The minutes of the meeting of The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee held on 30.12.2016 confirmed.

Minutes of the meetings dated **30/11/2016, 15/12/2016 and 30.12.2016** are still not received from the Oversight Committee. Action will be taken on receipt of the Minutes from the Oversight Committee.

Increase of seats in MS (ENT) course at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram, Tamilnadu under Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University), Chettinad U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20th December 2016 along with the Council Assessor's Report (22th August 2016) and compliance dated 29th November 2016 submitted by the college authorities for Increase of seats in MS (ENT) course at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram, Tamilnadu under Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University), Chettinad U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20th December 2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (22th August 2016) and compliance dated 29th November 2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Dr. Shyamala R., Sr.Resident, is not eligible. She has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident in a medical college at the time of appointment As Sr.Resident.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (ENT) course at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram, Tamilnadu under Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University), Chettinad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Committee noted that factual matrix in respect of Dr. Siddharam S. Janti, Assistant Professor, Dr. Renuka Devi, Senior Resident, Dr. P. Suresh, Professor in the assessment reports of MS(Ophthalmology), MS(OBG) & MD(Paediatrics) respectively and considered in the meetings of the PG Committee held on 30.12.2016 & 10.01.2017, that the College has submitted fake and forged documents for the purpose of obtaining permission. Further, the Committee decided that it may be brought to the notice of the Dean/Principal that the Declaration Forms in respect of the said faculty member have been duly signed by the Principal / Dean of the college that were submitted for the purpose of obtaining permission for increase of seats in MS (Ophthalmology), MS(OBG) & MD(Paediatrics) course at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram, Tamilnadu under Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University), Chettinad U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 and the clear presumption is that the college authorities have connived and submitted fake and forged documents with the purpose of obtaining positive recommendation from the Council for Increase of seats in MS (Ophthalmology), MS(OBG) & MD(Paediatrics) course at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram, Tamilnadu U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 10/01/2017 viewed the above misdemeanor on the part of the college seriously and it is presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities amounts to playing fraud upon the Council. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked / forged document:

If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked / forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.”

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided that a Show Cause Notice be issued to the College and an explanation be sought within 07 days as to why regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 should not be invoked against their institution and why their college should not be debarred from renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered it pertinent to mention here that in an identical case of supplying fake and forged documents by Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, & Research, Barabanki, the Council invoked section 8(3)(1)(d) of MCI Regulations and debarred the college from processing its applications for postgraduate courses for two academic years. On directions from Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Allahabad, Lucknow Bench, the college authorities were granted a personal hearing in the matter on 17/06/2016. After considering their submissions, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee reiterated its earlier decision as mentioned above. The decision of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee was approved by Central Government (Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi) on 29/08/2016 and by the Oversight Committee on 15/09/2016. The present case is similar in nature.

The matter be placed before the Ethics Committee.

4. Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram, Tamilnadu under Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University), Chettinad U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20th December 2016 along with the Council Assessor's Report (22th August 2016) and compliance dated 29th November 2016 submitted by the college authorities for Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram, Tamilnadu under Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University), Chettinad U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20th December 2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (22th August 2016) and compliance dated 29th November 2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. The college got first LOP to start the MBBS course on 16.05.2006, Dr. Narayana Reddy, Professor, has been given teaching experience from 05.10.2005 when the college was not in existence. Resultantly, he was Assoc.Prof. for 3 years and 6 months. He has no publication. Hence, his appointment is not as per regulations.
2. Promotion of Dr. S.G. Chander, Professor, is not as per regulations. He was promoted on 03.07.2015 after the cut-off date. He has 3 publications against the required 4. One of these 3 publications is in internet journal which cannot be considered.
3. Dr. R.Barani has been shown Assoc.Prof. in the faculty table but in his Declaration Form he has been shown as Asst.Prof., which is not feasible.
4. Dr. S. Saseender S, has been shown as Assoc.Prof, in the faculty table whereas in his Declaration Form he has been shown as Asst.Prof., which is not feasible & he cannot be considered.
5. Dr. Krishna G., Sr.Resident is not eligible. He has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident at the time of appointment as Sr.Resident.
6. There were only 2 Major & 2 Minor Operations on day of assessment which is inadequate even for starting the PG course.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram, Tamilnadu under Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University), Chettinad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (15th December 2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (22th August 2016) and compliance dated 23rd November 2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. OPD on day of assessment is only 56.
2. One remark was that while total number of patients registered for treatment was shown as 6,187; while number of patients registered for teletherapy was only 660 & brachytherapy was not available in 2015, the purpose for registering remaining 5,527 cases registration was not clear. Institute has stated that these cases were for follow-up, screening, Chemotherapy and symptomatic & palliative treatment, which means that total workload related with Radiotherapy was only 660 in 2015 implying daily average of 2.2 which is inadequate.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20th December 2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (19th August 2016) and compliance dated 25th November 2016 submitted by the college authorities for Increase of seats in MD (Anaesthesia) course at Kilpauk Medical College, Chennai, Tamilnadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (20th December 2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (19th August 2016) and compliance dated 25th November 2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Dr. Valli Satyamoorthy, Professor, has been demoted to Assoc.Prof. but there are no demotion order or fresh joining report. In the present report also he has been shown as Professor. He has been promoted on 2014 after the cut-off date and all his publications quoted are in 2016 after his promotion. Hence, his promotion is not as per regulations.
2. Promotion of Dr. A.L. Dharmalingam, Assoc. Prof., is not as per regulations. In his 2 publications quoted, no journal's name and reference has been given without which they cannot be considered.
3. Total number of major operation decreased from 16353 in 2013 to 16031 in 2015. With decreasing clinical material, there is no justification for increase in seats.
4. Total number of caesarean Sections decreased from 2013 to 2015.
5. Faculty table not signed by any faculty member.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Prof. as such unless his promotion is annulled and fresh order and joining report are attached. He cannot be considered. Deficiency remains as it is.

This contention is neither valid nor acceptable as the Institute is asking for seats in PG course independently of MAMC & therefore has to have faculty, infrastructure, equipment independently of MAMC. No additional faculty is recruited since last assessment; hence the deficiency of faculty remains as it is.
2. Autopsy facility is not available in this Institute. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. Workload of CT guided FNAC was NIL on day of assessment.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Chndigarh. She was also Senior Resident at Government Medical College, Patiala from 17.11.1998 to 15.12.2003. Which period has now been shown (in report dated 15.12.2016) as Assistant Professor (5 years 1 month). She was Assistant Professor at Government Medical College, Patiala from 16.12.2003 to 07.06.2006. As per report dated 12.08.2016 and this period is not shown in compliance verification report dated 15.12.2016. Resultantly, she was Assistant Professor for 2½ years only against the requirement of 5 years. Hence, her promotion is not as per regulations.
2. All the faculty have qualification of M.D. (Pathology). Experience in IHBT as faculty cannot be a substitute for period of Special Training.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (Immuno Haematology & Blood Transfusion) course at Government Medical College, Patiala under Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

18. Starting of MS (OBG) course at Gujarat Adani Institute of Medical Sciences, Bhuj under Krantiguru Shyamji Krishna Verma Kachchh University, Bhuj U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

2. Promotion of Dr. Ramesh Pol, Assoc.prof. is not as per regulations. He was Asst.Prof. for 4 years against the requirement of 5 years. In the 2 publications quoted, there is no journals name or reference and no Author name has been given.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course at S. Nijalingappa Medical College & HSK Hospital & Research Centre, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Committee noted that factual matrix in respect of Dr .Raju Akkimaradi, Assistant Professor and Dr .N.B .Sanakal, Senior Resident, as per the assessment report of MS(Orthopaedics) and Dr. Mallikarjun Baddur, Senior Resident as per the assessment report of MS (General Surgery) considered by the PG Committee at its meeting held on 30.12.2016 & 10.01.2017 respectively brings out that the College has submitted fake and forged documents for the purpose of obtaining permission. Further, the Committee decided that it may be brought to the notice of the Dean/Principal that the Declaration Forms in respect of the said faculty member have been duly signed by the Principal/Dean of the college that were submitted for the purpose of obtaining permission for increase of seats in postgraduate course in MS (Orthopaedics) & MS(General Surgery) courses at S. Nijalingappa Medical College & HSK Hospital & Research Centre, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10A (of the IMC Act, 1956 and the clear presumption is that the college authorities have connived and submitted fake and forged documents with the purpose of obtaining positive recommendation from the Council for MS (Orthopaedics) & MS(General Surgery) courses at S. Nijalingappa Medical College & HSK Hospital & Research Centre, Bagalkot U/s 10A (of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 10/01/2017 viewed the above misdemeanor on the part of the college seriously and it is presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities

amounts to playing fraud upon the Council. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked / forged document:

If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked / forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.”

