When merit list was redrawn after providing 30 % weightage as per Hon'ble Court's directions, it was observed that this had distorted combined merit list leaving virtually no scope for fresh candidates.

Legal Section be asked to provide latest status of the case in Supreme Court and bring the item after that.

Presently, for the remaining proposed amendments (i.e. 9(3), 13.2, 14), the Council has received a letter from Central Govt. that the Ministry had sought concurrence from OC. OC has requested to furnish the basis, decision process and implications of the proposed amendments, in particular to Section 13(2).

- 8. In the Departmental Library, number of books is shown as 124; however, number of books purchased in last 3 years is shown as 379 which is not feasible. This dichotomy needs to be clarified.

# 126. <u>Starting of DM (Medical Oncology) course at M.S. Ramaiah Medical</u> <u>College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences,</u> <u>Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.</u>

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (24/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (08/02/2016) and letter of permission dated 20/08/2016 received from the Central Government in light of directives dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee for Starting of DM (Medical Oncology) course at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Central Government vide its letter dated 20/08/2016 addressed to the M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore granted Letter of Permission for Starting of DM (Medical Oncology) course for 2 seats for the academic year 2016-17, in light of directive dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee subject to submission of the following:

- *I.* An affidavit from the Dean/Principal and Chairman of the Trust/Society/ University/Company etc concerned, affirming fulfillment of all deficiencies and statements made in the respective compliance report submitted to MHFW by 22 June 2016.
- *ii.* A bank guarantee in the amount of Rs. 2 crore in favour of MCI, which will be valid for 1 year or until the first renewal assessment, whichever is later. Such bank guarantee will be in addition to the prescribed fee submitted alongwith the application.
- iii. Government Colleges would submit an undertaking on the same lines, which are signed by Chief Secretary / Health Secretary of the respective State to MHFW.
- 2. The OC has also stipulated as follows:
  - (a) OC may direct inspection to verify the compliance submitted by the college and considered by OC, anytime after 30 September 2016.
  - (b) In default of the conditions (i) (ii) and (iii) in para 1 above as applicable, and if the compliances are found incomplete in the inspection to be conducted after 30 September 2016, such college (including Government College) will be debarred from fresh intake of students for 2 years commencing 2017-18.

Thereafter in pursuance of the directives of the Oversight Committee dated 24/09/2016, the assessment of the M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore has been carried out by the Council Assessor on 24/11/2016. The assessment report was considered by the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/11/2016, wherein the Committee observed as under:-

- 1. None of 3 Senior Residents possess 3 years experience as Resident in Medical Oncology; hence not qualified to hold the post.
- 2. Promotion of Dr. Vinayak M Maka, Assoc.Prof. is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 01.10.2014 after the cut of date. There are no publications quoted in the faculty table.
- 3. One remark was that Dr. Nalini Kilara was shown as Professor in General Medicine at this institute from 1992 to 1995. Then she could not have pursued D.M. course which she passed in 1995. Institute has stated in compliance that she was granted study leave. However she is appointed straightaway as Professor in Medical Oncology in 1995 from the post of Professor of General Medicine without any experience as Asst. Prof. or Asso. Prof. in Medical Oncology, which is not as per regulations.
- 4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that in its meeting held on 26,04,2016, the Postgraduate Committee had recommended to the Central Government not to grant Letter of Permission in view of the following deficiencies:-

- 1. Dr. B.J. Srinivas, Senior Resident passed DNB from non-teaching institution. He has no 3 years experience as Junior Resident in a medical college. Hence, not eligible.
- Dr. Nalini Kilara, Professor & HoD worked from 1992 to 1995 as Professor of General Medicine at M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore. Then, how could she pass DM (Oncology) in 1995 from Kidwai Memorial Hospital, Bangalore. It is not feasible that she worked at two places simultaneously.
   Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Accessment Pemort
- 3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the college had failed to abide by the undertaking it had given to the Central Govt. that there are no deficiencies in respect of the aforesaid course as per clause 1(ii) of the directions passed by the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee vide communication dated 20/08/2016. The Postgraduate Committee, after due deliberation and discussion, have decided that the college has failed to comply with the stipulation laid down by the Oversight Committee. Accordingly, the Postgraduate Committee recommends that as per the directions passed by Oversight Committee in para 2(b) vide communication dated 20/08/2016 the college should be debarred from admitting students in the above course for a period of two academic years i.e. 2017-18 & 2018-19 as even after giving an undertaking that they have fulfilled the entire infrastructure for starting the super-speciality course in the speciality of DM (Medical Oncology) the college was found to be grossly deficient. It has also been decided by the Post Graduate Committee that the Bank Guarantee furnished by the college in pursuance of the directives passed by the Oversight Committee as well as GOI letter dated 20/08/2016 is liable to be encashed.

The decision be conveyed to the Oversight Committee and Central Govt..

- 1. There is no Asso. Prof. in the only Unit; resultantly faculty complement is incomplete&it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
- 2. Dr. Somnath Mitra, Senior Resident does not have 3 years experience as Resident in the department before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
- 3. Dr. Ramendra Sundar Mukherjee, Professor was not available on the day of assessment.
- 4. Bed Occupancy of day of assessment was 70 %.
- 5. Equipment like DLCO is not available.
- 6. Treatment for MDR Tuberculosis is not available.
- 7. There is no separate RICU.
- 8. MRI workload for the whole hospital was only 06 on day of assessment.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of MD (Respiratory Medicine) course at KPC Medical College,Jadavpur, Kolkata, West Bengal underWest Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The decision be conveyed to the Oversight Committee and Central Govt. with copy to college authorities for submission of compliance within time period as the matter is time bound u/s 10A.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (23rd November 2016) for Starting of MD (Respiratory Medicine) course at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharasthra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (23rd November 2016) and noted the following:

- 1. Professor Dr. Amol Fuladi was absent on day of assessment.
- 2. Dr. Ashish Salkar, Senior Resident does not have any experience as Resident in a medical college hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
- 3. The only Unit has only 16 beds against minimum 30 required for a PG Unit as per Regulations.
- 4. Faculty table has not been signed by any of the faculty members.
- 5. OPD attendance was only 23 on day of assessment.
- 6. Bed Occupancy was 50 % on day of assessment.
- 7. There is NIL non-teaching staff in the department.
- 8. Specialty clinics like Respiratory Rehabilitation clinic, Asthma clinic, Bronchoscopy clinic are not available.
- 9. Equipment like PFT, Respiratory Stimulator, Breath gas Analyzer are not available.
- 10. Separate RICU is not available.
- 11. Departmental Library has only 10 books and no journal.
- 12. In the column of "Stipend paid to PG students", it is stated "Not Applicable" which is not correct. Stipend has to be paid to Residents @ rates paid by State Govt.
- 13. Space for faculty in the department is inadequate.
- 14. MRI is not available.
- 15. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of MD (Respiratory Medicine) course at Government Medical College, Akola, Maharasthra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The decision be conveyed to the Oversight Committee and Central Govt. with copy to college authorities for submission of compliance within time period as the matter is time bound u/s 10A.

The minutes of this item is read and confirmed in this meeting itself.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (23rd November 2016) and noted the following:

- 1. Dr. Mariam Philip is promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however only 2 research publications are cited in the list of publications in the faculty table against requirement of 4; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations&she cannot be considered.
- 2. Dr. Joan Felicita Samson is promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however only 1 research publication is cited in the list of publications in the faculty table against requirement of 4; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations&she cannot be considered. Resultantly there is no Professor in the department.
- 3. Workload of Skin Grafting procedures&LASER for Scare Revision was NIL in 2015.
- 4. Workload of the following procedures was very less in 2015:
  - (a) LASER for Pigment Removal: 03;
  - (b) LASER for Hair Reduction: 7;
  - (c) Nail Surgeries: 15.
- 5. Specialty clinic like Pigmentary clinic is not available.
- 6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Starting of MD (Dermatology, Venereology & Leprosy) course at Dr. Somervel Memorial CSI Hospital & Medical College, Karakonam, Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The decision be conveyed to the Oversight Committee and Central Govt. with copy to college authorities for submission of compliance within time period as the matter is time bound u/s 10A.

The minutes of this item is read and confirmed in this meeting itself.

### 132. <u>Starting of DM (Nephrology) course at T D Medical College, Alleppey,</u> <u>Allappuzha, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur</u> <u>U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.</u>

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (07/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (25th February 2016 and 2nd May, 2016) and order dated 29/08/2016 received from the Central Government for Starting of DM (Nephrology) course at T D Medical College, Alleppey, Allappuzha, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Central Government vide its letter dated 15/06/2016 addressed to the T D Medical College, Alleppey, Allappuzha, Kerala had granted permission for Starting of DM (Nephrology) course for 2 seats for the academic year 2016-17 in the light of order dated 08.08.2016 of the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala which read as under:-

"1. This writ petition is instituted in public interest.