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided that a Show Cause Notice be issued to the College and an explanation be sought within 07 days as to why regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 should not be invoked against their institution and why their college should not be debarred from renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years– i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered it pertinent to mention here that in an identical case of supplying fake and forged documents by Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, & Research, Barabanki, the Council invoked section 8(3)(1)(d) of MCI Regulations and debarred the college from processing its applications for postgraduate courses for two academic years. On directions from Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Allahabad, Lucknow Bench, the college authorities were granted a personal hearing in the matter on 17/06/2016. After considering their submissions, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee reiterated its earlier decision as mentioned above. The decision of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee was approved by Central Government (Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi) on 29/08/2016 and by the Oversight Committee on 15/09/2016. The present case is similar in nature.

The matter be placed before the Ethics Committee.

4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

reported by Radiodiagnosis is higher than that reported by Pathology, the question remains that where would the remaining specimens be sent. Deficiency remains as it is.

5. Cryostat is not available. Deficiency remains as it is.
6. HPLC is not available in the department. Deficiency remains as it is.
7. Apheresis facility is not available in Blood Bank.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. Equipment like HPLC, PT Analyzer & APTT Analyzer are not available.
3. Frozen Section is not functional. Deficiency remains as it is.
4. Pathological post-mortems are not performed.
5. Nil Journals have been purchased after 2009-2010. Deficiency remains as it is.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Pathology) course at

54. The Committee noted that factual matrix in respect of Dr .Vikram Lokhande, Assoc.Prof. and Dr. Vishal Vishnu Chaudhari, Senior Resident of Obst. & Gynae.; Dr. Supriya Deshpande, Senior Resident of Ophthalmology, Dr. Dinesh P. Vibhute, Senior Resident of Orthopaedics, Dr .P.P .Latkar and Dr .Pritee B . Purnaye, Senior Residents of Radio-Diagnosis, as per the respective assessment reports, brings out that the College has submitted fake and forged documents for the purpose of obtaining permission. Further, the Committee decided that it may be brought to the notice of the Dean/Principal that the Declaration Forms in respect of the said faculty member have been duly signed by the Principal/Dean of the college that were submitted for the purpose of obtaining permission for increase of seats in MD/MS Obstetrics & Gynaecology, Ophthalmology, Orthopaedics and Radio-Diagnosis courses at Mahatma Gandhi Missions Medical College, Aurangabad, Maharashtra under MGM Institute of Health Sciences (Deemed University), Navi Mumbai U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 and the clear presumption is that the college authorities have connived and submitted fake and forged documents with the purpose of obtaining positive recommendation from the Council for increase of seats in MD/MS Obstetrics & Gynaecology, Ophthalmology, Orthopaedics and Radio-Diagnosis courses at Mahatma Gandhi Missions Medical College, Aurangabad, Maharashtra U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18."

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 30/12/2016 viewed the above misdemeanor on the part of the college seriously and it is presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities amounts to playing fraud upon the Council. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

8(3)(1)

(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked / forged document:

If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked / forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for

postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.”

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided that a Show Cause Notice be issued to the College and an explanation be sought within 07 days as to why regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 should not be invoked against their institution and why their college should not be debarred from renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered it pertinent to mention here that in an identical case of supplying fake and forged documents by Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, & Research, Barabanki, the Council invoked section 8(3)(1)(d) of MCI Regulations and debarred the college from processing its applications for postgraduate courses for two academic years. On directions from Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Allahabad, Lucknow Bench, the college authorities were granted a personal hearing in the matter on 17/06/2016. After considering their submissions, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee reiterated its earlier decision as mentioned above. The decision of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee was approved by Central Government (Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi) on 29/08/2016 and by the Oversight Committee on 15/09/2016. The present case is similar in nature.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Respiratory Medicine) course at Mahatma Gandhi Missions Medical College, Aurangabad, Maharashtra under MGM Institute of Health Sciences (Deemed University), Navi Mumbai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