2. We have heard learned counsel for the petitioner, learned Senior Government Pleader, learned counsel for Medical Council of India and learned counsel for KUHAS.

3. There are five reputed medical colleges under the Government of Kerala though some new ones have also mushroomed up under the Government. The five Medical Colleges of Thiruvananthapuram, Kottayam, Alappuzha, Thrissur and Kozhikode have Departments of Nephrology attached to them. In all those centres, there are facilities to have DM Nephrology, which is of critical importance in the matter of academics to ensure that there is sufficient manpbwer to face situations of nephrological failures, including secondary problems emanating out of Dengue Fevers etc.

4. In its substance, the writ petition reflects the grievance of the marginalised sectors of Alappuzha District which say that DM Nephrology course is not being extended for the current year under the premises that there is deficiency of staff and other factors. The MCI had conducted an inspection and found that two teachers, who were posted there, had not cleared the requirement of published papers before the cut off date. In the normal circumstances, we would not have come to the aid of an educational institution if we were to see that it is merely an attempt by an establishment to get seats created for advancing education and also may be, its institutional interest. But here is a case where Government caters to the larger interest of the public including the socio-economically marginalized. Under such circumstances, following previous deliberations, the State Government has transferred two teachers from two other colleges to Alappuzha Medical College. Both those two teachers now available are those who are stated to be fully qualified before the cut off date. Under such circumstances, all that remains is certain other infrastructure facilities which are of minor importance and will not have a sizable negative impact on the course at its commencement at least.

5. The pleadings reflect that there is a large-scale problem in the health sector in Alappuzha District including the Kuttanadu Belt where water logging has led to uncontrollable mosquito breeding and resultant Dengue, which is established to be one of the reasons for renal failure leading to requirement for dialysis and other supports. Such support mechanism for the marginalized class could be extended only through personnel who are at least undergoing DM Nephrology programs. It is also the requirement that people have access to the public facility through a Medical College rather than be pushed off to the private sector where it will be very costly to have medical support.

6. Taking the larger public interest into consideration, we order that the Union of India and the Medical Council of India will provisionally grant the requisite clearance and letter of permission and Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences (KUHAS) will give provisional affiliation or permission to have the course of DM Nephrology in the Alappuzha Medical College provisionally and subject to further orders in this writ petition, for two seats. We record the submission that there is a select list of available candidates as with the Director of Medical Education. Let the students who are taken into the course be notified at the time of admission, in writing, that they are being taken on provisional basis in terms of this provisional order and that everything will be subject to final decision of this writ petition.

7. We are sure that the Central Government and the Medical Council of India as well as the KUHAS will have a pro-active approach, having regard to the objects sought to be achieved through this order and therefore, the Medical Council of India and the Central Government will do the needful taking into consideration the letter and spirit of this order, without fail, at any rate before 26.8.2016.

Let the decision of the Medical Council of India and the Union of India be placed before this Court, within a period of one month."

Thereafter, the assessment of the T D Medical College, Alleppey, Allappuzha, Kerala has been carried out by the Council Assessor on 07/11/2016. The assessment report was considered by the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/11/2016, wherein the Committee observed as under:-

- 1. On day of assessment, only 2 faculty were present i.e. 1 Professor & 1 Asso. Prof. Remaining 2 faculty were absent & could not be verified. Resultantly, faculty complement is incomplete as only 2 faculty are available against requirement of 3 & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
- 2. Dr. Usha Samuel, Professor & HOD is promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however, there are NIL publications against requirement of 4 as per Regulations. Hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
- 3. Dr. K.S. Sanjeev Kumar, Asso. Prof., whose promotion as Assoc. Prof. was found to be not as per Regulations as there were Nil research publications against requirement of 2 is absent in present assessment; hence his credentials could not be verified.
- 4. There is no Senior Resident.
- 5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that in its meeting held on 06/05/2016, the Postgraduate Committee had recommended to the Central Government not to grant Letter of Permission in view of the following deficiencies :-