2. Paramedical staff like Medical Social Workers are not available in the department or at RHTC/UHC. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. RHTC & UHC are not under full control of Dean. Deficiency remains as it is.
4. RHTC: Residential facility is not in the campus. Transport facilities are inadequate. Room for training of Interns is not available. Teaching aids are not available.
5. Deficiency No.1,2,4&5 already written earlier, resmains as it is.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD (Community Medicine) course at Nilratan Sircar Medical College, Kolkata, West Bengal under West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

57. Starting of MS (General Surgery) course at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (4th January 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (29th August 2016) and compliance dated 9th December 2016 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of MS (General Surgery) course at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (4th January 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (29th August 2016) and compliance dated 9th December 2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. With regard to remark pointed out in the previous assessment report dt. 29/08/2016 that "Unit 2 has only 2 faculty", in the present compliance verification assessment report, one Assoc. Prof. Dr. S. Baiju is also shown as faculty to make the faculty complement complete @ 3/PG Unit. However although his date of joining at this institute is shown as 02/09/2013, in the previous assessment report dt. 29/08/2016, he is not shown as a member of faculty at all. This makes his continuous appointment from 02/09/2013 doubtful.
2. With regard to remark pointed out in the previous assessment report dt. 29/08/2016 that "Unit 3 has only 1 faculty", in the present compliance verification assessment report, two Asst. Prof. Dr. V. Lakshmi & Dr. Baby N. Mathew are also shown as faculty to make the faculty complement complete @ 3/PG Unit. However although date of joining of Dr. Baby N. Mathew at this institute is shown as 15/06/2015, in the previous assessment report dt. 29/08/2016, he is not shown as a member of faculty at all. This makes his continuous appointment from 15/06/2015 doubtful.

3. In the present assessment report, Dr. A.V.M. Karniyil is shown as Senior Resident in Unit 3 with date of Joining as 22/08/2016 and working till date. Although his date of joining was prior to last assessment, he was not shown in the faculty table in the previous assessment dt. 29/08/2016. This makes his continuous appointment from 22/08/2016 doubtful.
4. With regard to remark "Burns Unit was closed as there were NIL patients", Assessor has observed that "Burns Unit with beds & other facilities is available." However number of patients in the Unit on day of assessment is not specified.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MS (General Surgery) course at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Committee noted that factual matrix in respect of Dr. S. Baiju, Assoc.Prof., Dr. Lakshmi V, Asst.Prof., Dr. Baby N.Mathew, Asst.Prof. and Dr. A.V.M.Karniyil, Sr. Resident of MS(General Surgery), as per the assessment report of MS(General Surgery) and Dr. R. Jayakrishnan, Professor, Dr. V.S. Vinod, Assoc. Prof. and Dr. A.S. Arunkumar, Asst. Prof., of Orthopaedics, as per the assessment report of MS (Orthopaedics), brings out that the College has submitted fake and forged documents for the purpose of obtaining permission. Further, the Committee decided that it may be brought to the notice of the Dean/Principal that the Declaration Forms in respect of the said faculty member have been duly signed by the Principal / Dean of the college that were submitted for the purpose of obtaining permission for starting of postgraduate course in MS(General Surgery) and MS(Orthopaedics) courses at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur U/s 10A (of the IMC Act, 1956 and the clear presumption is that the college authorities have connived and submitted fake and forged documents with the purpose of obtaining positive recommendation from the Council for MS(General Surgery)/ MS(Orthopaedics) course at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala U/s 10A (of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee in its meeting held on 10/01/2017 viewed the above misdemeanor on the part of the college seriously and it is presumed that such act/ omission on the part of college authorities amounts to playing fraud upon the Council. Therefore, it has been decided to invoke regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999 that provides as under: -

“...
8(3)(1)

(d) Colleges which are found to have employed teachers with faked / forged document:

If it is observed that any institute is found to have employed a teacher with faked / forged documents and have submitted the Declaration Form of such a teacher, such an institute will not be considered for renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.”