- 1. Dr. Usha Samuel has been promoted as Professor after the cut-off date without any publications. Hence, promotion is not as per Regulations.
- 2. Dr. Sanjeev Kumar K.S. promoted as Assoc. Professor after the cut-off date without any publications. Hence, his promotion is not as per Regulations.
- 3. *Resultantly, Faculty complement is incomplete.*
- 4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Committee was informed that SLP has been preferred against the order of the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala, which is as on date pending before the Hon'ble Supreme Court.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Committee, after due deliberation and discussion, keeping in view the order dated 08.08.2016 of the Hon'ble High Court in WP(C)No.23474/2016 and the provisional permission dated 29.08.2016 granted by the Central Government decided that the college has failed to fulfil the requirements of regulation for starting the course. As the permission has been granted provisionally on the directions of the Hon'ble High Court and the matter is pending before the Hon'ble High Court and the Hon'ble Supreme Court, the present inspection report alongwith deficiencies stated above be placed before the Hon'ble High Court and the Hon'ble Supreme Court.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (15/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (14/03/2016) and letter of permission dated 20/08/2016 received from the Central Government in light of directives dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee for Starting of DM (Gastroenterology) course at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Central Government vide its letter dated 20/08/2016 addressed to the Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool granted Letter of Permission for Starting of DM (Gastroenterology) course for 2 seats for the academic year 2016-17, in light of directive dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee subject to submission of the following:

- *"i. An affidavit from the Dean/ Principal and Chairman of the Trust/ Society/ University/ Company etc concerned, affirming fulfillment of all deficiencies and statements made in the respective compliance report submitted to MHFW by 22 June 2016.*
- *ii.* A bank guarantee in the amount of Rs. 2 crore in favour of MCI, which will be valid for 1 year or until the first renewal assessment, whichever is later. Such bank guarantee will be in addition to the prescribed fee submitted alongwith the application.

- 1. Promotion of Dr. B. Sankara Sarma, Professor, is not as per regulations. He was promoted Professor in September, 2015, there are no publications quoted in faculty table.
- 2. There is no Senior Resident.
- 3. Information on many items has not been provided by the Principal to the assessor during assessment as detailed in the report. Hence information in the assessment report is incomplete.
- 4. Average daily OPD is only 20-30.
- 5. Departmental Library needs to be upgraded.
- 6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that in its meeting held on 30,03,2016, the Postgraduate Committee had recommended to the Central Government not to grant Letter of Permission in view of the following deficiencies:-

- 1. As per SAF column 6, there are no beds of Gastroenterology, which means the department does not exist.
- 2. No orders of competent authority creating department of Gastroenterology and appointment and promotion orders of faculty in the department of Gastroenterology are attached. If there was no department of Gastroenterology, how could Professor & HoD, Dr. B. Sankara Sharma could work as Asst. Professor from 1999 to 2008 in Gastroenterology.
- 3. Postgraduate Degree of Dr. G. Mohan Reddy is not recognized.
- 4. Dr. V. Venkata Ranga, Assoc. Professor worked in Kurnool Medical College from 1999 to 2009. There are no orders of competent authority appointing him Asst. Professor in Gastroenterology. Hence, he cannot be considered.
- 5. Both the Senior Residents are MD (General Medicine) without 3 years experience as Junior Resident in a Medical College in Gastroenterology.
- 6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the college had failed to abide by the undertaking it had given to the Central Govt. that there are no deficiencies in respect of the aforesaid course as per clause 1(ii) of the directions passed by the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee vide communication dated 20/08/2016. The Postgraduate Committee, after due deliberation and discussion, have decided that the college has failed to comply with the stipulation laid down by the Oversight Committee. Accordingly, the Postgraduate Committee recommends that as per

- 4. There was only 1 Gynaec Major Operation on day of assessment. There was NIL Major&NIL Minor Obstetric Operation on day of assessment. All 9 Minor Gynaec Operation cases were Tubal Ligation.
- 5. Average Gynaec surgeries are only 2-3/week.
- 6. All patients in Gynaec ward had been brought in from Oncology department i.e. Carcinoma Cervix&Carcinoma Ovary and a few cases of Tubal Ligation.
- 7. Colposcope is non-functional on day of assessment.
- 8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to recommend to the Central Government not to grant letter of permission for Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad, Gujarat under Sardar Patel University, Vallabh Vidyanagar, Gujarat u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The decision be conveyed to the Oversight Committee and Central Govt. with copy to college authorities for submission of compliance within time period as the matter is time bound u/s 10A.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (24th November 2016) for Increase of seats in MD (Dermatology, Venereology&Leprosy) course at Mahatma Gandhi Missions Medical College, Aurangabad, Maharasthra under MGM Institute of Health Sciences (Deemed University), Navi Mumbai U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