Accordingly, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided that a Show Cause Notice be issued to the College and an explanation be sought within 07 days as to why regulation 8(3)(1)(d) of the Establishment of Medical College

Regulations, 1999 should not be invoked against their institution and why their college should not be debarred from renewal of permission / recognition for award of M.B.B.S. degree / processing the applications for postgraduate courses for two Academic Years – i.e. this Academic Year and the next Academic Year also.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered it pertinent to mention here that in an identical case of supplying fake and forged documents by Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, & Research, Barabanki, the Council invoked section 8(3)(1)(d) of MCI Regulations and debarred the college from processing its applications for postgraduate courses for two academic years. On directions from Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Allahabad, Lucknow Bench, the college authorities were granted a personal hearing in the matter on 17/06/2016. After considering their submissions, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee reiterated its earlier decision as mentioned above. The decision of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee was approved by Central Government (Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi) on 29/08/2016 and by the Oversight Committee on 15/09/2016. The present case is similar in nature.

The matter be placed before the Ethics Committee.

58. Starting of MS (Orthopaedics) course at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (4th January 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (29th August 2016) and compliance dated 9th December 2016 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of MS (Orthopaedics) course at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (4th January 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (29th August 2016) and compliance dated 9th December 2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. With regard to remark pointed out in the previous assessment report dt. 29/08/2016 that "Unit 2 has only 2 faculty", in the present compliance verification assessment report, 1 Professor Dr. R. Jayakrishnan, 1 Assoc. Prof. Dr. V.S. Vinod & 2 Asst. Prof. – Dr. Jiju George & Dr. A.S. Arun Kumar are shown as faculty to make the faculty complement complete @ 3/PG Unit. However although the date of joining of Dr. R. Jayakrishnan as Professor at this institute is shown as 01/02/2014, in the previous assessment report dt. 29/08/2016, he is not shown as a member of faculty at all. This makes his continuous appointment from 01/02/2014 doubtful. Further he is on leave on day of present assessment and hence his credentials could not be verified.
2. In present assessment Dr. A.S. Arunkumar is shown as Asst. Prof. in Unit II from 14/09/2015 till date; however in the previous assessment report dt. 29/08/2016 he was shown as Senior Resident w.e.f. 14/09/2015 till date. Thus there is misrepresentation of his experience.
3. In present assessment Dr. V.S. Vinod is shown as Assoc. Prof. from 16/01/2016 till date. However in the previous assessment dt. 29/08/2016 he was shown as Asst. Prof. from 07/01/2016 till date which implies he was

Asst. Prof. till 29/08/2016 which is the date of previous assessment. Thus there is misrepresentation with regard to his experience.

4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MS (Orthopaedics) course at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Committee noted that factual matrix in respect of Dr. S. Baiju, Assoc.Prof., Dr. Lakshmi V, Asst.Prof., Dr. Baby N.Mathew, Asst.Prof. and Dr. A.V.M.Karniyil, Sr. Resident of MS(General Surgery), as per the assessment report of MS(General Surgery) and Dr. R. Jayakrishnan, Professor, Dr. V.S. Vinod, Assoc. Prof. and Dr. A.S. Arunkumar, Asst. Prof., of Orthopaedics, as per the assessment report of MS (Orthopaedics), brings out that the College has submitted fake and forged documents for the purpose of obtaining permission. Further, the Committee decided that it may be brought to the notice of the Dean/Principal that the Declaration Forms in respect of the said faculty member have been duly signed by the Principal / Dean of the college that were submitted for the purpose of obtaining permission for starting of postgraduate course in MS(General Surgery) and MS(Orthopaedics) courses at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala under Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur U/s 10A (of the IMC Act, 1956 and the clear presumption is that the college authorities have connived and submitted fake and forged documents with the purpose of obtaining positive recommendation from the Council for MS(General Surgery)/ MS(Orthopaedics) course at Travancore Medical College, Kollam, Kerala U/s 10A (of the IMC Act, 1956.

59. Increase of seats in MS (ENT) course at SRM Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Kancheepuram under SRM University, Chennai, Tamilnadu U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (5th January 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th August 2016) and compliance dated 13th December 2016 submitted by the college authorities for Increase of seats in MS (ENT) course at SRM Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Kancheepuram under SRM University, Chennai, Tamilnadu U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (5th January 2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (30th August 2016) and compliance dated 13th December 2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in MS (ENT) course at SRM Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Kancheepuram under SRM University, Chennai, Tamilnadu u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2017-2018 from **2(Two) to 4(Four)** students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

60. Starting of MS (General Surgery) course at GCS Medical College, Ahmedabad under Gujarat University, Ahmedabad U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/01/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (26/09/2016) and compliance dated 13/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of MS (General Surgery) course at GCS Medical College, Ahmedabad under Gujarat University, Ahmedabad U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (05/01/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (26/09/2016) and compliance dated 13/12/2016 submitted by

the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Starting of MS (General Surgery) course at GCS Medical College, Ahmedabad under Gujarat University, Ahmedabad u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2017-2018 restricting the number of admissions to **5(Five)** students per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

61. Starting of MS (OBG) course at Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences, Bhubaneswar under KIIT University, Bhubaneswar U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/01/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (29/08/2016) and compliance dated 14/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of MS (OBG) course at Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences, Bhubaneswar under KIIT University, Bhubaneswar U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/01/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (29/08/2016) and compliance dated 14/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Starting of MS(OBG) course at Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences, Bhubaneswar under KIIT University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/01/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (19/08/2016) and compliance dated 06/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of MD (Pathology) course at Kidwai Memorial Institute of Oncology, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (04/01/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (19/08/2016) and compliance dated 06/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Starting of MD (Pathology) course at Kidwai Memorial Institute of Oncology, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2017-2018 restricting the number of admissions to **4(Four)** students per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

63. Starting of MD (Psychiatry) course at Mysore Medical College and Research Institute, Mysore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (15/12/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (12/08/2016) and compliance dated 28/11/2016 submitted by the college authorities for Starting of MD (Psychiatry) course at Mysore Medical College and Research Institute, Mysore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (15/12/2016) along with the Council Assessor's Report (12/08/2016) and compliance dated 28/11/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. There is no Professor.
2. Dr. M.S. Narendra Kumar, Asst. Prof. is DNB from a non-teaching hospital. He does not have requisite experience of 3 y as Resident in a teaching hospital for being appointed as Senior Resident and Asst. Prof. Hence his appointment is void ab initio. Deficiency remains as it is.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Starting of MD(Psychiatry) course at Mysore Medical College and Research Institute, Mysore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

64. Increase of seats in MS(Ophthalmology) course at Sri Manakula Vinayagar Medical College and Hospital, Puducherry under Pondicherry University, Puducherry U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18- consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (03/01/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (29/08/2016) and compliance dated 12/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities for Increase of seats in MS (Ophthalmology) course at Sri Manakula Vinayagar Medical College and Hospital, Puducherry under Pondicherry University, Puducherry U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (03/01/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (29/08/2016) and compliance dated 12/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Facility for Retinal Surgery is not available. Deficiency remains as it is.
2. Dr. Sarayu Gayathri R, Senior Resident has only 2 years experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (Ophthalmology) course at Sri Manakula Vinayagar Medical College and Hospital, Puducherry under

Pondicherry University, Puducherry u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

65. Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at Sri Manakula Vinayagar Medical College and Hospital, Puducherry under Pondicherry University, Puducherry U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18-consideration of Compliance Verification Assessment Report.

Read: the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (03/01/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (29/08/2016) and compliance dated 12/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities for Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at Sri Manakula Vinayagar Medical College and Hospital, Puducherry under Pondicherry University, Puducherry U/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (03/01/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (29/08/2016) and compliance dated 12/12/2016 submitted by the college authorities and noted the following:

1. Dr. Ponuraju Sumalatha, Sr. Resident is not eligible. He has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident at the time of appointment of Sr. Resident, experience of Yashoda Hospital cannot be counted, as it is a non-teaching hospital.
2. Dr. S.Ajitha, Sr. Resident, is not eligible, she has no 3 years experience as Jr. Resident in a medical college at the time of her appointment. She was absent on the assessment day.
3. Dr. Tamilselvi. P, Sr. Resident, was absent on the day of assessment.
4. There was no death out of 6150 admissions, which means no really sick patients or complicated delivery cases are admitted.
5. IUI is not replacement for ART, hence, deficiency of ART services stays as such.
6. There are only 2 Major Operations on day of assessment, which is inadequate even for start of the course.
7. Antenatal Medical Officer and Maternal & Child Welfare Officer are not available.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

In view of the above, the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to return the application to the Central Government recommending disapproval of the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at Sri Manakula Vinayagar Medical College and Hospital, Puducherry under Pondicherry University, Puducherry u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2017-18.