- 1. At Item § 25 in Summary, Stipend paid by State Govt. to I/II/III year Residents is shown as Rs. 40,000; Rs. 41,000&Rs. 42,000 p.m. which is much less than that paid by State Govt. to Residents. In the column of "Stipend paid by Institute to Residents", the same amount is shown to make it appear that the Institute is paying stipend at rates of State Govt. which is not correct. Further, the Stipend paid by Institute to Residents is much less than that paid by State Govt. to Residents.
- 2. Total number of patients in OPD has decreased from 24,024 in 2013 to 23,143 in 2015.
- 3. At Item § 29 of Summary of "Remarks of Assessor", it is shown that at the end of day at 4 p.m., 62 patients were registered in OPD. However, at Item § 9 of Part II - Departmental Information, it is stated that OPD attendance upto 2 p.m. was 75.
- 4. Workload of the following procedures was very less in 2015:
  - (a) LASER for Scar Revision: NIL;
  - (b) Nail Surgeries: 04;
  - (c) Skin Grafting procedures: 05;
  - (d) LASER for Pigment Removal: 10;
  - (e) Cryo Surgical procedures: 31;
  - (f) Acne Surgery: 32.
- 5. Specialty clinics like Autoimmune Diseases clinic, Vesiculobullous Diseases clinic are not run.
- 6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Matter be placed before Ethics Committee for deficiencies at Sr. No.1(supplying wrong and misleading information about stipend).

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (07/11/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (09th March 2016) and letter of permission dated 20/08/2016 received from the Central Government in light of directives dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee for Starting of DM (Endocrinology) course at Medical College, Thiruvananthapuram under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2016-17.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the Central Government vide its letter dated 20/08/2016 addressed to the Medical College, Thiruvananthapuram granted Letter of Permission for Starting of DM (Endocrinology) course for 2 seats for the academic year 2016-17, in light of directive dated 23/09/2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee subject to submission of the following:

- *D*. An affidavit from the Dean/Principal and Chairman of the Trust/Society/ University/Company etc concerned, affirming fulfillment of all deficiencies and statements made in the respective compliance report submitted to MHFW by 22 June 2016.
- ii. A bank guarantee in the amount of Rs. 2 crore in favour of MCI, which will be valid for 1 year or until the first renewal assessment, whichever is later. Such bank guarantee will be in addition to the prescribed fee submitted alongwith the application.
- iii. Government Colleges would submit an undertaking on the same lines, which are signed by Chief Secretary / Health Secretary of the respective State to MHFW.

2. The OC has also stipulated as follows:

- (a) OC may direct inspection to verify the compliance submitted by the college and considered by OC, anytime after 30 September 2016.
- (b) In default of the conditions (i) (ii) and (iii) in para 1 above as applicable, and if the compliances are found incomplete in the inspection to be conducted after 30 September 2016, such college (including Government College) will be debarred from fresh intake of students for 2 years commencing 2017-18.

Thereafter in pursuance of the directives of the Oversight Committee dated 24/09/2016, the assessment of the Medical College, Thiruvananthapuram has been carried out by the Council Assessor on 07/11/2016. The assessment report was considered by the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/11/2016, wherein the Committee observed as under:-

1. Experience of Dr. P.K. Jabbar as Senior Resident, Lecturer & Assistant Professor has been changed from General Medicine department in earlier report to Endocrinology department in the present report as under:

Ostensibly such a change has been made to make him eligible because while considering assessment report dt. 09/03/2016, PG Committee at its meeting dt. 23/03/2016 had decided that "Dr. P.K. Jabbar, Professor & HOD has been appointed straightaway as Professor of Endocrinology from the post of Professor of Medicine on 17,08,2012. His experience is at this institute which is yet to receive permission to start PG course in Endocrinology. DSuch retrospective changes are not permissible. Hence he cannot be considered. Deficiency remains as such.

- 2. Another remark pointed out in earlier assessment was regarding Dr. C. Jayakumari, Asso. Prof. as she possesses M.D. qualification but no evidence of her receiving training in Endocrinology is shown. She was appointed straightaway as Asso. Prof. of Endocrinology from post of Asso. Prof. of General Medicine after cut-off date. However details of research publications were not provided. In present assessment report, deficiency remains as it is as no rectification of the deficiencies is shown.
- 3. There is no eligible Senior Resident who has 3 years experience as Resident in the department. Deficiency remains as such.
- 4. General Endocrinology OPD runs only once a week. On remaining days only Special clinics are held pertaining to a particular organ like Thyroid or disease like Diabetes or system like Reproductive Endocrinology which cannot be equated with general Endocrinology OPD. Deficiency remains as it is.
- 5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that in its meeting held on 12,05,2016, the Postgraduate Committee had recommended to the Central Government not to grant Letter of Permission in view of the following deficiencies:-

*Compliance is not satisfactory.* 

- 1. Deficiency regarding appointment of Dr. P.K. Jabbar & Dr. Jayakumari remain as they are.
- 2. There is no Senior Resident having 3 years experience as Resident in the subject.
- 3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Committee further decided to issue Show Cause Notice under regulations of 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999, for submitting fake and false documents in respect of Dr. P.K. Jabbar as to why the college should not be debarred from the processing of applications for postgraduate courses for 2 academic years i.e. 2017-18 & 2018-19.

The Committee also decided to refer the matter to the Ethics Committee.

In view of the above, the college had failed to abide by the undertaking it had given to the Central Govt. that there are no deficiencies in respect of the aforesaid course as per clause 1(ii) of the directions passed by the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee vide communication dated 20/08/2016. The Postgraduate Committee, after due deliberation and discussion, have decided that the college has failed to comply with the stipulation laid down by the Oversight Committee. Accordingly, the Postgraduate Committee recommends that as per the directions passed by Oversight Committee in para 2(b) vide communication dated 20/08/2016 the college should be debarred from admitting students in the above course for a period of two academic years i.e. 2017-18 & 2018-19 as even after giving an undertaking that they have fulfilled the entire infrastructure for starting the super-speciality course in the speciality of DM (Endocrinology)the college was found to be grossly deficient. It has also been decided by the Post Graduate Committee that the Bank Guarantee furnished by the college in pursuance of the directives passed by the Oversight Committee as well as GOI letter dated 20/08/2016 is liable to be encashed.

- 1. Dr. Vishal Marwaha is appointed as Professor for the first time after cut-off date on 09/11/2016; however the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table is left blank implying NIL publications against requirement of 4; hence his appointment is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
- 2. Resultantly there is no Professor in the Unit. Deficiency remains asit is.
- 3. Both the Senior Residents do not possess any experience as Resident in Rheumatology before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other eligible Senior Resident in the Unit.
- 4. Dr. Suma Balan, Asso. Prof. possesses only M.D. qualification. There is no evidence of her receiving special training in Rheumatology. Hence she is not eligible to hold the post. Deficiency remains as it is.
- 5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that in its meeting held on 13,04,2016, the Postgraduate Committee had recommended to the Central Government not to grant Letter of Permission in view of the following deficiencies :-

#### *Compliance is not satisfactory.*

1. No explanation is given for promoting Dr. Jyothi V.S. after cutoff date without research publications required as per Regulations. Further, she has acquired MRCP from Royal College of Physicians of U.K. in 2008 & also DNB (General

*medicine) from this institute in 2008 which is not feasible. Deficiency remains as it is.* 

- 2. Dr. Hasim Ahmed does not possess 3 years experience in the department as Resident; hence not qualified to be appointed as Senior Resident. Deficiency remains as it is.
- 3. Dr. Suman Balan was Asst. Professor from 06/07/2009 to 05/07/2014 and Assoc. Professor from 06/07/2014 till date in the Assessment Report. Now, in the compliance, she has been shown as Asst. Professor from 06/07/2009 to 06/07/2011; Assoc. Professor from 07/07/2011 to 06/07/2015 and she has been shown as Professor. She was shown Assoc. Professor during assessment. Dr. Suman Balan has been promoted as Professor after cutoff date; however details of her publications are not provided; hence it cannot be verified whether her promotion is as per Regulations or not.
- 4. Dr. Mithun C.B., Asst. Professor possesses DM (Clinical Immunology) and not DM (Rheumatology).
- 5. Books not yet purchased. Deficiency of books in departmental library stays as such.
- 6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the college had failed to abide by the undertaking it had given to the Central Govt. that there are no deficiencies in respect of the aforesaid course as per clause 1(ii) of the directions passed by the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee vide communication dated 20/08/2016. The Postgraduate Committee, after due deliberation and discussion, have decided that the college has failed to comply with the stipulation laid down by the Oversight Committee. Accordingly, the Postgraduate Committee recommends that as per the directions passed by Oversight Committee in para 2(b) vide communication dated 20/08/2016 the college should be debarred from admitting students in the above course for a period of two academic years i.e. 2017-18 & 2018-19 as even after giving an undertaking that they have fulfilled the entire infrastructure for starting the super-speciality course in the speciality of DM (Rheumatology)the college was found to be grossly deficient. The assessment report was considered by the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/11/2016, wherein the Committee observed as under:-

- 1. Dr. D.K. Vijayakumar, Prof. and HoD possessed MS(General Surgery), M.Ch. (Surgical Oncology). Thus, he does not possess any academic qualification in Gyanaecological Oncology). He has been appointed Professor of Gynaecological Oncology straightway on 01.04.2014 from the post of Professor of Head & Neck Oncology without any training and experience in Gynaecological Oncology.
- 2. Dr. R.Anupama, Assoc.Prof. possessed MD (Obstetrics & Gynaecology) qualification. She has no 2 year super-speciality training in Gynaecological Oncology. Hence not eligible.
- 3. Dr. Jayashree N, Asst.Prof. is MS Obstetrics & Gynaecology. She is shown Asst.Prof. from July, 2014 to Jan.,2015 at the same time she is shown as fellow from Jan., 2014 to Jan.,2016, which is not feasible.
- 4. None of the Sr. Residents have worked as Jr. Resident for 3 years in Gynaecology Oncology. There is no designation Tutor/ Demonstrator/Registrar/Resident/Sr. Resident. It cannot be inferred that on which post they worked.
- 5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Committee further noted that in its meeting held on 30,203,2016, the Postgraduate Committee had recommended to the Central Government not to grant Letter of Permission in view of the following deficiencies :-

- 1. Seats requested and Consent of Affiliation Nil.
- 2. Dr. D.K. Vijay Kumar, Professor & HOD possesses M.S. (General Surgery) & M.Ch. (Surgical Oncology) qualifications; thus he does not possess any academic qualification in Gynaecological Oncology. He has been appointed as Professor of Gynaecological oncology straightaway from the post of Professor of Head & neck Oncology on 01/01/2014 without any training or experience in Gynaecological Oncology.
- 3. Dr. R. Anupama, Assoc. Professor possesses qualification of M.D. (O.G.). She is shown as having received training at this institute as "Special trainee" from 02/03/2009 to 31/03/2011. However the subject in which she was a special trainee is not specified.
- 4. Dr. Jayshree N., Asst. Professor possesses qualification of M.S. (O.G.). Her period of fellowship in Gynaecological Oncology of 2 years is shown from July 2005 to July 2005 which is not feasible.
- 5. Dr. Vineetha Murali & Dr. Reshu Agarwal, both Senior Residents, do not have 3 years experience as Resident in the subject in medical college; hence not qualified to hold the post.
- 6. Details of books purchased in last 3 years in Departmental Library are not provided.
- 7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Committee further decided to issue Show Cause Notice under regulations of 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999, for submitting fake and false documents in respect of Dr. Jayshree N as to why the college should not be debarred from the processing of applications for postgraduate courses for 2 academic years i.e. 2017-18 & 2018-19.

The Committee also decided to refer the matter to the Ethics Committee.

In view of the above, the college had failed to abide by the undertaking it had given to the Central Govt. that there are no deficiencies in respect of the aforesaid course as per clause 1(ii) of the directions passed by the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee vide communication dated 20/08/2016. The Postgraduate Committee, after due deliberation and discussion, have decided that the college has failed to comply with the stipulation laid down by the Oversight Committee. Accordingly, the Postgraduate Committee recommends that as per the directions passed by Oversight Committee in para 2(b) vide communication dated 20/08/2016 the college should be debarred from admitting students in the above course for a period of two academic years i.e. 2017-18 & 2018-19 as even after giving an undertaking that they have fulfilled the entire infrastructure for starting the super-speciality course in the speciality of M.Ch.(Gynaecological Oncology) the college was found to be grossly deficient. It has also been decided by the Post Graduate Committee that the Bank Guarantee furnished by the college in pursuance of the directives passed by the Oversight Committee as well as GOI letter dated 20/08/2016 is liable to be encashed.

The decision be conveyed to the Oversight Committee and Central Govt.

The minutes of this item is read and confirmed in this meeting itself.

Meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
